Naked Spirituality: A Life with God in 12 Simple Words

Brian D. McLaren

You may be rebuilding after a faith collapse, or you may be embarking on your virgin voyage into faith and a spiritual life. Either way, you have no interest in fake spirituality, forced spirituality, hyped spirituality, inflated spirituality. You want to strip away all the layers of pretense and get down to naked reality. Doctrinal correctness, institutional participation, and religious conformity won't suffice anymore. You need a life centered on simple, doable, durable practices that will help you begin and sustain a naked encounter with the holy mystery and pure loving presence that people commonly call God...

If "here" suggests waking up and presenting ourselves to the presence of God, "thanks" means waking up to the presents of God, waking up to the abundant gifts of life with which we have already been blessed. Joni Mitchell had it right-or almost right-in her song "Big Yellow Taxi." You don't know what you've got till it's gone, unless you practice gratitude.

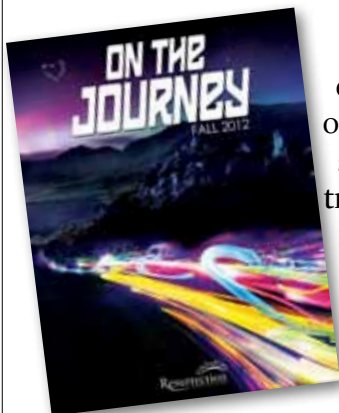

GETTING NAKED WITH GOD!



As a people sincerely desiring to experience, engage, and embody the reality of God's unconditional love for all people, we entered October exploring what it means for us to be a people Practicing our Faith.
