PRINTING INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE CASE HISTORY INDEX

The Case History Index has been divided into six sections. You may view or print the entire document or only that section that is relevant for your current needs. The Case History section contains a glossary of terms and several special interest areas for those seeking a more complete view of the history of records in the custody of the Clerk of Court's Office. It also contains specific information on how to research case categories that have exception requirements.

The Adult, Juvenile and Marriage License Index sections are listings of all Superior Court cases by category, number and year, along with their totals and growth percentages from year to year.

The Adult and Juvenile Charts are supplied as visual attachments to the information supplied in the Case History index, offering different interpretations of the data and how some of the Index information relates to Maricopa County population growth.

MARICOPA COUNTY – CLERK OF SUPERIOR COURT

The Clerk of Superior Court's Office was established by the Arizona Constitution as an elected office with specific and special duties, primarily to serve as the official record keeper and financial officer for the Superior Court. The functions of the Clerk of the Court satisfy more than 500 state statutes and court rules. One of the major functions for which the Clerk is responsible is to receive, distribute and preserve official records for all Superior Court actions; i.e., civil, criminal, juvenile, probate, tax, and domestic relations matters.

The Case History Index was originally created to show the yearly growth percentage for cases filed with the Clerk of Superior Court's Office. It has since evolved to include some historical information, and provide location and access information, as well as summary figures, for each case category. Additionally, in late 1997, the Clerk's Office, with Superior Court, developed a Web site for access to the Clerk's Office Docket.

...The office of the Clerk can be traced back to the year 1272 AD in the History of Corporation of Old London. In the 1500's in England there was not only the Towne Clarke, but also the Clerc Comptroller of the King's Honorable Household. In 1603, there was a Clarke general of the Armie. King Henry VIII had a Clarke of the Spicery.

When the early colonists came to America, they set up forms of local government to which they had become accustomed, and the Office of the Clerk was one of the first established. The colony at Plymouth appointed a person to act as the recorder.

Over the years, Clerks have become the hub of the government, the direct link between the residents and their government. Their Clerk is the historian of the county, for the entire recorded history of the county and its people are in his care.

On March 21, 2006 Supreme Court Administrative Order 2006-029, Arizona Code of Judicial Administration 3-402: Superior Court Records Retention and Disposition was signed replacing Administrative Order 1991-013. A.R.S. 41-1339 requires Superior Court Clerks to transfer permanent files to the Director of the Arizona State Library, Archives, and Public Records (ASLAPR) at the end of their prescribed retention period pursuant to court rules. Rule 29, Rules of the Supreme Court requires the court to adopt retention and disposition schedules and purge lists for the court records. Extensive background work spanning the course of several years established a more efficient and effective guide for preserving for the official record for all Superior Court actions, as is reflected in this new Administrative Order, as well as becoming the forefront leading towards the electronic court record.

**1/1/07 Initiative
(Supreme Court Administrative Order 2006-96)**

January 1, 2007 was a significant milestone for the Clerk's Office. It was the day that Clerk of the Court, Michael Jeanes, implemented an end to placing paper documents received into hard copy files (adult case types only), eliminating the need for folders to be created and maintained for cases filed on and after 1/1/07. Instead, the paper documents filed are scanned, audited, and then disposed of after a series of quality checks for accuracy are completed. To achieve this major goal, the Office obtained Supreme Court Administrative Order 2006-96 authorizing the Clerk of the Superior Court in Maricopa County to dispose of certain paper filings after their electronic image is captured and maintained, ensuring the Office complied with all minimum standards and requirements for access, availability and retention while maintaining multiple electronic backup systems to access and preserve active and archived court records; thus, recognizing the Electronic Court Record (ECR) as the original. Pursuant to the Order, the "original" document is the electronic image of that document as maintained in the Clerk of the Superior Court's Electronic Document Management System (EDMS).

As a result of this progress, customers who request a file from 2002 to the present date are referred to the Public Access Terminals available at customer service locations to view the record. The hard copy file is no longer pulled from the fileroom, as it would not represent the complete record. Some documents exempt from this process, pending further order of the court, include lower court appeals documents, original administrative records under review, paper bonds, wills, criminal sentencing minute entries, juvenile documents, water documents, and depositions and transcripts.

In accordance with the Administrative Order, the Office disposed of the first box of court documents in March 2007. The box contained 2,500 documents and 6,000 pages. Paper documents placed in hard copy files fill hundreds of shelving units that require a tremendous amount of space and maintenance with required staffing levels to process and transport requested case files and documents to court divisions and various other customers. Disposing of paper documents saves a significant amount of storage space for the Office, along with associated cost for the County. By ending the operational demand of pulling and delivering court case files that are now available electronically, the Office is able to focus its resources on better managing access to the electronic court record and on processing the increasing number of Superior Court filings. "Transporting" these documents or case files is now performed at the click of a button allowing a multitude of customers to access electronic court records simultaneously; a most efficient and effective process for providing access instantaneously and a "win-win" situation for all.

Based upon the continued ongoing success of this initiative, the Clerk received authorization from the AOC to rely on electronic images of court records in lieu of paper case records on September 20, 2011. Accordingly, there is no longer a need for an Electronic Court Record Pilot Project in the Superior Court in Maricopa County.

GLOSSARY

<i>A & C</i>	Additions & Corrections: Process of updating a record previously microfilmed where newer or amended documents will exist on a separate roll of film.
<i>Active</i>	Records that are considered to have current or recent activity.
<i>ASLAPR</i>	The Arizona State Library, Archives, and Public Records. The facility encompasses the Archives Division and Record Management Division.
<i>CCB</i>	Central Court Building: 201 W. Jefferson St. Phoenix, Arizona 85003
<i>CARS</i>	Computer Assisted Retrieval System: A microfilm tracking database that indicates the microfilm roll and frame number on which a specific record is located.
<i>Case Transfer</i>	Cases can be transferred between satellite courts. For example, if a Downtown case is transferred to SEA, the case is assigned a new case number. Statistically this would slightly inflate the overall growth percentage.
<i>CSC</i>	Clerk of Court Customer Service Center: 601 W. Jackson St. Phoenix, Arizona 85003.
<i>DJC</i>	Downtown Justice Center: 620 W. Jackson St. Phoenix, Arizona 85003
<i>FC</i>	Family Court With Children, a case category beginning 2/5/01 where minor children are common to the parties involved.
<i>FN</i>	Family Court With No Children, a case category beginning 2/5/01 where no minor children are common to the parties involved.
<i>Fiche</i>	A diminutive of "microfiche". These records have been microfilmed and are case specific to film jacket. The film is in flat format. Unless otherwise noted, files on fiche are viewed at CSC.
<i>Film</i>	A diminutive of "microfilm". These records have been microfilmed and are located on a roll of film amid other cases. Unless otherwise noted, all files on film can be viewed at CSC. SEA case files on film may also be viewed at the SEA facility.
<i>FT2</i>	File Tracking System: database used to locate case files. Location indicator of FT2 denotes case could be on film, hard copy or e-file. Check the FT2 database for current location.
<i>Home Location</i>	The location which FT2 recognizes as the place where the file resides or the medium in which the record is maintained.
<i>Imaging</i>	The process by which a paper document is scanned electronically and stored on a computer drive or on an optical disc as a digital image that can later be retrieved and viewed through an indexing program.
<i>Inactive</i>	Records that are considered to have no current or recent activity.
<i>JCC-DF</i>	Juvenile Court Center – Durango Facility: 3131 W. Durango St. Phoenix, Arizona, 85009.
<i>JCC-SE</i>	Juvenile Court Center – Southeast Facility: 1810 S. Lewis, Mesa, Arizona, 85210.

<i>Nunc Pro Tunc</i>	"Now for then". A term used to describe an order that is effective retroactively, usually when information that had substantial bearing on the case was inadvertently left out of the record.
<i>NER</i>	Northeast Regional Court Center: 18380 N. 40th St. Suite 120, Phoenix, Arizona, 85032. NER files are housed at CSC when not in use.
<i>NWR</i>	Northwest Regional Court Center: 14264 West Tierra Buena Lane, Surprise, Arizona, 85374. NWR files are housed at CSC when not in use.
<i>OCH</i>	Old Court House: 125 W. Washington St. Phoenix, Arizona, 85003.
<i>Public Access Terminals</i>	Computer terminals used to access court files created after 2002; public access terminals are located at all Clerk of Court customer service facilities.
<i>SEA</i>	Southeast Adult Facility: 222 E. Javelina Ave, Mesa, Arizona, 85210.
<i>SCT</i>	South Court Tower: 175 W. Madison, Phoenix, AZ 85003
<i>State Archives</i>	A Division of Arizona State Library Archives and Public Records, located at the State Capitol, 1700 W. Washington St. Phoenix, Arizona 85007.
<i>Supplemental File</i>	A record created when documents are filed after the original case record has been microfilmed. They remain in hard-copy until filmed by the Micrographics Department at CSC, usually on an annual basis. Check with the A & C Department for current supplemental status.
<i>Temporary Papers</i>	Original documents that have been processed through the Clerk's Office and routed to their home location. The documents are placed in the original file upon its return.

MARICOPA COUNTY LANDMARK, RENOWNED, AND HISTORICALLY SIGNIFICANT CASES

MIRANDA CASE: In 1963, Ernesto Miranda was accused of kidnap and rape and was arrested in Phoenix. Miranda was subsequently found guilty and sentenced to 20 years in prison. This conviction was appealed all the way to the United States Supreme Court. In 1966, Miranda and three similar cases were joined and in a landmark decision, the Supreme Court determined that an accused individual has the right to remain silent and that prosecutors cannot use statements made by the accused while in police custody, unless the individual has been advised of their rights. The case numbers for the Miranda case are CR41948. These files are available on microfilm at CSC. Some exhibits are at the State Archives and some are at the U.S. District Court.

WINNIE RUTH JUDD CASE: Also known as the "Trunk Murderess Case", it began in Phoenix in 1931 when Winnie Ruth Judd was accused of killing two women she had known for some time as neighbors and roommates. The purported motive was jealousy over a local businessman named Jack Halloran. The bodies of the murdered women were cut into pieces, packed in trunks and shipped to California where a railroad baggage handler noticed a peculiar odor and saw leakage from the trunks. Winnie Ruth Judd was arrested and stood trial in Arizona. She was found guilty on February 8, 1932, although she maintained that her actions were taken in self defense. Jack Halloran was indicted but not convicted. Judd was committed to the Arizona State Hospital. She escaped twice in 1939, once in 1947, once in 1951, and twice again in 1952. A grand jury recommended that her death sentence be commuted to life imprisonment in 1952. In 1962 she escaped to California where she lived until 1969, when she was discovered and extradited to Arizona. She was pardoned by Governor Jack Williams in 1971. The case numbers involved are CR11333, CR11340, and CR11342. The files are available on microfilm at CSC. Original records and exhibits are available at the State Archives.

KINGMAN FIRE CASES: In July 1973, an explosion of a propane tank car in Kingman, Arizona resulted in many deaths and injuries. As a result over 50 suits were filed in Superior Court. THE GILA RIVER ADJUDICATION (W1, W2, W3, AND W4 CONSOLIDATED): The Water Case, as it is known, became a judicial proceeding in April 1979 when a petition to determine conflicting water rights, filed by the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association, was transferred from a state agency to the Maricopa County Superior Court. The case was initiated in order to resolve the issue of who has what rights to surface water and appropriate groundwater in Arizona. Originally, the only watershed involved was W1, the Salt River Watershed. In November 1981, the following watersheds were consolidated into W1: W2, Verde River; W3, Upper Gila River; and W4, San Pedro River. The full case is *In re the General Adjudication of All Rights to Use Water in the Gila River System and Source, W1, W2, W3, and W4 (Consolidated)*.

Six Indian water rights settlements have been approved: W1-200, *Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community Water Rights Settlement*; W1-201, *Fort McDowell Indian Community Water Rights Settlement* and W1-202, *Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe Water Rights Settlement*, W1-204, *San Carlos Apache Tribe Water Rights Settlement*, W1-207, *Gila River Indian Community Water Rights Settlement*, and W1-208, *Tohono O'odham Nation Water Rights Settlement*.

Active Indian water rights matters are W1-203, *In re the Water Rights of the Gila River Indian Community*; W1-205, which has no designated name but is between the U.S. Department of the Interior, Gila River Indian Community, and the Roosevelt Water Conservation District, and W1-206, *In re the Preclusive Effect of the Globe Equity No. 59 Decree on Specified Parties*.

Active contested cases are W1-103, *In re Subflow Technical Report, San Pedro River Watershed*; W1-104, *In re State Trust Lands*; W1-105, a case not yet organized but involving certain *de minimis* water rights; W1-11-232, *In re San Pedro Riparian National Conservation Area*; W1-11-605, *In re Fort Huachuca*; W1-11-1174, *In re PWR 107 Claims*; and W1-11-3423, *In re Powers Garden Administrative Site*. Several injunctive relief matters, listed under the main docket number, are pending in the Salt and Verde River Watersheds.

STATE OF ARIZONA V. JOHN HENRY KNAPP, CR78779: On November 16, 1973, a fire in the Mesa residence of John and Linda Knapp claimed the lives of their two infant daughters. John Henry Knapp was accused of setting the blaze with Coleman fuel and charged with two counts of first-degree murder. He was tried in August 1974 but the jury was unable to reach a verdict. A second trial commenced in October, and on November 19, the jury found Knapp guilty on both counts of murder. On January 6, 1975, he was sentenced to death in the gas chamber and transported to the Arizona State Prison to await execution. His conviction was affirmed by the Arizona Supreme Court on March 9, 1977. After a series of appeals, a fifth petition for post-conviction relief was granted on February 11, 1987, vacating Knapp's conviction and sentence and granting him a new trial. Research over the intervening twelve years had the phenomenon of "flashover", in which the damage from a high temperature fire mimics that of one set using an accelerant. This gave substantial weight to the theory that the fire could have been set accidentally by the girls themselves. However, much of the state's tangible evidence had by that time been destroyed, and the Attorney General's Office was unable to proceed to trial. The case was dismissed with prejudice on December 21, 1987. The case may be viewed on microfilm at CSC. Original documents are at CSC.

THE SOUL CASE, P58416: On January 2, 1946, James Kidd executed a holographic will which states in part: "*sell all my property...and have this balance of money to go in a research or some scientific proof of a soul of the human body which leaves at death I think in time their can be a Photograph of soul leaving the human at death.*" On proof that Kidd has absented himself from Maricopa County for such a period of time as to be presumed dead, the will was admitted to judgment by the bank. Judge Robert L. Myers declared that Kidd's will created a valid, charitable testamentary trust, and set for hearing the petitions of those individuals and organizations who sought distribution of the estate for the purpose of engaging in research under the terms of the will. One hundred thirty three claims were made, and from June through October 1967, over one hundred written and oral testimonies were heard in Superior Court. On November 7, 1967, Judge Myers signed an order appointing the Neurological Sciences Foundation of Phoenix as trustee. At that time the estate was valued at roughly \$200,000. However the decision was appealed to the Arizona Supreme Court who reversed and remanded the Superior Court's decision on January 19, 1971. Judge Myers subsequently ruled that the trust be granted to the American Society for Psychical Research, who as trustee conducted its research on its Hypothesis of Post-Mortem Survival until the funds from the Kidd estate were depleted in May 1975. The case may be viewed on microfilm at CSC.

PUBLIC FIDUCIARY VS ARIZONA STATE HOSPITAL, DEPT OF HEALTH SERVICES (SARNS CASE) CV432355: This case was filed in 1981 as a class action lawsuit alleging that the State and Maricopa County did not fund a comprehensive mental health system as required by A.R.S. §§ 36-550 through 36-550.08. In 1986, the trial court agreed with the class members and entered judgment against the State and County. The Arizona Supreme Court affirmed the judgment in 1989. Since that time, the Court continues to oversee the status of the case, compliance issues raised and the parties' stipulations. There are approximately 18,000 people in Maricopa County with a serious mental illness whom are plaintiffs and affected by this case. The Governor and county officials are defendants. Throughout the years, the issues in the case have been continually reported in the news media. The case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. EVAN MECHAM, CR 1988-000246: Evan Mecham was Governor of Arizona at the time of his indictment on 6 felony charges on January 8, 1988. In the interim, he was impeached by the Arizona House. On June 10, 1988, Mecham was acquitted of all criminal charges. The case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. O'BRIEN, CR2003-016197-001; On June 14, 2003, the defendant was driving eastbound on Glendale Avenue, approaching 19th Avenue when he struck a pedestrian crossing the roadway. The pedestrian died as a result of being hit by the defendant's car, as well as another unidentified vehicle that was apparently following behind the defendant. The defendant failed to stop at the scene of the collision and render aid as required by A.R.S. §§ 28-661 and 28-663. Several witnesses observed the incident and one witness obtained the license plate number of the involved vehicle. Further investigation revealed the vehicle was registered to the Roman Catholic Diocese and was assigned to Bishop O'Brien. When police contacted him at his residence two days after the accident, he stated something had hit his windshield, but he did not know what had happened. He admitted he did not stop after the incident, noting he did not believe there was any reason to do so. He also stated church officials had previously contacted him to inform him his vehicle had been involved in a hit and run fatality. He did not personally contact police, thinking they would contact him. The defendant allowed detectives to inspect his vehicle, and blood, hair, and tissue from the victim were found in and around the damaged areas. The defendant was interviewed further and he was taken into custody. On March 26, 2004, the defendant was sentenced to serve four years supervised probation and perform 1000 hours of community service. The court elected not to require the defendant to serve an initial term of incarceration, but rather deferred a six-month jail term which was ultimately deleted from the defendant's sentence based upon satisfactory performance while on probation. The case may be viewed at CSC.

TEE TIME ARRANGERS, INC VS. VISTOSO GOLD PARTNERS, LLC, CV2004-013105: Tee Time, an Arizona corporation, created and operated a discount golf card program called the Tucson Resort Golf Card from 1991 to 2001, which offered golfers the chance to play "high-end" or elite golf courses at reduced rates during off-peak times. The program utilized an annual written Participation Agreement that included an exclusivity provision that typically allowed for limited exceptions contingent on Tee Time's consent. Ultimately, the management of several of these golf courses formed the Tucson Golf Alliance (TGA), which in turned developed their own discount card (Southern Chapter Card) which was affiliated with and administrated by the Southern Chapter of the Southwest Section of the PGS (SWSPGA). Tee Time was subsequently informed that several of the (TGA) members was considering switching from their discount card to another discount card (the Southern Chapter Card). By late summer 2000, many of TGA members had chosen not to participate in Tee Time's program and instead signed agreements to participate in the Southern Chapter Card program. Although more than a dozen southern Arizona golf courses, including some of the more desirable courses, chose to participate in Tee Time's program for the 2000-2001 golf season. Tee Time maintained that the number of quality participants was insufficient for their discount program to remain viable. On July 7, 2004, Tee Time sued alleging three claims based on violations of Arizona's Uniform State Antitrust Act. On February 13, the court entered judgment in favor of the defendants. On March 7, 2007, Tee Time filed a timely notice of appeal. On February 8, 2008, the trial court's judgment was affirmed by the Arizona Court of Appeals. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. CROTTS; GRABINSKI; HOOVER; FRIEND; ROLFES, CR2001-006183-(A)(B)(C)(D)(E): Defendants William Crotts, Thomas Grabinski, Lawrence Hoover, Harold Friend and Richard Rolfes were prosecuted for fraud related to an investment vehicle called the Baptist Foundation of Arizona (BFA) that collected hundreds of millions of dollars from investors. The case was notorious for the local residents who lost substantial funds in BFA. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. DONALD DALE DEARDOFF, CR2001-006926: Defendant Donald Deardoff was prosecuted for fraud related to an investment vehicle called the Baptist Foundation of Arizona (BFA) that collected hundreds of millions of dollars from investors. The case was notorious for the local residents who lost substantial funds in BFA. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. JALMA W. HUNSINGER, CR2001-006927: Defendant Jalma Hunsinger was prosecuted for fraud related to an investment vehicle called the Baptist Foundation of Arizona (BFA) that collected hundreds of millions of dollars from investors. The case was notorious for the local residents who lost substantial funds in BFA. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. EDGAR ALAN KUHN, CR2001-006928: Defendant Edgar Kuhn was prosecuted for fraud related to an investment vehicle called the Baptist Foundation of Arizona (BFA) that collected hundreds of millions of dollars from investors. The case was notorious for the local residents who lost substantial funds in BFA. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. JOHNATHAN ANDREW DOODY, CR1992-001232: This case captured national and international attention when nine individuals including Buddhist monks, were killed at a Buddhist Temple west of Phoenix. Johnathan Doody, a teenager at the time, was tried, convicted and sentenced to prison for the murders. The case was heard by the U.S. Supreme Court regarding the voluntariness of Doody's confession. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. TIMOTHY STUART RING, CR1995-001754: This case was heard by the U.S. Supreme Court as a representative case, resulting in the "Ring decision," creating the Constitutional requirement that a jury, not a judge, determine whether a convicted defendant is eligible to receive the death penalty. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. MARK GOUDEAU, CR2006-155081: This is the initial criminal court case involving Mark Goudeau, who was charged with a series of crimes that were locally and nationally attributed to "the Baseline Killer". In this case, he was convicted of sexual assault against two sisters who were walking home from a city park and was sentenced to over 400 years in prison on related counts. This case is connected to CR2007-005499, in which Goudeau was convicted of murdering nine victims. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. MARK GOUDEAU, CR2007-005449: This is the criminal court case involving Mark Goudeau, who was charged with a series of crimes that were locally and nationally attributed to "the Baseline Killer". In this case, he was convicted of murdering nine (9) victims. Mark Goudeau was sentenced to nine (9) death counts and 1200 years for all remaining counts. This case is connected to CR2006-155081, in which Goudeau was convicted of sexual assault against two sisters who were walking home from a city park and was sentenced to over 400 years in prison on related counts. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. STEVEN JOHN COY, CR2004-008246-002: Steven John Coy, a former inmate of the Arizona State Prison, overtook a prison watchtower with a fellow inmate on January 18, 2004, holding two security guards hostage for two weeks. He and his accomplice surrendered on February 1, 2004. It is the longest prison stand-off in U.S. history and Steven John Coy was sentenced to multiple consecutive life sentences related to the offenses. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. RICKY WASSENAAR, CR2004-010115: Ricky Kurt Wassenaar, a former inmate of the Arizona State Prison, overtook a prison watchtower with a fellow inmate on January 18, 2004, holding two security guards hostage for two weeks. He and his accomplice surrendered on February 1, 2004. It is the longest prison stand-off in U.S. history and Ricky Wassenaar was sentenced to multiple consecutive life sentences related to the offenses. This case may be viewed at CSC.

ELIZABETH SUKENIC VS. MARICOPA COUNTY, CV2001-003337: Elizabeth Sukenic filed action in February 2001 alleging discrimination, retaliation and reprisal, and a continuous pattern of discriminatory harassment in violation of A.R.S. §41-1461, the Arizona Civil Rights Act. A second amended Complaint was filed in November 2002 adding her spouse Howard as co-plaintiff, and subsequently alleging violations of Title VII of the 1964 Civil Rights Act amended and the Civil Rights Act of 1991. In January 2003, by order of the Court, the case was closed, having been removed to the United States District Court. This case may be viewed at CSC.

JOSEPH M. ARPAIO VS. JAMES VINCENT COZZOLINO, CV2001-003901: In August 1996, James Cozzolino applied to the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office for a position as a member of the Sheriff's Posse. Based on Mr. Cozzolino's prior history of convictions for a variety of offenses, his application was denied. Over the next several years, Mr. Cozzolino directed hostile and abusive contacts towards the Sheriff. A petition for injunction against harassment was filed and granted in March 2001. A hearing was requested by Cozzolino and based on those findings, a modified injunction was granted in June 2001. A Notice of Appeal was filed in August 2001, however due to non-payment of filing fees, the case was deemed abandoned by the Court of Appeals. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. SCOTT LOUIS FALATER, CR1997-000928A: This is the criminal case involving Scott Louis Falater. On January 16, 1997, Scott Falater murdered his wife and although he does not deny the action, he stated that he was in a state of somnambulistic automatism or sleepwalking, when the murder occurred. Because of these circumstances, this case received local and national attention. He was convicted of murder in the first degree and on January 10, 2000, was sentenced, by special verdict, to serve the remainder of his natural life in prison. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. SAMUEL JOHN DIETEMAN, CR2006-012721-002: This is the criminal case involving Samuel Dieteman. This case was notorious due to Dieteman and co-defendant Dale Hausner being charged with a series of crimes that were locally and statewide attributed to the "Serial Shooter" case. In this case, he was charged with numerous counts, to include conspiracy to commit first degree murder and arson of an occupied structure. This case is also connected to CR2006-048493, where he was charged with several counts including first degree murder and attempted first degree murder. In both cases, he was sentenced to natural life and life without possibility of parole. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. SAMUEL JOHN DIETEMAN, CR2006-048493-001: This is the criminal case involving Samuel Dieteman. This case was notorious due to Dieteman and co-defendant Dale Hausner being charged with a series of crimes that were locally and statewide attributed to the "Serial Shooter" case. In this case, he was charged with numerous counts, to include first degree murder and drive-by shooting. This case is also connected to CR2006-012721, where he was charged with several counts including conspiracy to commit first degree murder and attempted first degree murder. In both cases, he was sentenced to natural life and life without possibility of parole. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. DALE SHAWN HAUSNER, CR2008-007313-002: This is the criminal case involving Dale Shawn Hausner. This case was notorious due to Hausner being charged with a series of crimes that were locally and statewide attributed to the "Serial Shooter" case. In this case, he was convicted on numerous counts, to include attempted first degree murder and aggravated assault. This case is connected to CR2006-048493, where he was convicted of murdering two victims, CR2006-012721, where he was convicted of murdering three victims, and CR2008-006364, where he was convicted of murdering one victim. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. DALE SHAWN HAUSNER, CR2008-006364-001: This is the criminal case involving Dale Shawn Hausner. This case was notorious due to Hausner being charged with a series of crimes that were locally and statewide attributed to the "Serial Shooter" case. In this case, he was convicted on numerous counts, to include murdering one victim. He was sentenced to death on this particular count. This case is connected to CR2006-012721, where he was convicted of murdering three victims, and CR2008-007313, where he was convicted of attempted first degree murder and aggravated assault. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. DALE SHAWN HAUSNER, CR2006-012721-001: This is the criminal case involving Dale Shawn Hausner. This case was notorious due to Hausner being charged with a series of crimes that were locally and statewide attributed to the "Serial Shooter" case. In this case, he was convicted on numerous counts, to include murdering three victims. He was sentenced to death on these particular counts. This case is connected to CR2006-048493, where he was convicted of murdering two victims, CR2008-006364, where he was convicted of murdering one victim, and CR2008-007313, where he was convicted of attempted first degree murder and aggravated assault. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. DALE SHAWN HAUSNER, CR2006-048493-002: This is the initial case involving Dale Shawn Hausner. This case was notorious due to Hausner being charged with a series of crimes that were locally and statewide attributed to the "Serial Shooter" case. In this case, he was convicted on numerous counts, to include murdering two victims. He was sentenced to death on these particular counts. This case is connected to CR2006-012721, where he was convicted of murdering three victims, CR2008-006364, where he was convicted of murdering one victim, and CR2008-007313, where he was convicted of attempted first degree murder and aggravated assault. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. JEFFERY JOSEPH HAUSNER, CR2008-007313-001: This is the criminal case involving Jeffery Joseph Hausner. As an accomplice provided a distraction, Hausner stabbed the victim several times in the back. Initially unable to identify his assailant, the victim ultimately recognized the accomplice, Dale Hausner, after his arrest in connection with unrelated serial shootings. Jeffery Hausner was eventually identified as the assailant. While incarcerated due to a previous unrelated criminal case, Hausner was charged and sentenced to 18 years on the attempted murder conviction and 11.25 years on the aggravated assault conviction. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. JEFFERY JOSEPH HAUSNER, CR2006-168158-002: This is the initial case involving Jeffery Joseph Hausner. In November 2006, Jeffery Hausner was charged with attempted second degree murder and aggravated assault. A plea agreement/change of plea was entered in March 2007 and Hausner pled guilty to aggravated assault. He was sentenced to 7.5 years for this offense. This case may be viewed at CSC.

PHOENIX NEWSPAPERS, INC VS. LISA GRAHAM KEEGAN, THE STATE OF ARIZONA BOARD OF EDUCATION, AND THE ARIZONA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, CV1999-021338: In November 1999, upon release of the statewide results of the Arizona Instrument to Measure Standards (AIMS) test, Phoenix Newspaper Inc. (PNI) requested a photocopy of Form A of the test. They were told that they could inspect the test in a controlled environment, but could not have a photocopy. PNI filed a Special Action in December 1999 to enforce A.R.S. §39-121 through §39-121.03 (the Arizona Public Records Law). In April 2000, the Court ordered the contents of Form A, with the exception of the anchor questions, to be disclosed. The Court of Appeals affirmed the lower court's original decision in April 2002. This case may be viewed at CSC.

PATRICIA W. ALSTON VS. PHOENIX COUNTRY CLUB, CV2010-005897: Patricia Alston, a member of Phoenix Country Club (PCC), requested permission to play in member-guest tournaments scheduled from September 2008 through May of 2009, but was told that all member tournaments were specifically stated for men only. The only organized golfing opportunities available for her would be with the PCC's Women's Golf Association, which were the same activities provided for the wives and girlfriends of male members. In May 2010, Ms. Alston filed an amended Complaint alleging Breach of Contract, Breach of Fiduciary Duty, and Breach of Duty of Good Faith and Fair Dealing. The case settled in December 2010 and was dismissed, with prejudice, in January 2011. This case may be viewed at CSC.

JANE DOE VS. JOE ARPAIO, MARICOPA COUNTY SHERIFF, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY; MARICOPA COUNTY, CV2004-009286: Jane Doe, pseudonym for a pregnant inmate, desired to terminate her pregnancy and informed the Sheriff's Office of her decision. She was initially told that there was an unwritten policy that prohibits transportation of inmates for any elective medical procedure and that a court order would be needed. The Court ruled that this policy was unconstitutional and the Sheriff was enjoined from directly or indirectly enforcing said policy. The Sheriff's Office appealed the decision, which was affirmed by the Court of Appeals in November 2007. This case may be viewed at CSC.

MARICOPA COUNTY REPUBLICAN PARTY, BY AND THROUGH ITS CHAIR, THE HON.TOM LIDDY VS. CONSTANTIN QUERARD, DOING BUSINESS AS "REPUBLICAN PRIMARY VOTE-BY-MAIL CENTER," AN UNREGISTERED POLITICAL ADVOCACY ENTITY, CV2004-016012: In August 2004, the Maricopa County Republican Party filed a Complaint against Constantin Querard, alleging that he mailed Early Ballot Request forms to voters in an effort to obtain sensitive voter information for his own political ends. The County Recorder and Election Director filed an Intervention as well. The Court issued a preliminary injunction against Querard to cease the mailings and provide the Election Director with all obtained voter data. The case was dismissed, with prejudice, in August 2005. This case may be viewed at CSC.

THE SEPTEMBER 7, 2004 PRIMARY ELECTION FOR STATE REPRESENTATIVE – DISTRICT 20 REPUBLICAN PRIMARY; JOHN MCCOMISH AND ANTON ORLICH, CANDIDATES, CV2004-018181: A petition for automatic recount was filed by Secretary of State Janice Brewer for a recount of the votes cast for candidates John McCormish and Anton Orlich in the 2004 Primary Election for State Representative – District 20 Republican Primary. After the initial vote total, the difference between the candidates was 4 votes. The Court ruled that a recount be conducted and upon those results, John McCormish was declared the winner by a total of 13 votes. The order approving the Recount Results was signed on September 23, 2004. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE OF ARIZONA VS. CHARLES FRANKLIN LONG, CR2002-002674A: This is the criminal case involving Charles Franklin Long and the American Buffalo Soldier Boot Camp. Long established a boot-camp program for at-risk-youths, designed in a military style to assist the youths. The camp participants were subjected to demanding physical activities at times in extreme temperatures. In July 2001, Long physically threatened one youth with a knife and several of the youths were also forced to take dirt into their mouths and to hold it in their mouths until they were told to spit it out. Another youth, after being exposed to direct sunlight in temperatures approaching 112 degrees and higher, became lethargic. He was taken to a hotel room for a shower and to cool off. No immediate medical assistance was requested. The youth later returned to the camp but fell over and hit his head. A 911 was placed and the youth was transported by air to a local hospital where he died later. This case was notorious due to Long having been initially indicted on charges of second degree murder, aggravated assault, and 8 counts of child abuse. He was eventually convicted on charges of reckless manslaughter and aggravated assault and sentenced to an aggravated six-year prison term on the manslaughter conviction and to a concurrent, mitigated five-year prison term on the assault conviction. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE OF ARIZONA VS. DONALD T. STAPLEY, CR2008-009242-001: Donald T. Stapley, a public official, was indicted in November 2008 on numerous counts of Forgery, Perjury, False Swearing and Filing an Incomplete And/Or False Financial Disclosure. Prosecution of the case was eventually taken over by the Yavapai County Attorney's office. All but two of the counts were dismissed by the Court and the State moved to dismiss the remaining charges without prejudice. The State then appealed the Court's order dismissing the misdemeanor charges. The Court's dismissal order was affirmed by the Court of Appeals in March 2011. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. GARY DONAHOE, CR2009-008332-001: Gary Donahoe, a Superior Court judge, was charged in December 2009 on counts of Hindering Prosecution, Obstructing Criminal Investigations, both Class 5 Felonies, and Bribery of a Public Servant, a Class 4 Felony. Judge Donahoe filed an Application for Immediate Stay Pending Resolution of Special Action with the Arizona Supreme Court which was subsequently denied. In January 2013, the case was ordered dismissed with prejudice. This case is considered historically significant based on the interest to the public, both locally and nationally, and was part of an inter-county conflict occurring between 2008 and 2013. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. MARY ROSE WILCOX, CR2010-005423-001: Mary Rose Wilcox, a public official, was indicted in January 2010 on numerous charges of Conflict of Interest, Perjury, Forgery, and False Swearing. The case was reassigned to Pima County for judicial assignment. The Indictment was ordered dismissed in March 2010. An Order to supplement the record with all minutes, instruments, and pleadings from CR2009-007892-001 was granted in June 2010 by the Court of Appeals. This case is considered historically significant based on the interest to the public, both locally and nationally, and was part of an inter-county conflict occurring between 2008 and 2012. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. MARY ROSE WILCOX, CR2009-007892-001: Mary Rose Wilcox, a public official, was indicted in December 2009 in numerous charges of Conflict of Interest, Perjury, Forgery, and False Swearing. The case was reassigned to Pima County for judicial assignment. The Indictment was ordered dismissed in February 2010. An Order to supplement CR2010-005423 with all minutes, instruments, and pleadings from this case was granted in June 2010 by the Court of Appeals. This case is considered historically significant based on the interest to the public, both locally and nationally, and was part of an inter-county conflict occurring between 2008 and 2012. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. DONALD T. STAPLEY, JR., CR2009-007891-001: Donald T. Stapley, a public official, was indicted in December 2009 on numerous counts of Fraudulent Schemes and Artifices, Perjury, Forgery, False Swearing, and Theft. The case was ordered reassigned to Pima County for judicial assignment. In March 2010, the case was ordered dismissed without prejudice. This case is considered historically significant based on the interest to the public, both locally and nationally, and was part of an inter-county conflict occurring between 2008 and 2012. This case may be viewed at CSC.

BARBARA MUNDELL AND ANNA BACA VS. MARICOPA COUNTY, JOSEPH ARPAIO, JOSEPH AND AVA ARPAIO, DAVID HENDERSHOTT AND ANNA HENDERSHOTT, LISA AUBUCHON AND PETER PESTALOZZI, AND ANDREW P. THOMAS AND ANNE THOMAS, CV2010-032707: Barbara Mundell and Anna Baca, retired Superior Court Judges, filed a Complaint in November 2010, amended in September 2011, claiming abuse of process, wrongful institution of civil proceedings, defamation, slander, libel, false light invasion of privacy, intentional infliction of emotional distress, and constitutional and statutory violations based on 42 U.S.C. § 1983. Initially assigned to Pima County for judicial assignment, a Notice of Removal to U.S. District Court was filed in November 2011. This case is considered historically significant based on the interest to the public, both locally and nationally, and was part of an inter-county conflict occurring between 2008 and 2012. This case may be viewed at CSC.

KENNETH FIELDS VS. MARICOPA COUNTY, JOSEPH ARPAIO, RICHARD ROMLEY, WILLIAM MONTGOMERY, JOSEPH ARPAIO AND JANE DOE ARPAIO, DAVID HENDERSHOTT AND JANE DOE HENDERSHOTT, LISA AUBUCHON AND JOHN DOE AUBUCHON, ANDREW P. THOMAS AND JANE DOE THOMAS, DOES I THROUGH x; BLACK CORPORATIONS I THROUGH x, ABC PARTNERSHIPS I THROUGH X, CV 2010-032888: Kenneth Fields, a retired Superior Court Judge, filed a Complaint in November 2010, amended in March 2011, claiming abuse of process, wrongful institution of civil proceedings, and defamation, libel, and slander. This case was assigned to Pima County for judicial assignment. In August 2011, an Order to dismiss the case, with prejudice, was signed. This case is considered historically significant based on the interest to the public, both locally and nationally, and was part of an inter-county conflict occurring between 2008 and 2012. This case may be viewed at CSC.

SANDRA WILSON AND PAUL WILSON VS. SHERIFF JOSEPH ARPAIO AND AVA ARPAIO, ANDREW THOMAS AND ANNE THOMAS, LISA AUBUCHON AND PETER R. PESTALOZZI, DEPUTY CHIEF DAVID HENDERSHOTT AND ANNA HENDERSHOTT, WILLIAM MONTGOMERY, MARICOPA COUNTY AND JOHN DOES I-X, JANE DOES I-X, BLACK CORPORATIONS I-V AND WHITE PARTNERSHIPS I-V, CV2010-032843: Sandra Wilson, a Deputy County Manager filed a Complaint in November 2010 alleging numerous violations of 42 U.S.C. §1983, violations of Arizona Law, Defamation, Libel and/or False Light Invasion of Privacy, Racketeering Violations, and Negligence. Initially assigned to Pima County for judicial assignment, a Notice of Removal to U.S. District Court was then filed in December 2010. This case is considered historically significant based on the interest to the public, both locally and nationally, and was part of an inter-county conflict occurring between 2008 and 2012. This case may be viewed at CSC.

SUSAN SCHUERMAN VS. SHERIFF JOSEPH ARPAIO AND AVA ARPAIO, ANDREW THOMAS AND ANNE THOMAS, LISA AUBUCHON AND PETER R. PESTALOZZI, DEPUTY CHIEF DAVID HENDERSHOTT AND ANNA HENDERSHOTT, WILLIAM MONTGOMERY, MARICOPA COUNTY AND JOHN DOES I-X, JANE DOES I-X, BLACK CORPORATIONS I-V AND WHITE PARTNERSHIPS I-V, CV2010-032845: Susan Schuerman, a Maricopa County employee filed a Complaint in November 2010 alleging numerous violations of 42 U.S.C. §1983, violations of Arizona Law, Abuse of Process, Infliction of Emotional Distress, Libel, Defamation, and/or False Light Invasion of Privacy, Racketeering Violations, Negligence and Gross Negligence. Initially assigned to Pima County for judicial assignment, a Notice of Removal to U.S. District Court was then filed in December 2010. This case is considered historically significant based on the interest to the public, both locally and nationally, and was part of an inter-county conflict occurring between 2008 and 2012. This case may be viewed at CSC.

A B C D W HOLDINGS, LLC, VANDERBILT FARMS, LLC, CONLEY WOLFSWINKEL, ASHTON WOLDSWINKEL, AND BRANDON WOLFSWINKEL, CV2009-005990: In January 2009, the Maricopa Sheriff's Office was issued a Search Warrant to search the premises of W Holdings based on allegations that Donald Stapley, a public official, improperly received money or other compensation from the Wolfswinkel Companies. This case was vacated and transferred to the appropriate Justice Court in March 2009 and was dismissed without prejudice in February 2010. This case is considered historically significant based on the interest to the public, both locally and nationally, and was part of an inter-county conflict occurring between 2008 and 2012. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. WILLIAM CRAIG MILLER, CR2005-140129-001: This is the initial criminal case involving William Craig Miller. In December 2005, Miller was indicted on counts of Arson of an Occupied Structure, Fraudulent Fire Insurance Application or Claim, Fraudulent Insurance Claim, and Attempted Fraudulent Schemes and Artifices. He subsequently pled guilty to these charges. This case is connected to CR2006-112056, where he was convicted of several charges to include five counts of First Degree Murder, and CR2006-008155, where he was convicted of four counts of Solicitation of First Degree Murder. This case may be viewed at CSC.

ROOSEVELT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT VS. GOVERNOR JANE D. HULL, CV1999-019062: The Roosevelt Elementary School District filed action in October 1999 against the State to enforce the funding obligations established by the Students FIRST legislation. The plaintiffs contend that underfunding has resulted in the school districts being unable to provide the facilities and equipment necessary to enable their students to meet the state's academic standards. The case was dismissed without prejudice in January 2011. This case may be viewed at CSC.

JONATHAN B. WEISBUCH, MD DIRECTOR, MARICOPA COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH VS. ALL PERSONS ARRESTED FOR PROSTITUTION IN MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA, CV2001-004963: Doctor Jonathan Weisbuch, Director of the Maricopa County Department of Public Health, filed a petition on March 23, 2001 to require all individuals arrested for prostitution to be tested for syphilis. At that time, a syphilis epidemic was declared in Maricopa County, one of the few counties outside of the southeastern United States where the syphilis rates exceeded the nation goal. On April 12, 2001, the Order was signed allowing the Department of Public Health, upon consent, to draw an individual's blood prior to their normal release from jail. This case may be viewed at CSC.

DAVID SCHWEIKERT, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS TREASURER OF MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA VS. DR. SANDRA DOWLING, IN HER OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS SOLE MEMBER OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF MARICOPA COUNTY REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 509, MARICOPA COUNTY REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 509, AND JOHN DOES 1-3, BLACK CORPORATIONS 1-3, CV2006-014285: Maricopa County Treasurer David Schweikert filed a Complaint in September 2006 seeking declaratory relief regarding his duties in handling warrants from School District No. 509. He alleged that Superintendent Dowling continually presented warrants that exceeded the District's deposits so that the District had negative balances in its allocated funds. The Board of Supervisors and Superintendent Dowling both filed counterclaims. A final judgment was issued in October 2007. This was appealed to the Court of Appeals which affirmed the judgment in January 2010. This case may be viewed at CSC.

ARIZONA TOGETHER, AN UNINCORPORATED ASSOCIATION, AMALIA ANTONIOLA, AL BREZNEY, GLEN CROMER, TERESA HEWITT, PAUL KNOBBE, ALBERT LANNON, KAITLIN MEADOWS, REBECCA MILLER, FRANK MONTOYA, MAXINE PIATT VS. JANICE BREWER, IN HER OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE STATE OF ARIZONA AND PROTECT MARRIAGE ARIZONA, AN UNINCORPORATED ASSOCIATION, CV2006-010505: Arizona Together a political committee, filed a Complaint in July 2006 alleging that an initiative, Proposition 107, filed with the Secretary of State, encompassed two or more separate constitutional amendments therefore violating Article XXI § 1 of the Arizona Constitution. In August 2006, the Court concluded that Proposition 107 did comply with the requirements of Article XXI. That ruling was appealed and in January 2007, the Court of Appeals affirmed the Court's decision. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. GARY L. BARTLETT, WILLIAM J. ENGLISH, SHIREE L. FOSTER, JAMES A. HARTDEGEN, JESUS R. "CHUY" HIGUERA, ERNEST L. HOFFMAN, DAVID M. HORWITZ, DONALD J. KENNEY, SUZANNE CRAMTON LAYBE, DAVID MANLEY, JAMES HARRIS MEREDITH, BOBBY D. RAYMOND, RICHARD T. SCHEFFEL, GEORGE STRAGALAS III, RONALD G. TAPP, CAROLYN ANN WALKER, CR1991-000997: This is the case that was locally and nationally attributed to the "AzScam" case. In February 1991, 16 individuals, including several Arizona state legislators, were indicted on 100 various counts. All defendants were indicted on Count One, Conspiracy to Commit Illegally Conducting an Enterprise, Bribery of a Public Servant or Party Officer, Offer to Exert Improper Influence of a Public Officer or Employee for Consideration, Money Laundering in the Second Degree, Fraudulent Scheme or Willful Concealment, Hindering Prosecution in the First Degree and Making False Campaign Contribution Statements. Eleven of the defendants eventually struck plea agreements. Two defendants, Tapp and Walker, opted for jury trials. Walker was sentenced in January 1993 on one count and Tapp was sentenced in February 1993 on 12 counts. The cases against Foster and Bartlett were dismissed, without prejudice, in January and April 1993, respectively. The case against English was dismissed, with prejudice, in March 1992. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. R.J. REYNOLDS TOBACCO, A NEW JERSEY CORPORATION, CV2001-004564: The State of Arizona filed a Complaint in March 2001 alleging breach of contract concerning the original Master Settlement Agreement first created in 1998. That agreement restricted the outdoor advertisement of Reynolds Tobacco products to within a 90 day window of scheduled Winston Cup Series events. In February 2002, the Court awarded summary judgment in favor of the State ordering Reynolds Tobacco to remove signage posted prior to the 90 day window and also awarding costs and attorney fees to the State. Reynolds appealed and in December 2003, the Court of Appeals affirmed the Court's decision. This case may be viewed at CSC.

FRANKLIN BRUCE ROSS VS. KEN BENNETT, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE STATE OF ARIZONA, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF MARICOPA COUNTY, HELEN PURCELL, IN HER OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS MARICOPA COUNTY RECORDER, AND KAREN OSBORNE, IN HER OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS MARICOPA COUNTY ELECTIONS DEFENDANTS AND CITIZENS FOR A BETTER ARIZONA IN SUPPORT OF RC-04-2011, CV2011-0114864: A complaint for Special Action was filed in July 2011 by Franklin Bruce Ross alleging that a petition to recall State Senator Russell Pearce submitted by Citizens For A Better Arizona in Support of RC-04-2011 was not in compliance with the constitutional and statutory requirements for a recall petition. In August 2011, the Court ruled that the Citizens' Motion To Dismiss be granted on all counts. That ruling was appealed to the Court of Appeals, which affirmed the Court's decision in December 2011. This case may be viewed at CSC.

JASON AND SUZIE SCHECHTERLE, ET AL VS. FORD MOTOR COMPANY, LOU GRUBB FORD, LLC, ET AL, CV2003-003427: In March 2001, Phoenix Police Officer Jason Schechterle was stopped at a red light when his Crown Victoria Police Interception (CVPI) was struck in the rear by a taxi cab, which caused the puncture or rupture of the CVPI's gasoline tank. The gasoline ignited, immediately engulfing the passenger compartment of the CVPA in flames. Schechterle sustained severe burns over his face and body. In February 2003, Schechterle filed a Complaint claiming Strict Products Liability, two counts of Negligence, and Negligence, Negligent Hiring/Supervision, Negligent Entrustment. The case was dismissed, with prejudice, in August 2004. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. JOHN HARVEY ADAMSON, CR93385: This is the criminal case involving John Harvey Adamson. This case captured local and national attention due to the bombing death of investigative reporter Donald Bolles. Adamson was charged in June 1976 with First Degree Murder. In January 1977, he accepted a plea agreement of Second Degree Murder in exchange for his testimonies in related cases CR 94287, CR94316, CR115272 (consolidated) and CR96127. The Court of Appeals reversed and remanded the CR96127 convictions in 1980 and when Adamson refused to testify for the new trial, the Court ruled that the plea agreement had been breached and reinstated the original Information charging open murder. In October 1980, he was found guilty of first degree murder and in November 1980, he was sentenced to death. He appealed, which affirmed the original conviction. In exchange for his testimony in related case CR1990-013262, he signed a Stipulation and Cooperation Agreement in December 1990 and in March 1995 he formally accepted the reinstated January 1977 plea agreement, which stated he was to serve a calendar term of 20 years and two months with an absolute release date of August 12, 1996. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. MAX ANDERSON DUNLAP AND JAMES ALBERT ROBISON, CR96127: This is the initial criminal case involving Max Anderson Dunlap and James Albert Robison. This case captured local and national attention due to the bombing death of investigative reporter Donald Bolles. Dunlap and Robison were charged in January 1977 with First Degree Murder and First Degree Conspiracy. They were found guilty on both counts in December 1977 and subsequently sentenced to confinement on the conspiracy charge and death on the murder charge. They appealed their convictions and in February 1980, the sentences were reversed and remanded back to Superior Court for new trials. This case is directly related to CR93385, CR1989-012123, and CR1990-013262. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. JAMES ALBERT ROBISON, CR1989-012123: This is the criminal case involving James Albert Robison. It is directly related to CR93385, CR96127, and CR1990-013262 which captured local and national attention concerning the bombing death of investigative reporter Donald Bolles. In January 1977, CR96127 was initiated charging Robison and co-defendant Max Anderson Dunlap with First Degree Murder. The subsequent convictions in that case were ultimately reversed and remanded by the Court of Appeals in 1980. In November 1989, this case was initiated charging Robison with First Degree Murder. CR1990-013262, initiated in December 1990 charging Robison and co-defendant Dunlap with First Degree Murder and Conspiracy to Commit Obstructing a Criminal Investigation or Prosecution, Influencing a Witness, Receiving a Bribe by a Witness, was heard as a severed case until March 1992, when the cases were ordered consolidated. Robison was acquitted on all charges in December 1993 and ordered released for these case numbers only. He remained incarcerated due to a conviction on an unrelated matter. This case may be viewed at CSC.

CR MISC, 2007 NT: In August 2007, Special Prosecutor Dennis Wilenchik issued grand jury subpoenas, originally conducted under grand jury file 430-GJ 97, compelling New Times Media, L.L.C. to release various documents concerning nineteen categories of information. The Court ordered the file unsealed in October 2007 stating the motions and hearings held to date revealed nothing about the grand jury proceedings. At a November 2007 hearing, the Maricopa County Attorney's Office (MCAO) disclosed that the special prosecutor created the subpoenas, without prior authorization from the grand jury, which were then stamped and issued by the Clerk of the Court. The MCAO further stated that the subpoenas were issued pursuant to A.R.S. §13-4071(B)(2), which does not require a request by the grand jury or notification to the foreman and presiding judge. The Court ruled that this was an incorrect reading of the A.R.S. paragraph further stating that the county attorney has no common law power to subpoena witnesses and documents before a grand jury without the prior consent of the grand jury. The Court ruled that the subpoenas were not validly issued. Grand Jury file 430-GJ97 was then designated as CR MISC 2007 NT with all original documents now retained under the new case designation. This case may be viewed at CSC.

IN THE MATTER OF PAUL L. GAULT AND MARJORIE GAULT, FATHER AND MOTHER OF GERALD FRANCIS GAULT, A MINOR, FOR A WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS, CV164769: Paul L. Gault and Marjorie Gault filed a writ of Habeas Corpus with the Arizona Supreme Court in August 1964 seeking release of their son, Gerald who was committed by the Gila County Juvenile Court to the Fort Grant Arizona Industrial School. The Gaults claimed they were not informed of any of their rights to include the right to counsel, to subpoena witnesses, and to a warning of the possible consequences of a finding of delinquency. Earlier that year, Gerald was found delinquent on a different charge and was informed that if he came before the court again and was found to be delinquent, he might be committed. The Gaults further contended that the state juvenile code was unconstitutional because it failed to provide for adequate notice of the alleged act of delinquency and failed to provide for proper notice of a juvenile hearing sufficiently in advance. The Arizona Supreme Court denied the petition and ordered the matter be heard by the Superior Court of Maricopa County. The Superior Court dismissed the petition, discharged the writ, and remanded Gerald to the appropriate authorities at the Fort Grant Arizona Industrial School. In November 1965, the Arizona Supreme Court affirmed the decision. The case was subsequently argued before the United States (US) Supreme Court during the 1966 October Term and in May 1967, the US Supreme Court reversed the judgment and remanded the case back to the Arizona Supreme Court. In June 1967, the Arizona Supreme Court ordered the Superior Court, based on the US Supreme Court's mandate, to hear the case again. The matter rested when Judge Hyder of the Maricopa County Superior Court indicated that he had no authority to mandate the Superior Court of Gila County. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. FALEH HASSAN ALMALEKI, CR2009-007938-001: This criminal case is involving Faleh Hassan Almaleki. In October 2009, Faleh Hassan Almaleki caused the death of his daughter and attempted to cause the death of Amal Khalef with his vehicle. The case received local and national media attention and was known as the "honor killing". In February 2011, Faleh Hassan Almaleki was convicted of court one for second-degree murder, count three for aggravated assault and count four and five for leaving the scene of an accident involving serious physical injury. The defendant filed an appeal and the Court of Appeals affirmed counts one, three and four and vacated count five. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. THOMAS IRVINE, SHUGHART THOMSON & KILROY, P.C. AND RICHARD ROMLEY, CV2002-033193: State of Arizona and County Attorney, Andrew Thomas, filed a petition for Writ of Quo Warranto alleging that the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors did not have a statutory authority to substitute the County Attorney's legal representation of the Board with outside legal counsel, Shughart Thomson & Kilroy. In December 2009, the case was voluntarily dismissed by the plaintiff without prejudice. This case is related to CV2008-033194. This case may be viewed at CSC.

ANDREW P. THOMAS, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS MARICOPA COUNTY ATTORNEY, JOSEPH ARPAIO, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS SHERIFF OF MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA VS. MARICOPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, AND ITS MEMBERS; FULTON BROCK, DON STAPLEY, ANDREW KUNASEK, MAX WILSON, AND MARY ROSE WILCOX, IN THEIR OFFICIAL CAPACITIES AS MARICOPA COUNTY SUPERVISORS, MARICOPA COUNTY, CV2008-033194: In December 2008, Andrew Thomas filed a complaint alleging that the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors did not have legal authority to substitute the County Attorneys legal representation of the Board or the County with outside legal counsel. In September 2009, the court entered a judgment in favor of the Defendants. The Plaintiff appealed to the Court of Appeals. In October 2010, the Court of Appeals affirmed that the Board may, on its own initiative, employ outside counsel to represent and advise the Board whether the County Attorney has a conflict of interest with the Board and if it is appropriate to file actions for declaratory judgment. The Court of Appeals also affirmed that the Board may divest the County Attorney of his duty to represent the County on a case-by-case basis when the County Attorney is unavailable due to a conflict of interest. The case was remanded back to the Superior Court to determine which specific matters have a conflict of interest. A stipulation for dismissal was filed and the case was dismissed in February 2011. This case is related to CV2008-033193. This case may be viewed at CSC.

JOSEPH ARPAIO, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS MARICOPA COUNTY SHERIFF AND ANDREW P. THOMAS, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS MARICOPA COUNTY ATTORNEY VS. MARICOPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND ITS MEMBERS: FULTON BROCK, DON STAPLEY, ANDREW KUNASEK, MAX WILSON, AND MARY ROSE WILCOX, IN THEIR OFFICIAL CAPACITIES AS MARICOPA COUNTY SUPERVISORS, MARICOPA COUNTY, JANICE K. BREWER, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA, CV2009-006709: Maricopa County Sheriff Joseph Arpaio and Maricopa County Attorney Andrew Thomas filed this complaint to reinstate funds encumbered and transferred to the State by the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors. House Bill 2275, Laws 2008, Chapter 288 of the 48th Legislature, Second Session was signed into law on June 27, 2008, and directed that Maricopa County transfer \$24,168,400 to the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System Administration. Judgment was entered on June 17, 2009 on all claims in favor of Defendants and against Plaintiff on June 19, 2009. An Order of Mandate and a copy of the Opinion affirming the superior court's judgment was issued by the Court of Appeals and filed by this office on February 1, 2011. This case may be viewed at CSC.

CHARLES HOSKINS, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS TREASURER OF MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA VS. MARICOPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, AND ITS MEMBERS; FULTON BROCK, DON STAPLEY, ANDY KUNASEK, MAX WILSON, AND MARY ROSE WILCOX, IN THEIR OFFICIAL CAPACITIES AS MARICOPA COUNTY SUPERVISORS, CV2008-022513: Maricopa County Treasurer Charles Hoskins filed this complaint for declaratory and injunctive relief in response to the seizure by the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors of the Treasure's IT Department and transfer to the Office of Enterprise Technology. This case was dismissed on January 6, 2010 pursuant to a stipulation to dismiss filed on December 31, 2009. This case can be viewed at CSC.

JOSEPH ARPAIO, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS MARICOPA COUNTY SHERIFF VS. MARICOPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND ITS MEMBERS: FULTON BROCK, DONALD STAPLEY, MAX WILSON, ANDREW KUNASEK, AND MARY ROSE WILCOX, IN THEIR OFFICIAL CAPACITIES AS MARICOPA COUNTY SUPERVISORS, STATE OF ARIZONA AND MARICOPA COUNTY, CV2010-015986: Maricopa County Sheriff Joseph Arpaio filed this special action complaint for declaratory and injunctive relief in response to the issuance by the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors of subpoenas under the authority of A.R.S. § 11-218. This case is connected to the criminal indictments filed against Supervisors Donald Stapley (CR2009-007891) and Mary Rose Wilcox (CR2009-007892). Judgment was entered in favor of the Defendants and against the Plaintiff on June 25, 2010. The judgment was appealed by the Plaintiff, and the appeal was ultimately dismissed upon motion of the Plaintiff. This case may be viewed at CSC.

JOSEPH ARPAIO, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS MARICOPA COUNTY SHERIFF VS. MARICOPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND ITS MEMBERS; FULTON BROCK, DON STAPLEY, ANDREW KUNASEK, MAX WILSON, AND MARY ROSE WILCOX, IN THEIR OFFICIAL CAPACITIES AS MARICOPA COUNTY SUPERVISORS, MARICOPA COUNTY, SUPERIOR COURT OF STATE, IN AND FOR MARICOPA COUNTY, CV2009-013965: Maricopa County Sheriff Joseph Arpaio filed this complaint to obtain an order for transfer of management control of Zone 2 from the Board of Supervisors to the Sheriff, including transfer of supervision of OET employees who work on Zone 2. Zone 2 is a secure criminal justice network used to access criminal justice databases, including NCIC. Citing conflicts of interest, the Plaintiff also requested transfer of this case to the Superior Court in another county. Venue was transferred to Pima County on September 3, 2009. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. TAMMI PETERS SMITH, CR2010-101760-002: This is the criminal case involving Tammi Peters Smith and was known both locally and nationally as the "Baby Gabriel" case. In February 2010, Smith was indicted on two counts: Conspiracy To Commit Custodial Interference and Forgery. In May 2012, she was found guilty on both counts and subsequently was placed on probation in July 2012. Smith appealed the convictions and in April 2014, the Court of Appeals affirmed her conviction and probation term for conspiracy to commit custodial interference, but vacated her conviction and probation term for forgery. This case may be viewed at CSC.

DR SANDRA DOWLING, IN HER OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA VS. DON STAPLEY, FULTON BROCK, ANDREW KUNASEK, MARY ROSE WILCOX, AND MAX W. WILSON IN THEIR OFFICIAL CAPACITIES AS MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA, LC2006-000370-001: Sandra Dowling filed a Complaint in June 2006 alleging that the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors did not have legal authority to adopt a resolution that would close the Maricopa Regional School District and accommodation schools for homeless children. She said that the Superintendent of Schools has sole discretion to establish an accommodation school. In June 2006, the Court awarded summary judgment in favor of Sandra Dowling. The judgment ordered that the resolution was void because the Board of Supervisors exceeded its legal authority in adopting the resolution and that the superintendent is vested with the power to establish accommodation schools. The Board appealed the ruling. In December 2003, the Court of Appeals affirmed the Court's decision that the resolution was void due to the Board not having the authority to unilaterally declare no services pursuant to §15-308(B) when no monies were needed; however, the Court of Appeals said that the two parties must work collaboratively when monies are needed. The Superintendent has permissive authority to establish accommodation school services and the Board has the authority over the funding and an intergovernmental agreement is necessary. This case may be viewed at CSC.

JOSEPH ARPAIO, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS MARICOPA COUNTY SHERIFF VS. MARICOPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND ITS MEMBERS: FULTON BROCK, DON STAPLEY, ANDREW KUNASEK, MAX WILSON, AND MARY ROSE WILCOX, IN THEIR OFFICIAL CAPACITIES AS MARICOPA COUNTY SUPERVISORS, AND MARICOPA COUNTY, CV2010-020273: Maricopa County Sheriff Joseph Arpaio filed this complaint for declaratory and injunctive relief to secure a declaration that the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors and its in-house law firms have a conflict of interest with the Sheriff, and to prevent the Board from selecting the Sheriff's legal counsel due to this conflict of interest. This case is connected to the criminal indictments filed against Supervisors Donald Stapley (CR2009-007891) and Mary Rose Wilcox (CR2009-007892). This case was dismissed on May 12, 2011 pursuant to a stipulated notice of dismissal filed January 26, 2011. This case may be viewed at CSC.

ANDREW P. THOMAS VS. MARICOPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, LC2010-000090-001: County Attorney, Andrew Thomas, filed a petition for Writ of Mandamus alleging the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors refused to approve the appointment of special prosecutors to prevent criminal prosecution of its Board members. In March 2010, the case was assigned to Judge Andrew W. Gould from Yuma County. In April 2010, the matter was settled and the case was dismissed with prejudice. This case may be viewed at CSC.

LISA M. AUBUCHON AND PETER R. PESTALOZZI, WIFE AND HUSBAND, AND DAVID HENDERSHOTT AND ANNA HENDERSHOTT, HUSBAND AND WIFE VS. SUPERVISOR FULTON BROCK, SUPERVISOR ANDREW KUNASEK, ANDREW KUNASEK AND KIMBERLY KUNASEK, HUSBAND AND WIFE, SUPERVISOR DONALD STAPLEY, SUPERVISOR MARY ROSE WILCOX, SUPERVISOR MAX WILSON, ET AL., CV2011-014754: Lisa M. Aubuchon and David Hendershott, former employees of the Maricopa County Attorney's Office and the Maricopa County Sheriff's Department respectively, filed this case against multiple state and county officials claiming various acts and omissions of the defendants resulted in the destruction of the plaintiffs' reputations and livelihoods. This case is connected to the criminal indictments filed against Supervisors Donald Stapley (CR2009-007891) and Mary Rose Wilcox (CR2009-007892). The complaint was dismissed on May 4, 2012 for lack of a legal or factual basis, and attorney's fees were later awarded to the defendants. The case was dismissed on April 4, 2013. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. GARY DOUGLAS PEEK, CR2002-093788: This is the criminal case involving Gary Douglas Peek. Peek was indicted in June 2002 and upon accepting a plea agreement, was sentenced in February 2003 on two amended counts of Attempted Child Molestation. He received a 10 year sentence on the first count and lifetime probation on the second count to begin after his release from prison. Peek appealed the lifetime probation and in December 2008, the Court of Appeals vacated the second count stating the statutes in effect when the crimes were committed did not authorize lifetime probation for attempted child molestation. The case was remanded back to the Superior Court and in March 2009, Peek was resentenced to five years' probation on count two to begin upon his absolute discharge from prison. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE, EX REL. ATTORNEY GENERAL TERRY GODDARD VS. WESTERN UNION FINANCIAL SERVICES, INC, CV2010-005807: In February 2010, a Settlement Agreement between the State and Western Union Financial Services was approved by the Court announcing Western Union would fund an extensive anti-money laundering undertaking in Arizona as well as participating surrounding states. The original agreement would be in effect for 41 months after implementation. The Order also approved the creation of an independent Monitor, who would evaluate and improve Western Union's anti-money laundering efforts. An Amended Settlement Agreement was approved by the Court in January 2014. In March 2014, the amended agreement was modified stating the participating states may execute separate agreements with Western Union regarding the provision of data for transactions. The modification also extended the agreement for an additional five years. This case may be viewed at CSC.

JOSEPH M. ARPAIO, IN HIS OFFICIAL CAPACITY AS MARICOPA COUNTY SHERIFF VS. MARICOPA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, AND ITS MEMBERS, FULTON BROCK, DON STAPLEY, ANDREW KUNASEK, MAX WILSON, AND MARY ROSE WILCOX, IN THEIR OFFICIAL CAPACITIES AS MARICOPA COUNTY SUPERVISORS, MARICOPA COUNTY, CV2009-010400: Maricopa County Sheriff Joseph Arpaio filed a Complaint in April 2009 claiming a directive approved by the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors (Board) regarding public records requests—specifically the use of an “Internal Information Request” form—violated Arizona's public records statutes. County elected and/or appointed officials were now required to use this form when requesting information from another department. An Amended Complaint was filed in May 2009. The focus of this case then shifted to a September 2009 videotape detailing the arrest of County Supervisor Don Stapley, which occurred in a County parking garage. The Sheriff's Office, using the Internal Information Request form, requested a copy of the videotape. They were told because of security concerns—in particular about the garage itself—the information was not subject to a request, but they were allowed to view the information at the Protective Services offices. The Board also filed a Motion for Temporary Restraining Order and Preliminary Injunction. This motion and subsequent motions and pleadings related to this motion were ordered sealed by the Court. In November 2009, the court granted the Board's motion ruling that the release of the tape posed a threat to the security of persons using the garage; the Sheriff's Office filed a Notice of Appeal. In February 2010, the Court formally signed the Order granting the Board's motion. The Sheriff's Office filed an appeal of the order as well. The Court of Appeals dismissed the appeal, with prejudice, in October 2010. This case may be viewed at CSC.

IN RE: HON BARBARA MUNDELL, PRESIDING JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA, IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF MARICOPA, CV2010-003791: Barbara Mundell, the Presiding Judge of the Maricopa County Superior Court, filed a Petition for Special Action with the Court of Appeals in December 2009 to quash a search warrant or stay its execution. After a stay was granted in regards to CR2009-008332 (State v. Donahoe), Judge Mundell then filed a Notice of Stay in January 2010 claiming her counsel and the Maricopa County Attorney's Office (MCAO) had yet to meet as directed by a visiting judge in regards to resolving any issues with respect to the warrant. The MCAO stated in their Response, also filed in January 2010, that the attorneys did in fact meet telephonically in December 2009 and attached an exhibit summarizing their meeting. In February 2010, an Order was signed directing the Clerk's Office to assign a case number to this matter. This case is historically significant based on local public interest, and was part of an inter-county conflict occurring between 2008 and 2012. This case may be viewed at CSC.

GARY DONAHOE AND CHERIE DONAHOE, HUSBAND AND WIFE VS. SHERIFF JOSEPH ARPAIO AND AVA ARPAIO, HUSBAND AND WIFE, ANDREW THOMAS AND ANNE THOMAS, HUSBAND AND WIFE, ET AL., CV2010-032844: Gary Donahoe, a Maricopa County Superior Court Judge filed a Complaint in November 2010 alleging twelve violations of 42 U.S.C. §1983 and of Arizona Law to include Abuse of Process, Defamation, Libel, and/or False Light Invasion of Privacy, Racketeering Violations, and Gross Negligence. In December 2010, the case was then assigned to Pima County for judicial assignment by the Arizona Supreme Court Chief Justice. Later that month, a Notice of Removal to U.S. District Court was filed by the defendants. This case is considered historically significant based on the interest to the public, both locally and nationally, and was part of a tumultuous inter-county conflict occurring between 2008 and 2012. This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. ALESSANDRO GARCIA, CR1992-002096: This is the criminal case involving Alessandro Garcia and was known both locally and internationally as the "Buddhist Temple Murders". In March 1992, Garcia was charged with several counts to include Murder First Degree and Armed Robbery. After signing a plea agreement and in exchange for his testimonies in related case CR1991-001232 and CR1993-91352, an unrelated case, Garcia pled guilty to nine counts of first degree murder and one count of armed burglary. In July 1994, he was sentenced to life for each murder count, to be served consecutively, and 21 years on the burglary count, also to be served consecutively upon completion of the other sentences, This case may be viewed at CSC.

STATE VS. ELIZABETH JOHNSON, CR2010-101760-001: This is the criminal case involving Elizabeth Johnson and was known both locally and nationally as the "Baby Gabriel" case. In January 2010, Johnson was indicted on four counts: Kidnapping, Child Abuse, Conspiracy to Commit Custodial Interference, and Custodial Interference. The Court dismissed the Child Abuse charge and in October 2012, a jury found her guilty on the remaining counts, although reducing the Kidnapping charge to the lesser Unlawful Imprisonment. In December 2012, Johnson was sentenced to 1.75 years and 3.5 years respectively concerning Counts 1 and 4, and regarding Count 3, she was placed on probation for four years, which was to begin after her release from prison. This case may be viewed at CSC.

HASH DIVORCES

HASH DIVORCES: In 1973, upon the death of attorney Vivian L. Hash, it was discovered that he had retained a large quantity of divorce decrees in his personal law office instead of filing them with the Clerk of the Superior Court because he was attempting to collect his legal fees. It was found that in each of the cases a trial was held, a divorce was granted, and a divorce decree was signed by the trial judge. An order was filed in P67632 ordering that a judgment be entered, *nunc pro tunc*, in each of the divorce cases found in Hash's office, with certain exception. Said judgment was to be entered as of the date that the trial judge signed each divorce case. In the event that a decree is not found when researching divorces for this time period, check with the following list to determine if the divorce is one of the ones whose decrees Hash retained. Decrees for these cases are on microfilm.

HASH DIVORCE EXCEPTION CASES: In the case of Alander v. Alander, # 40725, both parties appeared on February 21, 1973 and disclosed that they had requested the decedent not file the decree because they had reconciled. In the cases of Sullivan v. Sullivan, # 8577, Stewart v. Stewart, #18073, and Moody v. Moody, #6450, the court found that the plaintiffs in each case had requested the decedent not file the decrees and that Mr. Hash had advised these clients their divorces would not be valid until the decrees were filed.

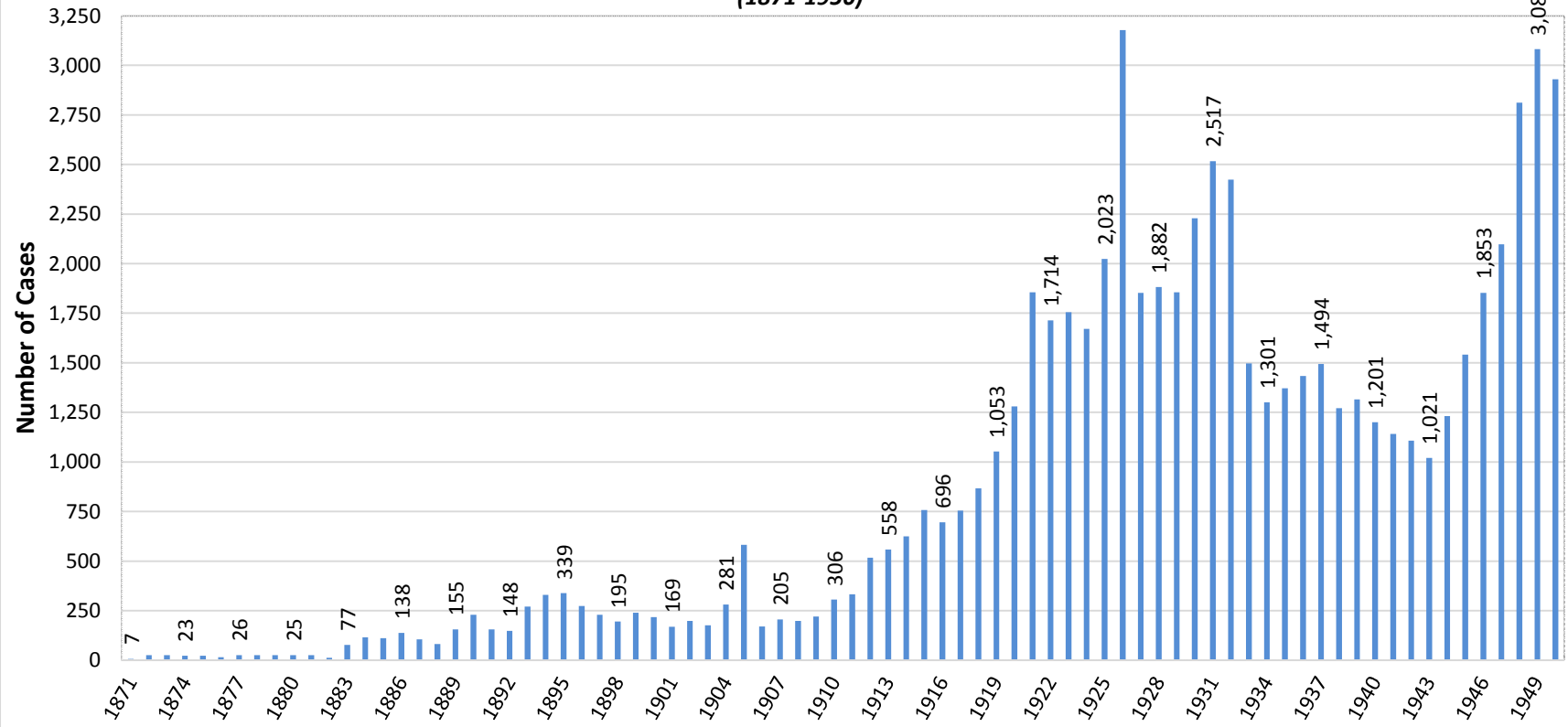

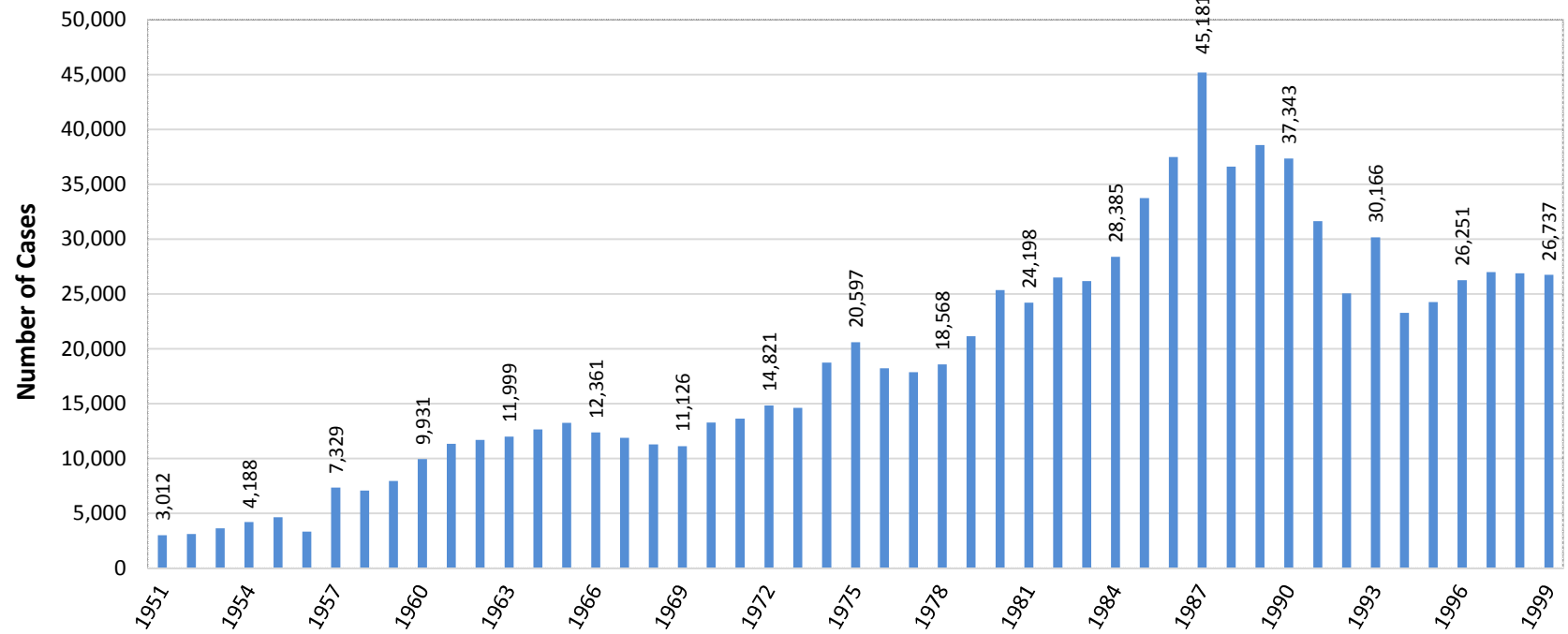

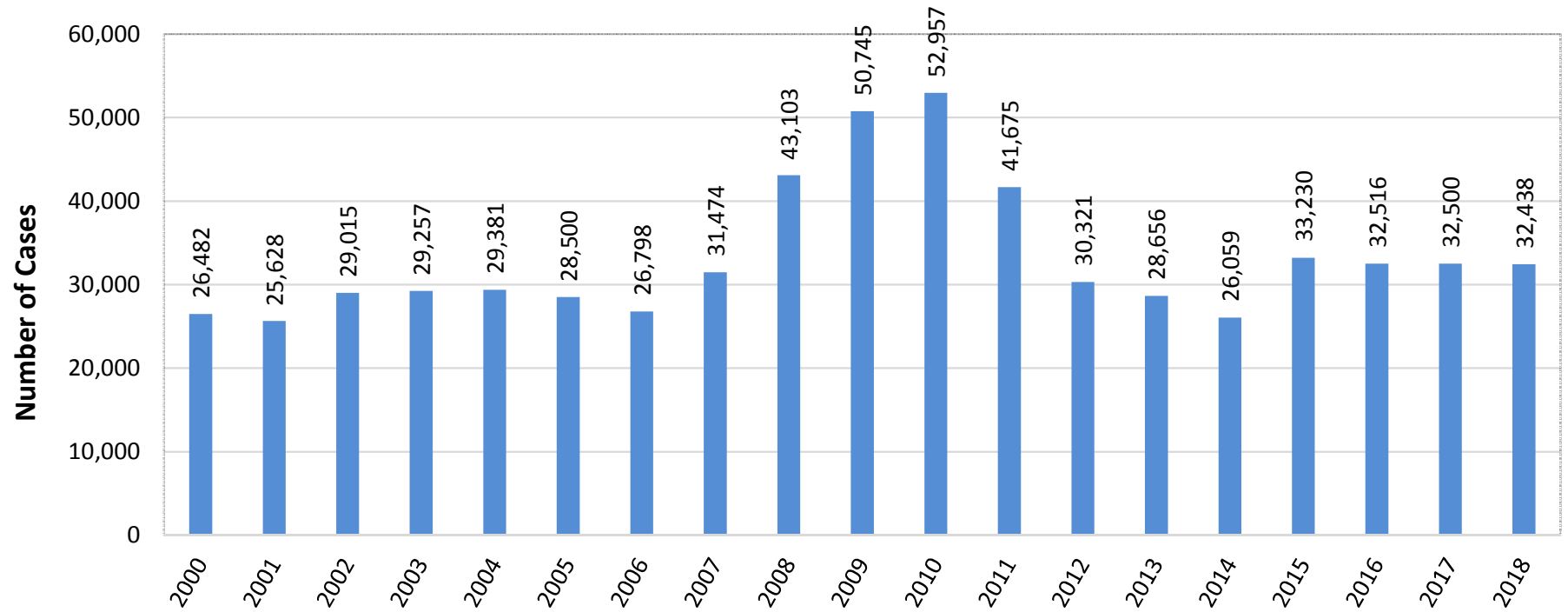

Civil Cases Filed (1951-1999)



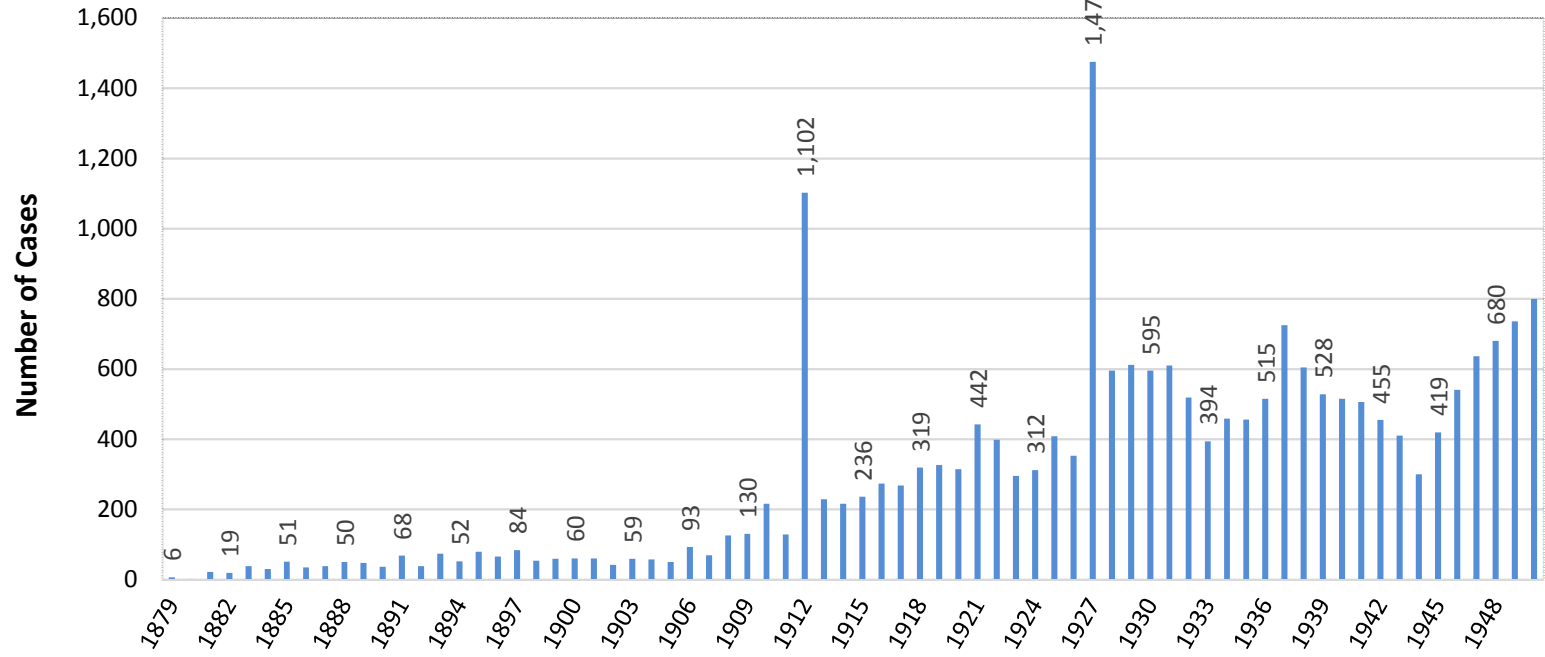

Civil Cases Filed (2000-Present)



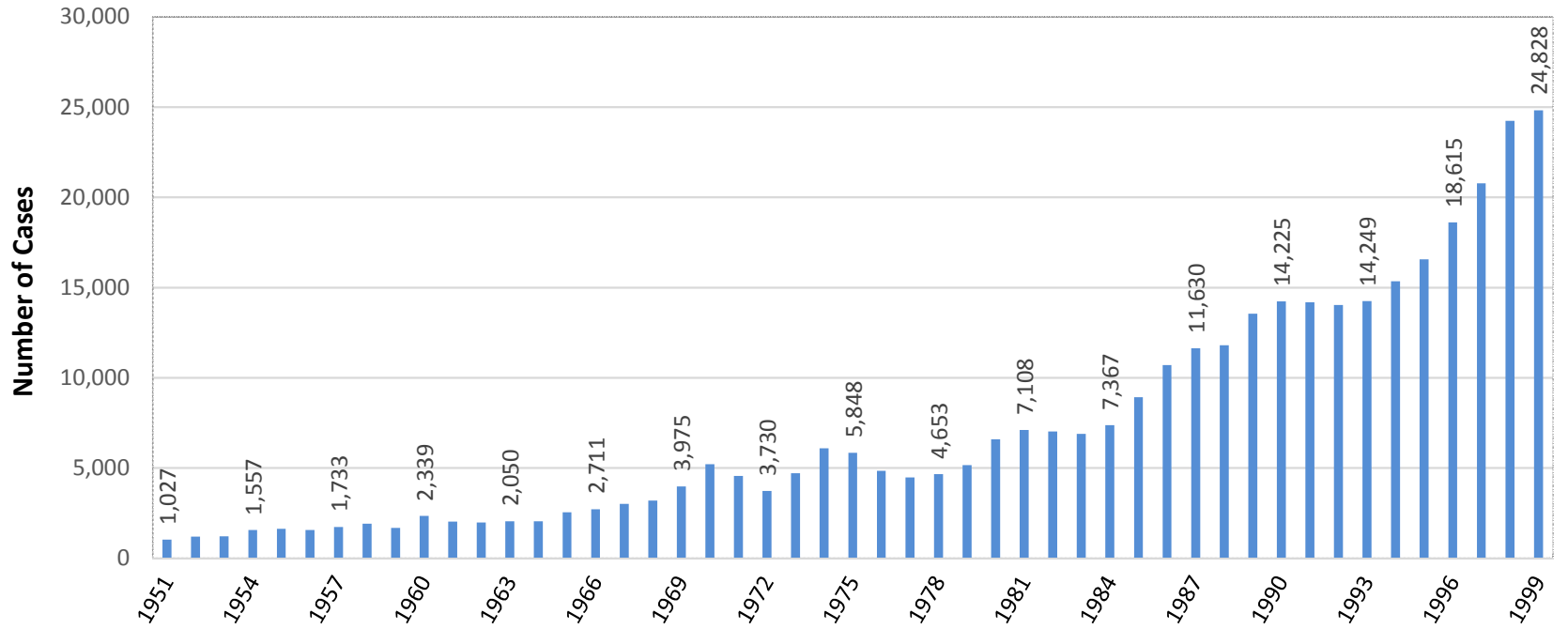

Criminal Cases Filed (1879-1950)



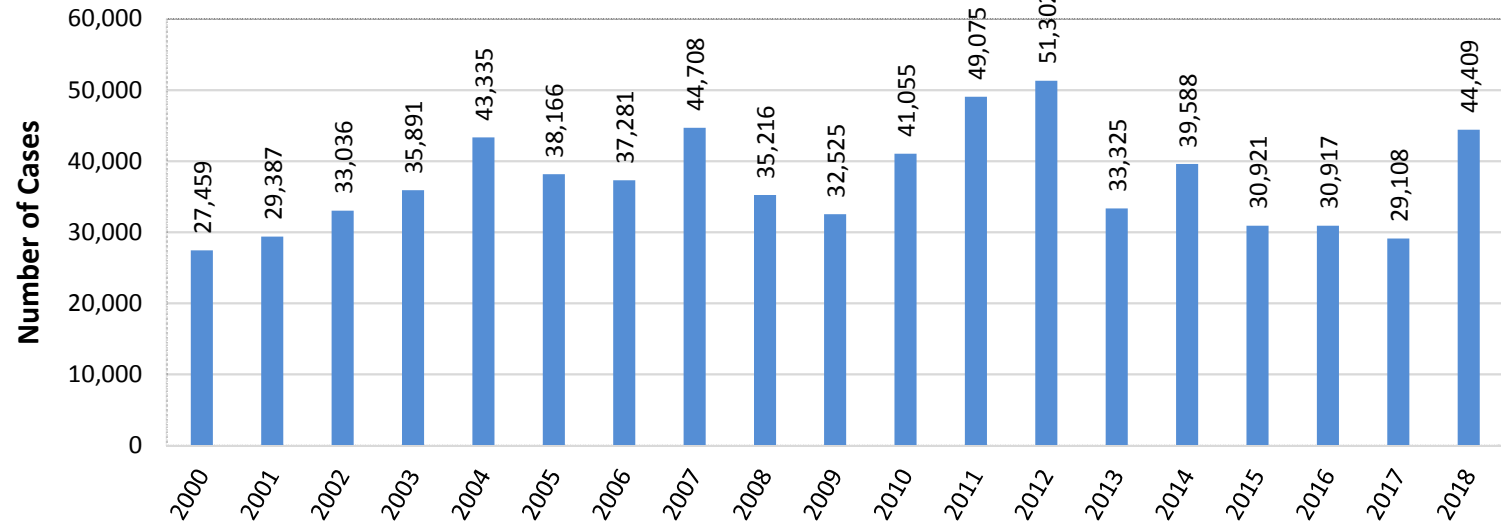

(1951-1999)***



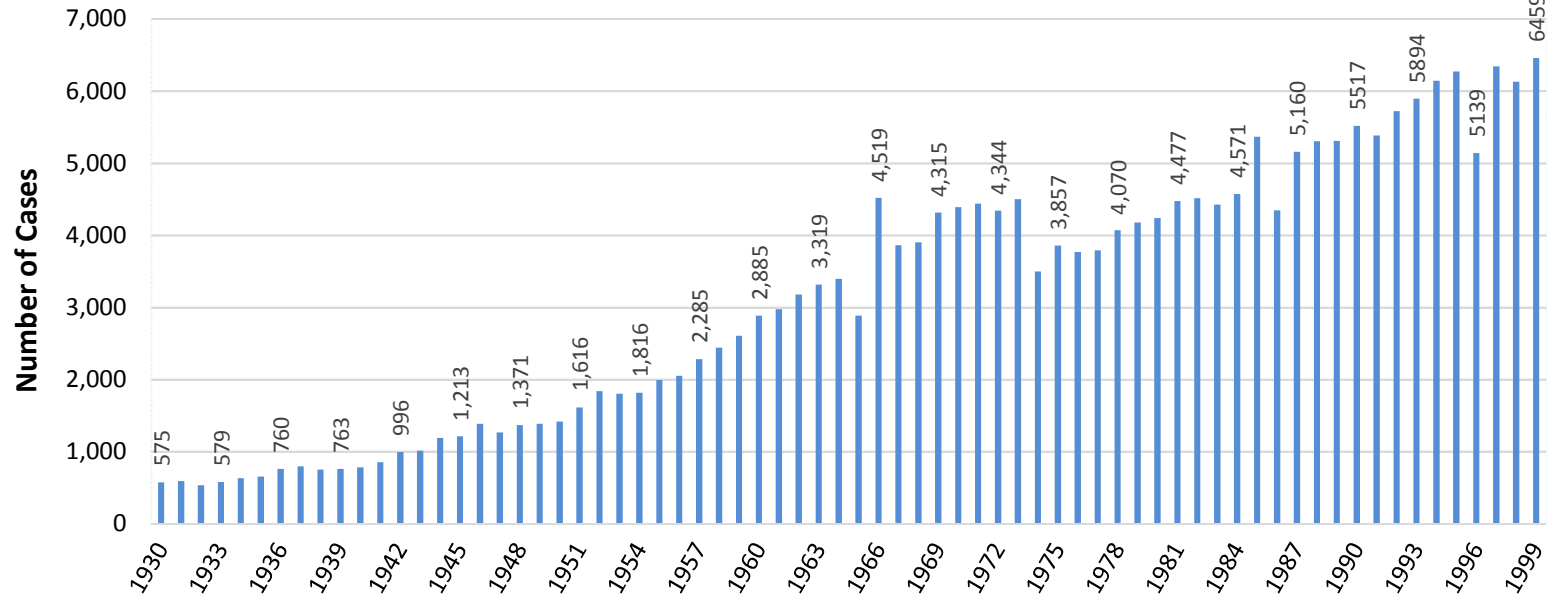

Criminal Cases Filed (2000-Present)



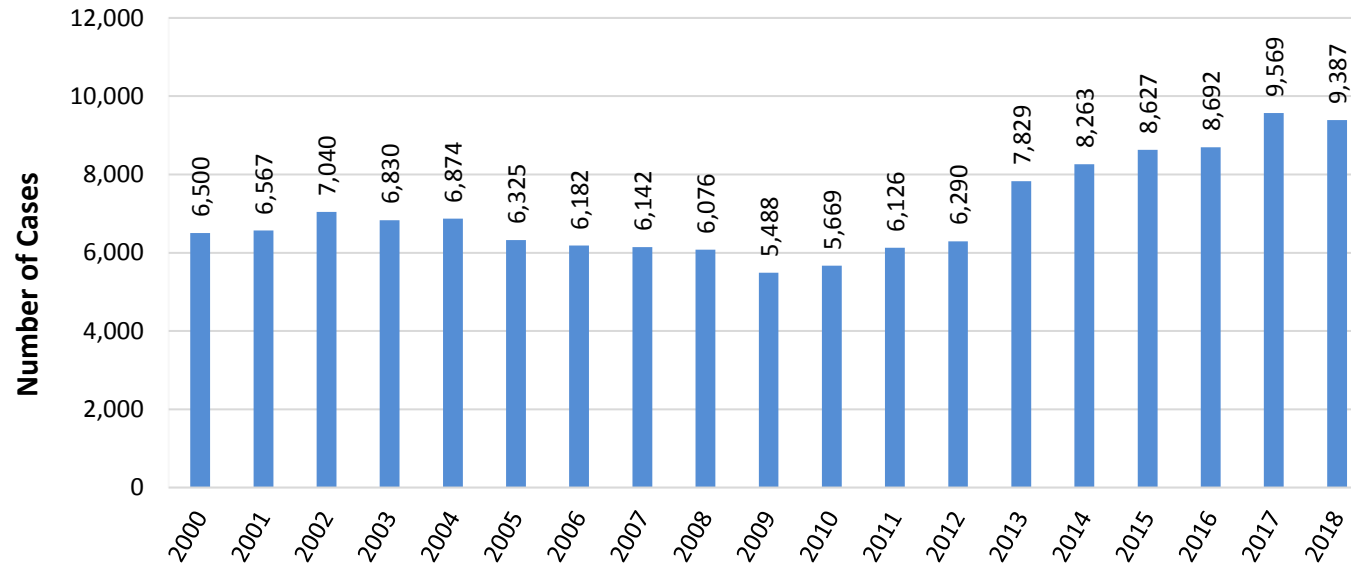

*The final recorded number for marriage licenses under the Book and Page System is 98M15873. Beginning in October 1998, the Book and Page System of recording was replaced with the Marriage License Abstract System, now known as ML2000, in which each license is recorded by its six digit identification number. Licenses are filmed monthly in numerical but not consecutive order; therefore, an exact count of licenses recorded after September 1998 is not the difference between the beginning and ending case numbers. Rather, it is reflected by the total number of entries recorded in the ML2000 database. The beginning number is not necessarily the first number issued for that year; the numbers posted are the first and last number listed on that specific yearly report. From 1871 through 1978, licenses were recorded in Docket Books. A marriage license number for that period consists of the docket book number and the page on which it was recorded, e.g., Book 10 Page 1234. Beginning in 1979, licenses were no longer recorded in Docket Books. The book number was changed to identify the year the license was recorded and the page number was changed to reflect the consecutive number given to the marriage license, e.g., 7900001. In 1980 an "M" was added to the number to distinguish it from other categories with the same numeric format, e.g., 80M00001. All marriage affidavits from 1884 through 1983 are on film, in alphabetical order by female maiden name. This includes affidavits for licenses which were returned and recorded, as well as for those which were unused and never recorded. Affidavits from 1984 to present are filmed with the corresponding recorded certificates or licenses. Unused affidavits from 1984 to present are filmed on a separate roll, alphabetically by male surname. The Clerk of Superior Court authorized the Litchfield Park City Court Clerk to issue marriage licenses on July 25, 2004. The Litchfield Park City Court Clerk's Office received marriage licenses in November 2004, numbers 383301-383382 and again in April 2006, numbers 415273-415372 for issuance. Of the total number of marriage licenses received by the Litchfield Park City Court Clerk (182 marriage licenses), 82 licenses were issued and 57 licenses have been recorded. As of April 13, 2006, the Litchfield Park City Court Clerk stopped issuing marriage licenses. Per A.R.S. 25-127, the Clerk of Superior Court authorized the Youngtown City Court Clerk to issue marriage licenses on October 15, 2008. The Federal Court ruled that Arizona's constitutional and statutory definitions of marriage as one man and one woman is unconstitutional under the United States Constitution. Effective October 17, 2014. Clerks of Superior Court around the state began issuing marriage licenses regardless of the applicants' gender.							

The Juvenile Records section that follows appeared in the Case History Index for the first time with the 2003 edition. While Juvenile Adoption records information have been indexed back to 1934, all other categories have been indexed only back to 1968. Records for Juvenile case categories prior to 1988 are currently on microfilm. The Clerk's Office intends to add more index information on records prior to 1988 to forthcoming editions of the Case History Index.

All requests for access to juvenile records must go through the Juvenile Division of the Clerk of the Court for the reason that most juvenile records, files, exhibits and transcripts are confidential. Only the delinquency legal file of a juvenile born after January 1, 1977 is open to public inspection.
