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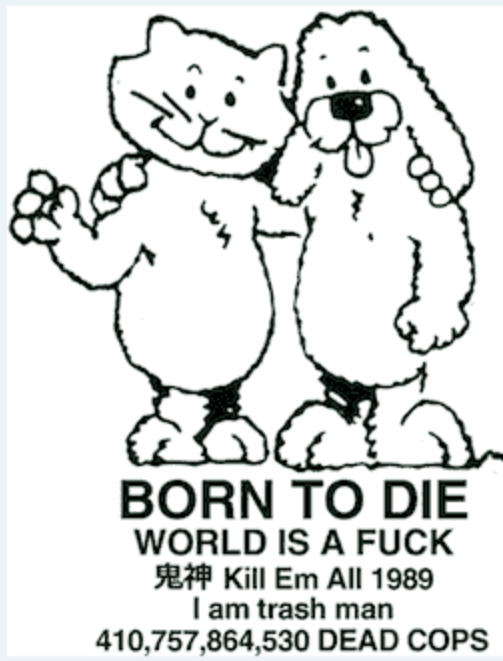

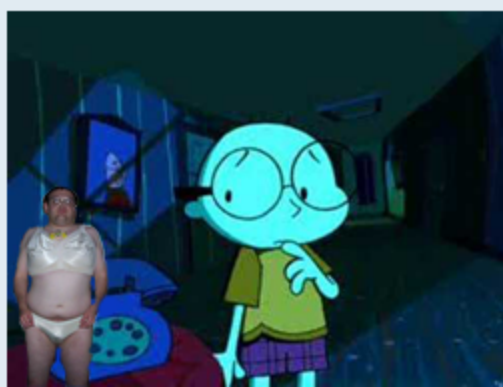

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Prisons and law enforcement needs to be reformed. People need to be educated on their legal rights when they're in high school.

My thoughts on the police are very complex. On the one hand, a lot of them are just bullies who got into the job for the power. On the other hand: A lot of people join the police force because they honestly want to make the world a better place. And then they go out into their communities, and they rapidly develop extremely jaded outlooks. They see bad people go free because they have money and good people go to jail. They begin to develop a disaffection from the law since they can't really make it fair. Some of them are shot at, or stabbed, or see it happen to their friends, by people they've never met. Some of them are spat on or harassed. They're put in unfamiliar communities full of sometimes hostile strangers. They're trusted and resented, all at once.

I think this country does not do enough community policing. Police officers should be from the neighborhoods they patrol and should reflect the ethnic, religious, and racial makeup of the neighborhood. That engenders trust. People are also less likely to hinder, assault, or fear a police officer when it's just ol' John from down the street, we played kickball as a kid, remember that time he sneezed blood in first grade? When it's some faceless stranger representing The Law there's no trust, there's no reason to do what the guys says except for the uniform, and a lot of the time officers realize that and it goes to their heads.

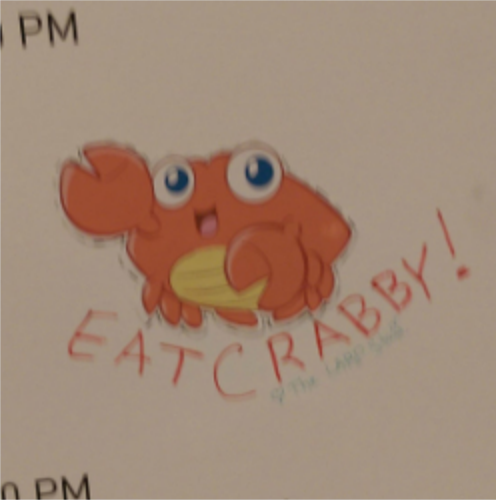

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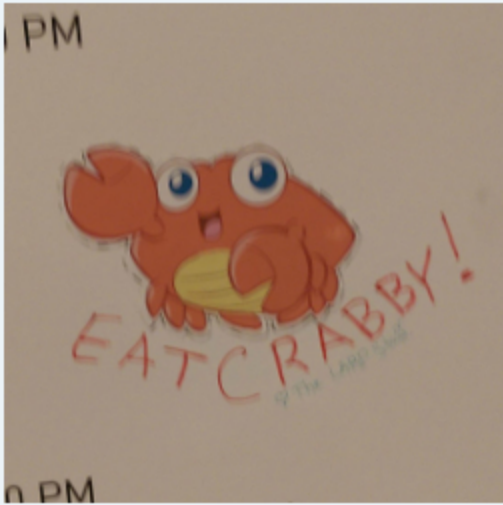
