Superintendent's Report

To the School Board:

I herewith submit my first annual report, it being

the eighth in the series of such reports.

Only one school is open in Eaton this year—that at Snowville where twenty-eight pupils are enrolled. Three children were left at South Eaton and these are now conveyed to the Nickerson School in Madison. Four children attend school in Brownfield, Maine.

The school at Snowville is doing well under the care of Miss Alice E. Peaslee, a graduate of Plymouth Normal School. Two boys who graduated from this school last June are attending KennettHigh School in Conway—Allan S. Kenneson and Lawrence E. Nelson. It is encouraging to see our graduates going on to higher schools. Next June we shall graduate another class

from the eighth grade.

The school this year has shown a live spirit in building up its general activities. An entertainment was given in the fall and a goodly sum realized. Equipment was provided for healthful exercise on the playground and for a warm noon lunch during the cold weather. Through the loan of a victrola it is possible to have corrective physical drills which are very beneficial. The music adds much to the interest in these exercises. We much appreciate the loan of the victrola and the piano.

Eaton has been very fortunate in joining with other towns in the employment of a school nurse, Miss Marjorie Buswell, who began work in October. The usual examination was made and reported. More special work will be undertaken in the spring. Miss Buswell makes her headquarters in North Conway.

For the year ending June 30, 1926, our schools

showed an average attendance of 32, an average mem-

bership of 34 and a percent of 95.

Our school property should be kept in good condition and an appropriation should be available for repairs and equipment. For equipment we need to consider installation of a ventilating heater in the Snow-ville building. For repairs we need to attend to the minor repairs, paint the Snowville building and fix the roof at South Eaton.

Transportation is a major problem in Eaton but it is being handled with reasonable economy and effi-

ciency.

Trained teachers are now available for all schools in New Hampshire. Normal school enrollment is now four times what it was ten years ago. The pupils generally attend well where a trained teacher is in charge. With a trained teacher and a learning pupil, the value of the school depends on the length of the learning period in hours, days and weeks. It means that there must be daily, unbroken school sessions. Some districts are now having a year of 360 actual half days. Last year eleven districts in the state had 360 to 368 half days. Twelve had 354 to 359 half days. Eaton had 348.

Every school in New Hampshire had at least 36 weeks last year, while in 1919 scores of towns had 30 weeks or less. Probably no other state in the Union can boast of every child having an opportunity to attend school 36 weeks during the year.

In conclusion I wish to thank the school board,

teacher, pupils and citizens for cordial support.
