Corresponding to the Tellurian years 2012 and 2013 (twenty-twelve/twenty-thirteen)

How to use this calendar

This calendar is intended for an Aristasian's marking of Dëanic time, however any Dëanist or child of Dëa may feel free to use this privately :3

Concerning the Scripture:

For Culverine, the scripture comes from On Our Mother's Love, located in the Gospel, verse 7.

For Maia, the scripture comes from the Mythos of God the Daughter, located in the Gospel.

For Hera, the writing is the first verse and chorus of the Imperial Anthem of Aristasia.

For Rosëa, the scripture comes from the Temple of the Heart, located in the Gospel, verse 27.

For Kerëa, the scripture comes from the Pillar of Light, located in the Gospel, verses 27-28.

For Hesperis, the scripture comes from the Clew of the Horse, located in the Gospel, verses 58, the latter half of 59, 62, and 66

For Abolan, the scripture comes from the Canticle of the Mother, located in the Gospel.

For Hathor, the scripture comes from the Heart of Water, located in the Gospel, verses 8, 9, 12, 61, and 63.

For Werdë, the scripture comes from the Mythos of God the Daughter, located in the Gospel.

For Astraea, the writing comes from the chorus of the hymn Hail to the Princess.

For Herthë, the scripture comes from the Heart of Water, located in the Gospel, verses 1, 2, and 5

For Brighë, the scripture comes from the Clew of Love, located in the Gospel, verses 5-6.

For Moura, the scripture comes from the Mythos of God the Daughter, located in the Gospel.

Concerning the days of the week:

This chart displays the English, Aristasian, French, and Hindi days of the week for comparison

Each Aristasian or Dëanic day is named after and governed by one of the Angelic Powers of Dëa, our Mother God. The suffix –di means 'day'.

Sai Raya, the Sun, rules Rayadi. Her colour is yellow, and she represents God the Mother.

Sai Candrë, the Moon, rules Candredi. Her colour is violet, and she represents God the Daughter.

Sai Vikhë, Mars, rules Vikhedi. Her colour is red, and she represents the element of Fire.

Sai Mati, Mercury, rules Matidi. Her colour is orange, and she represents the element of Air.

Sai Thamë, Jupiter, rules Thamedi. Her colour is blue, and she represents the element of Earth.

Sai Sushuri, Venus, rules Sucridi. Her colour is green, and she represents the element of Water. Sai Rhavë, Saturn, rules Rhavedi. Her colours are ones not found in the rainbow, and she represents the Dark Mother.

The day that Eastre falls on decides which Power will rule that year and also what day the weeks of that year start on. For the year thirty-three thirty-two, this current year, the week begins on Matidi and so Sai Mati governs this entire year. Last year belonged to Sai Candrë.

Concerning the Days:

Holidays are marked with coloured backgrounds.

Days marked pink are high festivals while days marked blue are low festivals.

The holy days of Moura are marked gray.

The bolded number in the corner of the day-square indicates the day of the month, each month containing exactly twenty-eight days. On the very bottom of each day-square is the corresponding Tellurian month and day so that one may easily track both if one is known.

Concerning the month names:

Culverine may also be called Columbina, they both mean ‘dove’

Hera may instead be called Hela

Hesperis may instead be called Vaskaraś or Vaskarash

Abolan may also be called Mala

Hathor is also called Voiś or Voish, both symbolise or mean ‘speech’ or ‘voice’

Moura may also be called Kala

Concerning the holiday names:

May Day is also known as the Exaltation of the Queen of Heaven

Cuivanya is also called the Feast of Divine Life

Tamala is also called the Feast of the Dead

The Epiphany is also called Princesses’ Day

Luciad is also called the Feast of Lights

Concerning the New Year:

There is one day between the end of the Old Year and the beginning of the New Year. This is called Hiatus and in Filianic Tradition is the day when the Daughter is dead.

On leap years in Telluria, there is a double-Hiatus which allows the Tellurian year to “catch up” with the Dëanic.
