Realizing the need for a library in the

vicinity of Westlake Park, Mr Perry, librarian of the Los Angeles Public Library, interviewed Mr. Van Griffith, then chairman of the Board of Park Commissioners; Mr Perry, Mrs Socha, Mr Griffith and Miss Althea Warren then went out to Lafayette Park to look over the ground. The decision of the Park Commissioners was that on only if the library Board would consent to build a \$100,000 building would they grant them a site facing Wilshire Boulevard.

The Library Board, therefore, accepted a site on Sixth Street instead.

The architect who designed the building was Austin Whittesley, the general contractor was

Harry J Rinnert, 101 Robertson Drive, Beverly Hills, and the amount of the contract was \$29,655.00. The Electrical wiring was installe under a contract with the Construction Dept. of the City, at a cost of \$1,188.00; plumbing was also installed by the Construction Dept. of the City, at a cost of \$1,900.00. The heating plant, which cost \$1,900.00 was installed by the Pacific Gas Heating Co., Inc. The furniture contract was awarded to Yawman and Erbe Manufacturing Company, at \$4,857.65. The building was designed for a capacity of

25,000 books. The original book appropriation

The building was built in the Spring of 1929 and was ready for opening July 1st of that year.

was \$10.000.







The Felipe de Neve Branch library was opened to the public on July 1 1929. The librarian was Jessie I Cavanaugh, who was transferred from the Vermont Square Branch to take charge of the library just opening.

The staff consisted of Evelyn Watkins senior attendant, Francis Gandsey, children's librarian and Caroline Bolen Smith, Junior attendant. There were also one half time page a and one half time janitor.

The first month recorded a circulation of 6,569 books and registration of 647 borrower The library was opened from 9 oclock A.M. to 9 P.M.

The dedication of the Branch was not held until Sept. 4th. 1929 as that is the anniversary of the founding of the City of Los Angeles, the deed for which Felipe de Neve became famous.

The tables and chairs were re-arranged the tables moved into the alcoves and the chairs all faced toward the center desk. The speakers stand was just behind the desk and all the audience could face the speaker. Mr Ora Monnette, President of the Library board, conducted the meeting and speeches were made by Arthur Ellis of the State historical society, Judge Avery and others.

Dana Bartlett had very generously painted and donated the lovely landscape which hangs over the fireplace. Mr Thomas Williams councilman for this district accepted the picture in the name of the city.

About 400 persons were present at dedication. Much color was given to the pictur by the attendance of Mrs Dobson and her mother both dressed in early Spanish costume.

Mrs W.W.Stilson, of Cabrillo Chapter of the D.A.R. told of the placing of the Felipe de Neve Sun dial in Lafayette Park.

The dedication was attended by Everett R. Perry, city librarian, Althea Warren, assistant librarian and the entire library board.

The Libray was fortunate to have a public spirited woman like Mrs Toretsky as editor of the local paper. She spared neither time nor space in herpaper to put the branch library before the residents of the Westlake district. Our clipping book is filled with pages of library articles clipped from the Westlake News while she was editor.

Mrs Faith Holmes Hyers of the Publicity Department also gave of her time to publicize the branch in the metropolitan papers.

Posters were displayed in buildings giving

library hours, etc.

The first year showed a total circulation of 118,235 books and the branch held 31 place in the branches record for the year.

Story hours had been held weekly. The first year demonstrated that this branch would be a branch of adult interests as the juvenile registration was small and the schools gave little or no cooperation.

In February 1930 Miss Frances Gandsey resigned as children's librarian and the vacanay was filled by Marjorie Davidson.

The year 1930 was a busy one as the library became better known and an the registration and circulation increased.

October witnessed another change on the Staff as Mrs Davidson was transferred to Wilmington and Kathleen Adams was transferred to us from Ascot Branch to fill the vacancy.

We installed the Detroit charging system this year and find it very satisfactory. We have many elderly patrons who leave their glasses home and we have to write their card numbers for them but it started off very well.

Some of our traffic problems have been solve as a pedestrien crossing has been put in on Wilshire Blvd. and a stop signal in at the Hoov and Sixth st. crossing.

Statistics for the year 1930-31 Circ. 158,953...Gain 40,718...Place in Brabches 26...Book stock 10,193 Card holders8,543 Turnover...16. This year we made a gain in Circulation of 19%.

The book collection is growing and the Card holders continue to increase. No additions have been made to our staff and we are feeling that the staff is inadequate.

The auditorium has been used for meetings of the Lovers of Shakespeare Club. This club planned and created the Shakespeare Garden on the terrace just back of the library and in a very imposing ceremony gave it to the city as a part of the Park system.

We made the start of our book review and travel talks this year. The attendance is good and we feel justified to try a more extended program next year.

Our first inventory was taken this year with a total loss of 76 books.

The General meeting of Children's librarians was held in our branch this year. It was a beau tiful day and refreshments were served under the Big Tree at the end of the Pool. Two Japanese girls in costume gave a Japanese dance and sung their Doll song.

1932-33

The outstanding event of the year was the Book Gift Drive.

With the hearty cooperation of every staff member we secured over 1,300 books. Some of these books were not library titles, others were in bad condition and could not be used but on the whole the effort was well repaid and a splendid contact was made as we made many friends while the drive was on.

We had a change in our staff this year. Mrs. Evelyn Rich Watkins being transferred to Sidney Lanier and the vacancy being filled by Elizabeth Hickenlooper of our Library sch.

This has been a banner year with a total Circulation of 255,269, a gain of 17,813 and 12 in place. and 1st in gain.

We have continued our plan of bi-monthly gatherings. One book review and one travel tal each month. The attendance averages about 40. We have been fortunate in having some professional book reviewers to review books for us. Mrs Edward Tufts who reviews for the Ebell Club and for Robinson's store has been generous with her time and Mrs Doris Cerf who is the reviewer for the Broadway.

Miss Hickenlooper has reviewed books this year for the branch and also over the radio.

The Juvenile work is making a normal gain Our work with children will of necessity be small as we have a large apartment house clientele and not many children.

The outstanding social event of the year was the meeting of the L.A.P.L. Library School Alumni annual meeting. The meeting proper was conducted in the man/ main room on Sunday P.M. Jasmine Brittain and Miss Helen Haines were th principal speakers. The room was crowded. Refreshments were served on the fe terrace.

Many things have conspired against ud this year. The closing of the branch in the morning hours has made a decided drop in our circulation. We have also felt the lack of new books and magazines, the supply being smaller because of lower funds.

However, we have gained 433 cardholders over last year. The year has been busy and interesting.

Our group meetings have been held regularly with good attendance.

The outstanding event of the year was the Regional Meeting of Branches. The meeting was held as one of a series of Branch meetings to get the Branches of the same neighborhood together. Mrs Hook of the Wilshire Branch was chairman. The group consisted of Pio Pico, Washington Irving, Echo Park, Memorial, and Wilshire and Felipe de Neve.

Mrs Leidendecker told us of Special librarie Book reviews were given by Mrs Halvax, Miss Hickenlooper and Mr Humphreys. Frayne Williams gave readings from Irish Plays.

At the close of the year 34-35 Felipe de Nev stood in the following relation to the 48 Branches.
