Town Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Eaton in the County of Carroll in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Odd Fellows' Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
4. To see if the town will vote to adopt State Aid on Highways and Bridges and make appropriations for the same.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for control of White Pine Blister Rust in said town.
6. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to hire money to pay on debts of the town.
7. To see if the town will vote to have the Tax Commissioner make a new Valuation of the Real Estate in the town, for this year's taxation and raise money for same.
8. To see if the town will vote to have the Library moved from the present place.
9. To see if the town will vote to buy the part of the Town Lot owned by the Odd Fellows, and make appropriations for same.
10. To act upon any other business that may come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board:

I herewith submit my fifth annual report, it being the twelfth in the series of such reports.

You should be proud of the Snowville School. It is having one hundred and eighty days under the wise care of a competent and experienced teacher who is doing much for the boys and girls. Classes are well handled. Health conditions are near one hundred per cent. Noon lunch is prepared for those who are obliged to remain at school. The housekeeping is quite a model of neatness and good taste.

By the kind generosity of Mr. Evans and Mr. Houghton manual training equipment was donated and now boys and girls learn to do with hands as well as study with mind.

The new blackboards are a fine addition to the school equipment. The work is easier for both teacher and pupils. The electric lights are a great help especially on the dark days during the fall and winter. The sink is a much-needed addition, being very useful in cleaning the dishes of the noon lunch. The school is well equipped and good work is being done.

A class of six graduated last June. We now have eleven pupils in high school: Bernice White, Allan Kenneson, Lawrence Bean, Robert Bean, Woodrow Allard, Eleanor Young, Myrtle DeWitt, Florence Head, Doris Nelson, Frances Sanborn and Dorothy French.

The physical welfare of the children is being looked after by the school nurse, Miss Ruth Langille. Special attention has been given to correcting dental defects. A valuable health record is being kept by the teacher and pupils.

Parents and citizens should be much more frequent visitors at the school to see the class work and observe the special activities. Evening gatherings are now possible since we have the lights.

Eaton is paying elementary tuition for three pupils attending the Nickerson School in Madison and for four attending the East Brownfield School in Maine.

For the year ending June 30, 1931, our school had an average attendance of twenty, an average membership of twenty-one and a per cent. of 95.2.
