We all love something new. Our throw-away culture teaches us that newer is always better. Each of these words brings a sense of something superior — something which has been improved upon:

Who is Clergy?

As our Spring Weekends unfold, team formation is in full stride. Now is the time we get together with old and new Christian brothers and sisters to facilitate the team formation process. The Weekend Leader is tasked with providing the environment for spiritual formation of the team into one body of Christ, the church. Along the way, the Weekend Leader will be praying and searching for clergy to be part of the team.

While the Kairos ministry is a lay-led ministry, clergy absolutely essential for success of the Kairos programs, but it is very important to ensure that the ecumenical nature of the Kairos ministry be upheld. This the requires that clergy from a variety come denominations. While serving as a Kairos volunteer clergy they must refrain from activities that are unique to their particular tradition.

The question of who is clergy and how they qualify is also an important issue. Persons who serve as clergy on Kairos Inside teams frequently come from very different theological backgrounds. Although Kairos is not a church, we also have a special responsibility to the participants and the institutions

to make careful selections of those persons we call clergy.

We are always concerned about a resident who chooses to share information with Kairos clergy. While we do not administer liturgical practices from any Christian denomination, we do recognize that residents seeking God's forgiveness may share confidential matters with persons designated by us as clergy. Because of this fact, we must be thoughtful about those persons we designate as clergy.

Clergy are called to *listen*, *listen*, love. love. as are a11 team members. As God's representative and shepherd in the institution, they are called to listen to the flock and their concerns. Only through listening can we get to know and love our participants. Listening with a true servant's heart will be a blessing to the Participant and to the team member. In Kairos, we don't preach to our participants. As clergy, they are expected to follow the talk guidelines as any other team member. someone follows their own agenda for a talk, then the carefully developed sequence of the talks is disrupted. Each talk is the foundation for the next.

In essence, we have adopted a three-step analysis to be considered Kairos clergy:



- 1) Any Christian Kairos clergy:
- a) should have received formal training from their Christian denomination or church authority (by this we usually mean seminary or Bible College), **or**
- b) be ordained by their Christian denomination or church authority, or be licensed by their state as clergy, **or**
- c) be recognized as clergy in good standing by a Christian religious order (usually refers to a community of priests, nuns, monks), **or**
- d) be actively engaged in or retired from ministry by a recognized Christian church authority,
- 2) Be able to work effectively in an ecumenical or interdenominational setting,
- 3) Qualify under their state law as being covered by the privileged communication statutes.

We are thankful and blessed to have Clergy who are so dedicated to be a part of the Kairos program.

As I talk to volunteers from across the country I often receive questions about how men can become involved with Kairos Outside. Many are interested in helping, but don't fully understand how they can become involved and be an important and active part of their local Kairos Outside community.

Men who serve on a Kairos Outside Weekend play a very vital role, and there are two ways they can serve. They can serve as members of the Kairos Outside Team, or they can serve as Angels on the Weekend. There are some very significant differences in the responsibilities of these two groups.

First, the male members of the Kairos Outside Team are officially called the Kitchen Team. They are responsible for feeding and serving the Kairos Outside Team and Guests both physically and spiritually. They must attend all the team formation meetings so they become a part of the actual team, the unified Body of Christ that comes together to serve our Kairos Outside Guests during the Weekend.

The Kitchen Team usually has the responsibility of preparing and serving the meals in most communities. They assist with set-up and clean-up before and after the Weekend, they assist the Agape Team as they are needed, they provide entertainment at meal times, and they pray for all the speakers before and after their talks on the Weekend. Male team members also take part in all the special events of a Kairos Outside Weekend including Walking in Love, Flowers at Dawn, the Birthday Party on Sunday, and the Elegant Dinner on Saturday evening.

While the men of the team do not go into the community room where much of the talks and other discussions take place, they are very much a part of the Weekend ministry. Men who serve on the team are servants, and they must always treat the Guests on the Weekend with dignity, respect, and love. This is a new concept for many of the Guests, who may never have been treated by men with love and respect before. The male members of the Kairos Outside team truly help the Guests understand that they are valued by God, and that they are worthy. In some cases the men





may even inspire a Guest to see God, her heavenly Father, in a very different light because of the men's attitudes and actions.

I often hear Guests on a Kairos Outside Weekend say how blessed they were by the men who served on the team, and I know the female members of the team feel the same way.

If men are unable to attend all the team meetings, but still have a desire to serve, they can also serve as Angels. Angels are not officially a part of the Kairos Outside Weekend Team, and can work for as little as two hours or a full day during the Weekend behind the scenes. Angels are never seen, and they never have direct contact with the Guests. Male angels never escort Guests at the Elegant Dinner.

Kairos Outside Weekends would not be the same without the wonderful and committed men who serve in the program.

By serving on a Kairos Outside Team or as an Angel, our male volunteers are blessed, and truly come to understand the value, the importance, and the impact of Kairos Outside.

The Need for a Huddle

"In the same way, though we are many, we are one body in union with Christ and we are all joined to each other as different parts of one body." Romans 12:5

In 1892 football quarterback Paul Hubbard of the

Gallaudet University for the deaf created what we refer to as the huddle. Before the huddle was created, teams would talk back and forth, and in the deaf schools sign to each other. Simply because he did not want the opposing teams, who were also schools for the deaf, to see what the play was going to be, Hubbard ordered his team to line up in a circular formation known as a huddle so he could

receive and relay information to his fellow teammates easily without any worries.

While the huddle is the time when the team players gather behind the line of scrimmage to hear from the quarterback what the next play will be, it is also the time that the team uses to quickly strategize, readjust, motivate and/or celebrate the latest play. Just like the rest of the game of football itself, the huddle has taken many turns. It is now seen in many different styles and used for many different reasons.

The 40 hours of team formation meetings, in a large sense, are the huddle for the Kairos Torch Weekend. It is the time that those committed to serving on the team come together to hear the plays, learn the course of action, affirm each player in their perspective role on the field and encourage each other to play as an organized team. It's also a time of accountability where prayer partners huddle together to discuss their

concerns with the Head Coach (God) and deal with issues that sidetrack them from keeping their head in the game.

Sometimes we hear the seasoned player in Kairos Torch express that there is no need for them to come to the huddle because they have been to so many of them that they already know everything they need to know in order to serve

on a Weekend. All they really want to do is get on the line of scrimmage and play ball.

Can you imagine the horror of a football center declining to huddle with the rest of the team? The quarterback could yell out numbers until he turned blue in the face, but the center would never know when to snap the ball because he refused to huddle and

get the information that would put the game into play. Or suppose the wide receivers decided they would ignore the huddle? They would never know where they needed to be on the field to receive the ball once it was thrown.

Team formation (the huddle) is vital to the success of Kairos Torch. The strength of any team rests with their ability to bond together, understand their role and their place, receive directions from the team leader and function together as a unit. A good huddle is also a place where each team member is affirmed in their sharing and encouraged when they are struggling with their assignment.

When your team leader calls the next team formation meeting, go with great expectations and prepare to huddle.

Kairos in Nicaragua



By John Dodds (Texas Kairos Volunteer) — The room is long and narrow with open windows on one side but the single fan can't move enough air to moderate the heat and the stuffiness almost unbearable. The speaker is presenting a talk in Spanish and I don't understand much of what he says. We just had lunch, beans and rice and a real treat small piece chicken. A few of the participants are having trouble staying awake. What am I doing here? Why do I keep coming back? I know the men

look at me and wonder the same thing; who is this gringo, and why is he here? It is hard to tell the inmates from the team members because the prison does not provide clothes, or even beds, and most inmates sleep on the floor.

This is Kairos #17 in the prison in Nicaragua known as La Modela, and I am here because Kairos is bringing the Gospel inside. Nicaragua is the 2nd most impoverished country in this hemisphere. The people of this country are poorer than most Americans can imagine, and yet they face the same problems our inmates do; they are spiritually lost and looking for something to latch on to, some hope, some way out of the cycle of violence and street gangs and even just something to eat. The Kairos program was brought to La Modela, and is facilitated by, David Aguilar and Mario and Hortensia Mendoza.

I had to wait a year to attend a Weekend, but that experience changed my life. I have been in church my entire life, but I had never felt love like I felt at that Weekend.

With the support encouragement of my Kairos Outside sisters, I was blessed to be a Weekend Leader. Oh, what a ride it was! Twenty-nine guests came to join the amazing team. We were faced with so many challenges and trials. BUT. we persevered and remained united. God blessed our efforts in amazing ways. We truly felt God's presence. There were so many wonderful stories shared at the Closing. We feel such gratitude for their presence and support.



We all need each other in this remarkable ministry. Those we serve need to build strong families that can withstand the challenges they face daily. What better way than to help them build strong families with God at the center?

I Was Born in Prison

My name is Teresa and this is my story.

I am a survivor of prison. I was never in prison except for the day I was born. I am dedicating this testimony to my mother. She was an amazing woman. I was born on Friday the 13th in prison. I was born illegitimate and an inmate. At that time, you were allowed to keep your baby, and I was with my mom for six months. I was then put in a foster home and not returned to her till I was three.



I wish I could say that is where my story ends. My mom was in and out of prison my whole life. I feel that she always did the best she could for me and my younger sister. Unfortunately the things that she did, well, tended to take her back to prison. They say that there is survival in all kinds of illnesses like cancer, leukemia, but nobody ever says you are a survivor of prison. There should be. Families struggle just as much as the inmates do. I missed my mom when she went away. She missed so much of our lives. My mom took her life in 1999 because she was again facing incarceration.

Since the day I was born, they said I was guaranteed one day to end up in my mother's shoes. I didn't. Because the one thing I think that she taught me was that I was worthy of a better life — a better life and a better destiny that I could build on my own. During the times my mom was out of jail and my sister and I were out of foster care, my mother always made sure we had a roof over our heads.

One Christmas we were living in a station wagon. As my sister and I slept, my mom spent the night decorating the car with Christmas decorations. We woke up to Christmas with presents. It wasn't much but it was also everything to us. That was a special moment that I will always think of fondly.



When I attended a Kairos Outside weekend, the love and support I received was amazing. Being able to talk to other women with similar stories made me feel not so alone. Most importantly, it brought me closer to God. My mother was an atheist and God was not a word in our lives as a child. But the funny thing was when she



needed childcare, she always sent us to churches that offered care, maybe because it was cheaper. Well that is where I first realized God's love. And because He forgave us for our sins, I knew I had to forgive my mother's sins. With her and God's love, I knew I could break the cycle that was given me the day I was born.

My destiny was prison. The prison that I lived in, in her

shadows, and behind bars. My mom may have been in prison, but I was the one serving the sentence. But with the support of Kairos, I found a new destiny. And that destiny is being able to tell my story. By sharing it with you, I feel like I am breaking the chains that have held me for so long.

= KAIROS TRAINING =

Advanced Kairos Training is for Kairos Inside, Kairos Outside, and Kairos Torch volunteers who are in or will be in a Weekend leadership role, including Advisory Council or State Chapter positions, anywhere within the Kairos program. Advanced Kairos Training gives the what, who and why of the Kairos ministry. Kairos policy requires that all Weekend leaders must have completed the entire training course 12 to 24 months prior to leading a Weekend.

PRINCIPLE STATEMENTS CONCERNING ADVANCED KAIROS TRAINING EXPENSES

- 1. All Advanced Kairos Trainings are essentially free to any and all attendees. However, paying the expenses of an attendee for training is borne by the state sending its volunteers to a training in or out of its local state. This means that all Advisory Councils or State Chapter Committees should be budgeting for any training expenses deemed necessary for their future Weekend Leaders or other attendees that the Advisory Council or State Chapter Committee wants to attend.
- 2. Advisory Councils or State Chapter Committees should encourage their volunteers (who may have been used to paying out of their own pocket previously to a Host State) to make their donations to their local Advisory Council instead to help build the budget to allow for more volunteers to attend trainings.

BE SURE TO BRING YOUR PROGRAM MANUAL WITH YOU TO THE TRAINING.

You must complete the entire Advanced Kairos Training in order to receive your certificate and become a Weekend Leader.
