Pope's Prayer during the Corona Virus

Pope Francis made a special Sunday afternoon visit to the icon of Mary at St Mary Majors Basilica, before which, as we know, St Paul of the Cross made his vow to remember the Passion of Jesus.

Pope Francis went to pray before the famous icon of the Virgin Mary is known as <u>Salus Populi Romani</u>, or <u>Health of the Roman People</u> or <u>Salvation of the Roman People</u>, due to a miracle in which the icon helped keep plague from the city.
