### **Outreach Department**

The Outreach Department at MSD offers a wide range of programs and services for deaf and hard of hearing children from birth to age 21, their parents, and their school districts throughout Missouri. We serve as the State clearing house for information and resources on Deaf and Hard of Hearing Education.

**Families First:** Early intervention program providing free in-home training and resources to

families of deaf and hard of hearing children from birth to age 8.

Deaf Education Consulting: Free consultations, in-service trainings, and other services for local school districts serving deaf and hard of hearing students from preschool through high school.



**Audiology:** Free services for children from birth to age 21. Free consultations and in-service trainings for parents, school districts, and other organizations.

Assistive Technology: Individual and group FM systems for lease to schools. Free hearing aid selection counseling for purchases. Free hearing aid loans for students who qualify based on financial need.

Speech-Language Assessment and Consulting: Free speech and language assessments for deaf and hard of hearing students. Free consultations and in-service trainings for parents, school districts, and other organizations.

American Sign Language Classes and Resources: Free classes at MSD for families of deaf and hard of hearing children. Information on other ASL classes are located on MSD's website.

## Academic, Vocational, and Life Skills Instruction

MSD educates deaf and hard of hearing K-12 students



at no cost to school districts or families. Education programs are tailored to the individual students to help them realize their potential, achieve their personal goals, and prepare them to go on to higher education or vocational training.

#### **MSD Teachers:**

- ◆ Follow a bilingual approach, teaching both ASL and English.
- Offer college preparatory curriculum and multiple classes in vocational skill development including automotive technology.
- Successfully teach students with limited language skills to have meaningful communication.

### Day and Residential Options



MSD provides day transportation for local students.

Students from other areas of the state live on campus during the school week and go home most weekends. MSD provides transportation between campus and designated points across the state.

Residential students spend their after school time on homework, recreational activities, and talking to friends. Special activities may include field trips, camping trips, and other outings.
