

Around the Table

The Fourth Sunday of Easter

Dear Friends,

Among the idiocies of human nature that probably each of us has been guilty of is that of taking for granted the particular person who is most significant in our life. Usually we don't recognize the significance of the person until after he or she has perhaps left us or even died. After someone's death, we occasionally hear the lament, "He (or she) died before I ever really got to know him (or her). One hears the dismay at the lost opportunity to get to know better and appreciate a person whom they perhaps, never totally appreciated before. Yet, there is no way now that they can ever really, get to know the person. It is too late unless they happen to be a person of faith which will give them then the hope of being reunited to that person after death.

Something of this tone of regret can be heard in the Reading from the First Letter of St. John, that we hear as the Second Reading at Mass this weekend. He says, "The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him."



What John is saying is that the vast majority of people did not realize the significance of the person of Jesus when he was among them. For most people, Jesus would have been no different from any ordinary person; there was nothing special about him. So, not recognizing anything special about Jesus, they could not recognize anything different in those who were committed to Jesus. It was only after the death of Jesus that people came to realize who he truly was by what they saw in those who represented him. Hopefully, now, too, through each follower of Jesus, through each of us—Jesus himself may be recognized though he has gone from us.

The commission that each of us has as a Christian is to live a Christlike life so that others can recognize Jesus within us. Like the person who, while living, was simply taken for granted and perhaps not fully appreciated in his talents and abilities and now, tragically, there is no longer an opportunity to show our respect and appreciation of the person. A great part of the world is in the same circumstances unless each of us can carry on and show to them the significance and the value that Jesus had and has for us. Seeing this in us, then they, too, can come to know Jesus. Even though he is Risen, he lives in the world

in each one of us! To give "voice" to Jesus around us, I believe is the responsibility of every sincere Christian.





In this weekend's Gospel, John helps us to understand Jesus through the imagery of the Good Shepherd. He is our shepherd, we are his sheep and as his sheep we should know his voice.

We have so many voices in our heads today. We hear voices everywhere we go, in the stores, on the streets, and even in restaurants as we strain to listen to the people we are sharing a table with. All too often those voices speak to our wants more than our needs, very often to our stereotypes; perhaps, even to our worst prejudices.

With mass media so prevalent the voice of public opinion is what we spend the most time listening to. We wish to know what everyone thinks as we try to compose our own views about world events, our pressing needs, and the most minute and monumental problems of today.

Our gospel from the Evangelist John, counsels us as to which voice we must listen to first, and of course it is the voice of Jesus! Once we know the voice of our Lord, we can see what he saw, what he knew and understood and will recognize that voice in others. It forms us as his followers and aids our conscience as we enter into our life's daily encounters.

Families can help its members in discerning the many voices in their lives. Parents especially play an important role in this process and lead the way for everyone to recognize the voice of the Good Shepherd!

First it is important that parents continue to form themselves. Seeking out the meaning of Scripture, following some of the many websites that provide reflections on the daily readings as well as listening to the homilies that are proclaimed here at OLV every weekend is a beginning! Parents can also form themselves by learning more about Church teachings which then become the lens by which they can speak with their children of the love, forgiveness and mercy that our Lord displays for each of us with a sense of passion and authenticity. It can allow the whole family to fine tune their ears to hear Jesus' voice when listening to music, TV, videos, etc. or sharpen ones attentiveness to the intent of conversations among adults and children alike. Do they tend to be life giving reflecting the Gospel values we profess to believe or do they belittle and hurt.

Learning to recognize Jesus' voice is the work of faith. When we open our minds and our hearts to His voice we can be drawn into a quieter reflection that tests our true motives and the real needs behind the many other voices we come across. By relying on the Good Shepherd we will soon find that it is the voice that will lead us to the truth!

Pray to the Good Shepherd that you might be his likeness to others. Ask him to lead you to shepherd others and bring them safely to his love!

MUSIC MINISTRY

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is always **Good Shepherd Sunday** because the gospel reading is always from John Chapter 10 for all three liturgical cycles.

The concept of a Good Shepherd predates Jesus. Images of a male figure carrying a lamb can be found in early Greek art. It became easy for the idea and image to be transferred to Jesus for the early Christians in order to hide their affiliation with the new religious group from the Romans since pagan figures of shepherds were common. A shepherd may not have been a desirable livelihood because they had to live with their sheep day and night in all kinds of weather and in different locations and the shepherd would have to move from place to place to find grass for the sheep. But a shepherd was loyal to his flock by watching over them, caring for them and protecting them. shepherd would even call their sheep by names and they would know his voice. Sometimes the flock would be enclosed by a low wall with only a small opening for coming and going. The shepherd would sleep across this opening to prevent the sheep from escaping and also to prevent wolves or robbers from getting to the sheep. Here we see the shepherd ready to give up his life for the flock. James Chepponis describes God in "With a Shepherd's Care" not only as a shepherd but as a father who guides and teaches and as a mother who loves and cares for their children.



And so we call Jesus the Good Shepherd because he is and does all of these things and more for us.



What does your relationship with Christ look like?

Do you see Jesus as simply a great teacher? A prophet? A man of great wisdom? Or do you see him as more?

Jesus calls us to be more than simply believers—he calls us to be his disciples and his friends. Do you consider yourself a disciple and friend of Christ?
