NEW AND IMPROVED

Starting with this issue, the format of *Associated Student Bodies* will consist of the main story (Daniel and Marcus' tale) for around 20 pages, drawn by Chris, with the remainder being "backup" stories (generally 2 per issue). These backups will be 4 to 8 pages in length; some will be drawn by Chris, and others by guest artists. The backups will give the "secondary" characters a chance to tell their own stories. Covers, both front and back, will generally be done by guest artists.

In this issue, we have "Peeping Bandit" and "Coyote Rose". "Peeping Bandit" tells a bit about Ricky and Steven, while "Coyote Rose" introduces a couple of off-campus characters (Erik and Randy).

Which brings up the topic of future stories. Issue 3's main story will introduce Daniel to one of the worst risks of being gay; the first backup story will spotlight some of the places Timmy hangs around, and the second covers a truly frightening prospect: Halloween at the dorms of Leland University. The cover will be by Eric Elliott.
