Univ. of Colorado astrophysics professor, Dr. Sadami Matsushita, 47, of Elhime-ken, is attending the 14th General Assembly of the International Union of Geodesy and Geophysics in Geneva, Switzerland, upon invitation of U.S. National Committee of IUGG. He serves as a senior research staff member at CU's High Altitude Observatory. He has been teaching at the university since 1957.

Government

Kiyoshi Maruyama, LI'l Tokio accountant, is serving on the county citizens economy and efficiency committee which last week issued its recommendation on consolidating the sheriff's civil division with the marshal's office. A \$1.4 million savings annually would be realized if the two offices were merged, the committee found.

Calif. State Sen. Alfred H. Song (D-28th Dist., Monterey Park) is spending six weeks as a U.S. State Dept. representative touring seven countries in the Far East: Japan, Korea, Taiwan, South Vietnam, Singapore, Australia and the Fiji. "Because of my Oriental heritage and my experience in American politics, I consider this opportunity a unique challenge to discuss the practical aspects of our democratic system with the peoples of the Asian nations," Song declared. He is the first Oriental American elected to the California legislature.

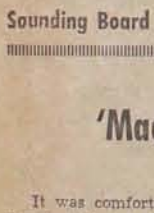
