NARRATIVE STILL LIFE PAINTING

For assignment 2, we will be doing a narrative sitll life painting. Try to keep your arrangement 3-4 objects and consider the color schemes we covered in the presentation.

Try to paint 1 glass object, 1 fruit and one other object. Do your best to tell a story, it could be a cocktail, or perhaps something as simple as lemonade. Below, my concept is Limoncello, a traditional italian drink make of lemons. This helps to find props and build a story in my work. The yellow-blue color scheme was a nice contrasting color scheme. The orange, yellow and green objects are analogous and help unite the objects.





CREATE A SOLID DRAWING

For the painting in my demonstration, I drew it first on a piece of paper and transferred it to a panel. This is an indirect way of painting. Do what you feel will get you the best results, direct or indirect.

Here is my the drawing I used to do the painting. Keep in mind that the two most imporant things on a painting are a drawing and the value structrue. Good color can not save a bad drawing!




