The Houston Gay Political Caucus reports that the featured speaker for its May 5th meeting will be Bruce Voeller of the National Gay Task Force.


And at Studz News, a new era has begun. They've put doors on their "booths" which offer complete privacy to the person or persons inside. It's a first. And it promises to be hot!

Over at the Lamp Post, the new band we told you about last week has proved so popular that they now play on Saturdays in addition to their slated Sunday appearances.


