You don't need me to tell you about the film titled Man Eater. You already know a great deal about it -- even if you haven't seen it. First, you know that any money making product is going to attract cheap imitators, trying to cash in on a fad. And Man Eater is an unabashed, cheap imitation of Jaws. Additionally, since Jaws is now the top box office attraction in film history, Man Eater is only the first of several upcoming imitations. You know that.

You also know that cheap imitations are never as good as the original product. For one thing, the novelty of the idea and concept has been exhausted by the first-comer. Also, to cash in on a fad, you have to "strike while the iron is hot," as they say. Therefore, the imitation has to be made quickly, very quickly, and it always shows. The script is hackneyed, the underwater footage is inferior (if not stolen from other films) and the types of actors and directors

that will associate themselves with a blatant imitation are of a calibre that insures that the final product will, indeed, be a boring, colorless, time-filler. A "cheap thrill" with "no frills." You know that.

So even without seeing it, you know that Man Eater is not going to be half as good as Jaws. But, on the other hand, there are many who will go see Man Eater, feeling that if it is only half as good as Jaws it will be worth seeing.

So off we all go, with half-high hopes. But even with our hopes only half-high, we are always disappointed. We always feel cheated as we leave the theater. It's always worse than we had feared. Always.

But, with times depressed, we will go see almost anything that offers an escape. We'll try almost any venture. There's no blame in that.

But there's one thing about Man Eater that oversteps even lowered levels of decency — its advertising campaign. The film's commercials and newspaper ads boast that a stuntman being filmed underwater during Man Eater shooting was actually attacked by a shark. Mauled, mangled and, finally, shredded by a pair of jaws. If the ad is false, capitalizing on a lie is corrupt. But worse, if the ad is true, capitalizing on a human tragedy is disgusting animalism. Does greed know no bounds?

So based on what you know about Man Eater, even before you see it, and acknowledging its sickening Madison Avenue decadence, let's let the producers know what we think of Man Eater. Stay home. Or spend your money elsewhere. I did.

For the first time ever, I feel morally justified in telling you not to see a certain film — although I have not seen the film myself. I just couldn't bring myself to attend. A person can only stoop so low.



ANSWERS BY ADAM

Dear Adam.

I go to a small, rather conservative college here in Abilene. I believe strongly in the gay rights movement and have considered, along with two friends, wearing "gay liberation" buttons to class. At a big school like Texas or Texas Tech, I know I could get away with it. But at a small college, I'm not sure. Is it legal to wear such buttons or armbands, regardless of what the school officials think?

Paul E., Abilene, Tex.

Dear Paul.

After checking around, I was finally able to locate a definitive answer to your question. According to the national office of the American Civil Liberties Union, the answer is "yes." They replied that, "The wearing of various items such as armbands, buttons, etc., that have symbolic meaning, is a form of free speech called 'symbolic speech.' Symbolic speech is an act that, although not necessarily exclusively speech, is nonetheless a public expression of belief or opinion, and it comes within the protection of the free-speech clause of the First Amendment. Such symbolic acts are generally protected by the Constitution from governmental interference, including interference from school officials. In upholding the right of high-school students to wear armbands protesting the Vietnam War, for example, the Supreme Court stated that 'it can hardly be argued that neither

students nor teachers shed their constitutional rights to freedom of speech or expression at the school house gate.' The principles of the case would apply equally to the wearing of symbols for the gay movement.''


Dear Adam,



Then, the two of you sould start staring at the rude person that won't leave you alone. If that doesn't shake him, start pointing at him. Pretend you're pointing him out to your friend, but do it in big, broad gestures that will allow the whole bar to see that you are pointing at this one person.
