Janet Kowalczyk, M.S.: After completing a BS degree at Framingham State College in MA, she taught middle school science. Over her career, she has been involved in a variety of educational programs. Her participation in a "Science and Whole Learning" at the MIT Media lab inspired her involvement in a number of early initiatives integrating technology in the classroom. She completed a Master's Degree in this field; developed and taught the first computers in education course at Salve Regina University; worked as part of a team to develop, pilot and teach three new courses for Lesley University Masters' program in Computers in Education; and helped launch and directed the Rhode Island School of the Future (RISF.net). She also led the pilot for the Learning through Engineering, Art and Design (LEAD) project in collaboration with the MIT Media Lab and the Chinese University of Hong Kong. As Associate Director of Rutgers University's Leadership Program in Discrete Mathematics (LPDM), Janice helped develop and refine this NSF funded program and oversaw its implementation and replication over 60 times in 14 states for over 1600 teachers.



Tom Kowalczyk, M.S. Mgmt.: A graduate of the Sloan School of Management at MIT, he has worked in the U.S. government for 30+ years in a variety of positions including most recently in technical and educational development connecting government, industry, and academia. In the last several years Tom has worked in various educational activities in Rhode Island including organizing and running MIT Robot Competitions for Middle Schools, MIT Media Lab "Scratch" early computing and other programs. Tom is Education Councilor for MIT (whereas he interviews high school seniors). He brings expertise in advising students on college applications.
