





SAMPLING TEXAS





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

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DOCTORS BAG

As we discussed last time, there are four stages of the disease Syphilis: primary, secondary, early latent and late latent. Primary syphilis can be recognized, in most cases, by the appearance of a sore or lesion, known as a "chancre," in the genital or anal area. However, some persons can have syphilis without any evidence of the "chancres" that are usually associated with the primary stage. But in any case, even those persons who do get a chancre must notice it within a relatively short period of time. For it goes away within a period of just a few days or months, as the syphilis moves "underground" and prepares for a more violent attack on the body.

Many persons who have the sores of primary syphilis think they have been "cured" when those sores go away. And indeed, there may be no symptoms on the body and the infected person would feel "just like their old self" after the primary stage has been passed. But then, after a few weeks or even a year after the primary sore has gone away, the symptoms of secondary syphilis suddenly erupt on the body. The secondary stage is much more violent on the body and could seldom go unnoticed by the embarrassed patient who suddenly sees his own body "going wild."

Secondary syphilis symptoms vary from person to person and there is no

set order of the "events" that will occur. But those symptoms do fall into certain categories, with the patient showing some or all of them.

The most common sign of second degree syphilis is a rash that usually occurs all over the body. The entire body is suddenly covered in small rashes that look like German measles. The rash can exist on the body from several weeks to one year, then the disease moves into another stage, early latent.

Another symptom of secondary syphilis is the appearance of hard raised lesions on the body that look like warts. These usually occur in the genital or anal area, but also in any body area where there is an abundance of moisture, such as under the arms, on the back of the neck, or between folds of fat on obese persons.

Those who are being hit especially hard by secondary syphilis will soon begin losing hair. Hair along the back of the scalp will begin to drop out. Much of the evebrows and evelids will also be lost, "Iritis," an infection of the eye, can also be present. This would be observed as a red ring around the iris. or colored portion, of the eye. Lymph nodes in the body will enlarge, as will the spleen. Fever and general fatigue are also signs of secondary syphilis. The secondary stage of syphilis usually lasts no more than one year, then the disease moves into its early latent and late latent stages. It is in the last two stages that the permanent damage to the nervous system, or the heart, occurs. And in some cases, death.

I will not go into the symptoms or horrible conculsions that accompany syphilis more than one year old. Any person who would not seek medical help after observing the violent appearance of secondary syphilis symptoms, would not understand, or act upon the appearance of symptoms following the secondary stage.


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
Of more importance, I want to use the remaining space to discuss a disease that is becoming unfortunately common in the Southwest, and bears a resemblance to secondary stage syphilis. That disease is known as "herpes."

Genital herpes is not a "new disease," but cases of it are now being reported in "epidemic" numbers by the United States Center for Disease Control. Herpes is a virus, like a cold sore. Unfortunately, there are no satisfactory cures for herpes or methods for preventing it.

There is some sketchy evidence that herpes may be related to prostate cancer in man and uterine cancer in women, but its major known consequences in adults comes from the painful itching and pain produced by eruptive genital sores. Those who get herpes in the genital area can do little more than they could with a cold sore on the lip, you just have to "grin and bear it."


The sore will usually disappear anywhere from three days to two weeks, though many people have accoassional recurrences. It is estimated that two million Americans have to live with recurrent sores of herpes several times a year. Herpes is spread in the same way VD is spread, skin contact with a sore of an infected person. Until something better comes along, and tests are now under way, the best treatment for herpes is to cover the sores with an antibiotic ointment. Your personal physician will select the best ointment for your use.

Herpes, like syphilis, offers clues for your observance in the form of sores and lesions. These sores may come and go, but must not be totally ignored, if you wish to avoid more serious consequences. Go to your doctor or the nearest public health clinic, and go immediately. You need their help. Don't be afraid, embarassed or "put it off." Do it. It can only help.
