Survey Method

The **KOM Colorado Poll – October 2020** results are based on a sample of 519 respondents to an online poll among likely November 2020 voters statewide in Colorado. The poll was conducted from October 8-13, 2020. The worst-case margin of error at the 95% level for a sample of 519 is plus or minus 4.3%.

The **KOM Colorado Poll – October 2020** was paid for in its entirety and equally by Keating Research, OnSight Public Affairs and Melanson. This research is completely and 100% independent of any client or political candidate or organization. All of the questions that were asked in the poll are included in this release.
