The one hundred and forty-eighth anniversary of the founding of Los Angeles by Felipe de Neve and his handful of followers, will be the date of the dedication of the branch library in Lafayette Park, which has been named in honor of de Neve.

On the afternoon and evening of Wednesday, September 4th., the new library building will be thrown open to the public for a children's party in

the afternoon and dedication exercises in the evening.

The festivities will begin at 2:30 in the afternoon with a story hour for the children followed by games in Lafayette Park, during which time refreshments will be served by a committee of ladies from the Greater Westlake Business Association.

Monnette Will Preside

The evening exercises will take place at 8 p. m. when Orra E. Monnette, president of the Board of Library Commissioners will make the dedication address and will preside over the program which follows. The speech of acceptance, in the name of the community and the Greater Westlake Business Association, will be made by Thomas W. Williams, Councilman from the 12th, district, and a member of the business association. Following Mr. Williams, Mrs. W. W. Stilson, representing Cabrillo Chapter of the D. A. R. will tell of the sun dial which her chapter erected in Lafayette Park in memory of Felipe de Neve, long before it was planned to build the library in the park.

Address on de Neve Featured

The address of the evening will be made by Arthur M. Ellis president of the Southern California Historical Society. His theet being Felipe de Nevel and his place in Los Angeles history. Mr. Ellis is a very fine speaker, and his address will be one of note. Among the guests of honor will be Mayor Porter and members of the Los Angeles City Park Board, who will coperate with the Library Board to make the evening a success.

Mr. Bartlett has an international reputation in landscape work, and his paintings have been exhibited in many of America's most famous galleries. The library painting is a characteristic California view, with hillsides, live oaks, and sycamores. It is planned to unveil the painting on the evening of the dedication, when Mr. Bartlett will be among the guests.

LIBRARY LOANS 8500 BOOKS

Mrs. Jessie Cavanaugh, librarian at Felipe de Neve Branch is authority for the statement that there has been an unprecedented growth in business at the Westlake building. During the first month there were 6500 books loaned, while the second month saw 8500 books placed in the hands of readers.
