

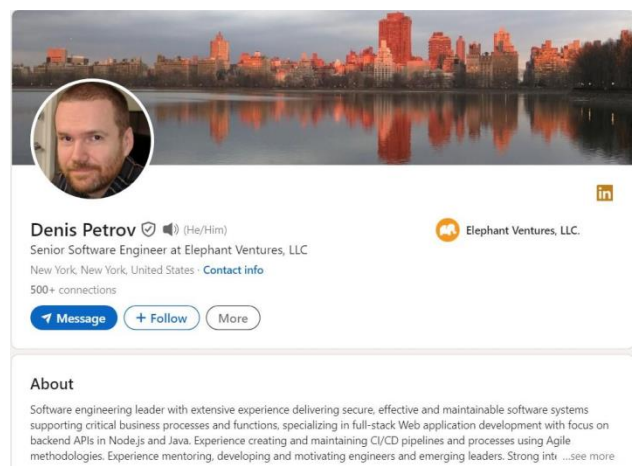

Denis PETROV works as a Senior Software Engineer at Elephant Ventures LLC (<https://www.elephantventures.com>) and noted that it is a Delaware company with offices in several states.



But in front of this respectable facade Denis PETROV leads a double life. A dark life, made of **distribution of pedophile photos**, photos of torture, photos of real rape, promotion and **referencing of drug sales sites**, multiple perjury in DMCA, violation of individual image and legal rights of authorship, and **extortion**.

But behind this storefront is hidden hundreds of child pornography photos, drug sales links and links to real torture and rape content. Denis PETROV actually manages a showcase of all the most horrible things the Dark Web can offer.

Furthermore, Denis PETROV never respects copyright withdrawal requests and steals the personal data of thousands of people. Hundreds of victims are desperately trying to have content stolen from them deleted, some victims are overwhelmed by Revenge Porn and harassment but Denis PETROV doesn't care. And he trades in it.

After a year and a half of investigation, here is all the evidence that proves that Denis PETROV is the owner of archive.today.

**

1. The trail of the who.is:

First, we looked at the archive.is website, where references to mail.ru in the source code suggest a Russian connection to the site's owner. Our Russian-speaking partner says that mistakes in English are typically Slavic. And other post shows that he speaks Russian fluently.




The who.is of domains such as "archive.is" and "archive.vn", which requires putting a real unmasked who.is leads to a "Denis Petrov", between 2013 and 2018.

After having commissioned a private detective to check the address in Czechia, he confirmed to us that there was no Denis PETROV on the mailboxes. This appears to be a fake address or an empty shell.



Registering with a false name on who.is would mean taking the risk of having domain names cut off, which is not compatible with the desire to set up a long-term project, **so there is a strong chance that Denis PETROV is the real name of the owner.**

We do a search with the phone number on <https://epieos.com/> and we find a match with a Denis PETROV Google account, an account which has disappeared today...

It is very unfortunately to hear something like this.

Archive.today (which [archive.fo](#) is one of the mirror domains) is an established project which is 8 years old and used by many journalists and authors.
You can read about it at Wikipedia https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Archive_today
Also it is used by Wikipedia itself to preserve short-living links.

About illegal content: of course, as anyone can upload content to Archive.today there is some of the content is bad, as it is happening with any website with user activity, such as Twitter for example.

During the years running we have established relationship with almost all law enforcement agencies, such as Europol, NCMEC, Eco.de, Cybertip.ca and many others and immediately remove the content they report to us.

Also you do have scan of my passport, my phone and post address and can forward the abuses you may receive to me or pass my contact data to the authorities if they need to contact me.
So far the was only a single messages forwarded my [NIC FO](#) to me and it was not related to to anything that can be called abuse activity.

I believe that you have been fooled by a troll or another malicious actor which wants to hurt me by unrelated reasons.

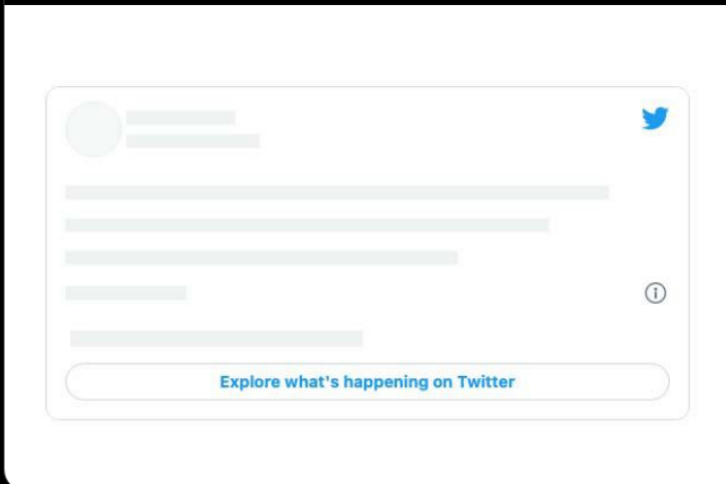

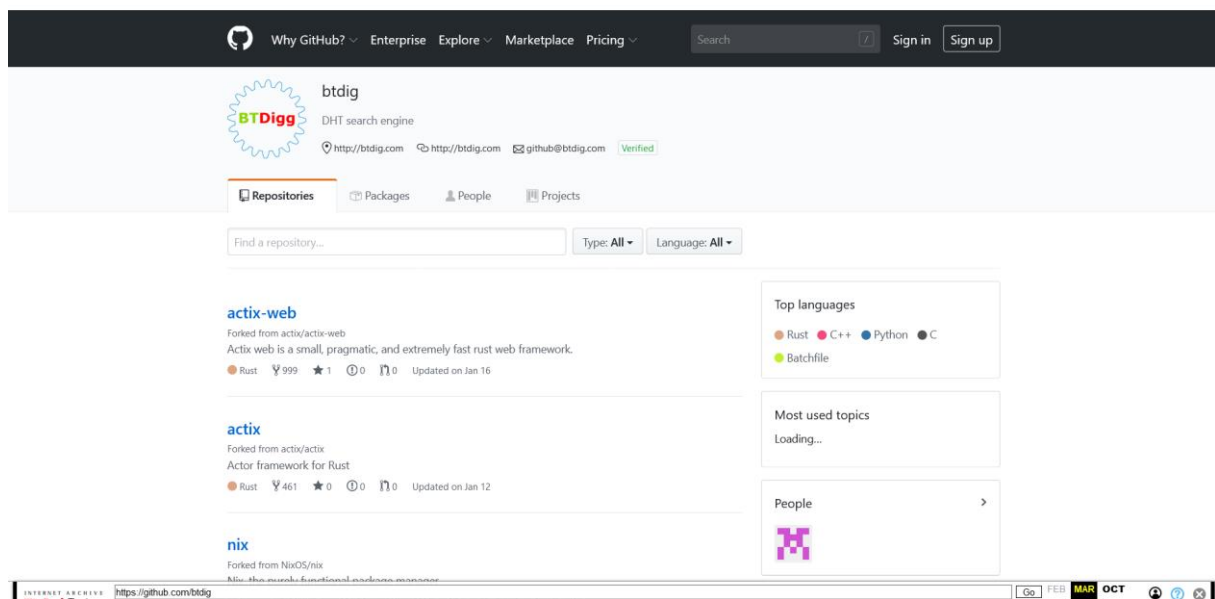

Searching for "Conferno" in search engines reveals:

- "Conferno" has no direct meaning.
- It's not a word in a specific language.
- It is primarily used as a username by two people: An American Twitch streamer and a Russian developer who uses it on social media, calling themselves "Alex/Alexander Conferno".

Given previous indications of archive.is' ties to Russia, Alexander Conferno is likely a subject of research.

On all platforms, he uses the pseudonym "conferno".

Knowing that "Conferno" is not a Russian word nor his last name, we looked up his real last name.

His social media and other platforms do not reveal his real name. But He is known as "Alex or Alexander Conferno" professionally.

By searching breached databases, we found "Conferno" associated with various email addresses and accounts of Alex Conferno.

He used the name "conferno" at Cuberto, a US-based digital product agency, a company he worked for. This private email address was also found:

Further investigation into this email address reveals his real name, date of birth and the city used. During registration. This information was found in the data breach of a Hong Kong clothing retailer site leaked in 2018. Date of birth was revealed in another registration using this email address.

No wireless, power control and it feels much slower than Windows XP Home that I used there before. PERSONAL VOICE MONITOR

A device to help improve pronunciation and correct accents

UPDATES

Nov 27, 2004

I've ordered all the components and materials necessary to get this project back on track, and it took a while for the stuff to arrive from DigiKey. On Monday I will receive the resistor kit, and I've already received copper-clad boards and special paper to transfer laser printer toner to the copper to create etch-resistant artwork that will make connections and pads for components.

I have transistor arrays which I used in prototyping, and to give you an idea what they look like, I took a picture with the tip of a BIC pen for scale. The six-leg bug contains two PNP transistors with virtually identical parameters, and the little rectangle next to it is a resistor. Why identical parameters are important? I'll find some reading for you later on.

I'm still looking for a PC board design software, so if you have any leads, I will appreciate if you drop me a line.

I'm already thinking about the next version of the device, and I will, after all, get a low-voltage op amp and assemble the whole thing in the earpiece, with a hearing aid battery as the energy source. But I'll need to make sure that the concept actually works before I get serious.

Nov 2, 2004

Well, here's the [new design](#). As you can see, it has more components in it, but now it is a classical operation amplifier, not halfbreed. Before I decided on this circuit, I created an ugly monster to cope with the output stage going out of balance when supply voltage getting lower as batteries discharge. Initially I was hesitant to put it up, but here it is on the right in all its terrifying homeliness. It sort of works, but it has no right to live. As you can see, I ended up adding three more transistors, at which point I realized that if I had to add them, I would be better off simply creating an op amp.

The [initial design](#) had a number of flaws. In addition to the middle point drift I mentioned above, quiescent current in the output stage will decline rapidly with supply voltage, creating a lot of distortion. More importantly though, it will *increase* rapidly with supply voltage rising, *as well as with higher temperature*. This means that I may at some point buy batteries with slightly higher initial voltage than normal (how consistent is it anyway?) which will melt the thing in my pocket.

The C3-R4-R5 circuit adds to the distortion and pushes the output balance point lower with AC signal present, so the lower half gets to saturation point sooner than the upper half, and it does not improve the upper saturation point as far as I could see on my 'scope. The gain was significantly higher with the capacitor circuit, although I did not measure it. The purpose of this circuit was exactly the opposite, but I guess I did not implement it right. I could've tried to get to the bottom of it and get it to work, but I felt that it was of the same category of designs as my monster. My hunch is that the output stage does not have enough gain by current to make it work properly, and there is not enough overall gain to compensate the distortion.


A couple of points on the new design. The Q5-R9-R10 circuit ensures that the quiescent current in the output stage is roughly the same as the collector current of Q4, compensated for temperature as long as Q5 is in immediate proximity of Q6 and Q7. The circuit still works acceptably well with Vcc=2.15V, and it appears to be quite stable.

ABOUT

I've created a prototype of a device I designed to help me correct my accent. I'm working on fitting it into a case $1\frac{3}{8} \times 2\frac{1}{8} \times \frac{5}{8}$ inches along with two AAA batteries, a miniature on/off switch and a submini jack for the headset. You can see the [schematics](#), and here's a picture of the prototype assembled on a breadboard:

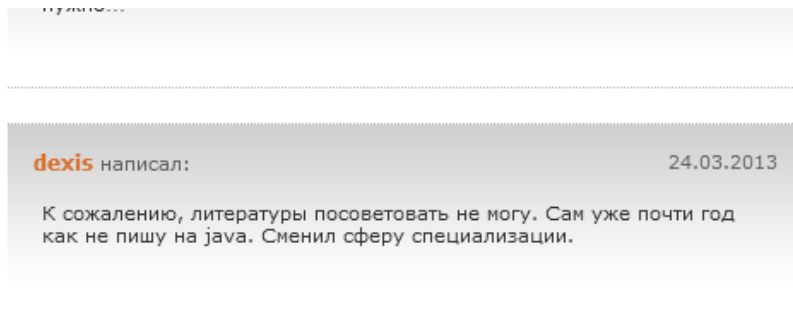

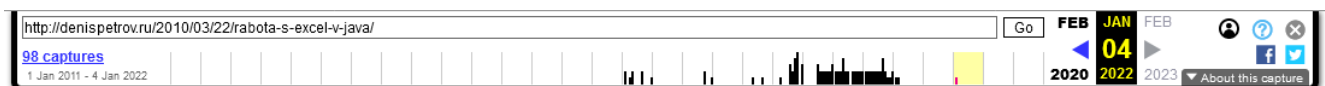

Работа с excel в java

В ходе написания дипломного проекта столкнулся с задачей генерации отчетов в виде xls файлов, другими словами импорта данных в Excel средствами языка java. В java существует несколько вариантов работы с excel. Можно использовать мост JDBC-ODBC и работать с xls файлом как с базой данных, но если вам необходимо не просто сохранять данные, а именно генерировать документы отформатированные определенным образом — этот вариант не для вас. Другой способ чтения и записи данных в xls файлы -ActiveX или COM, но здесь тоже не все гладко, т.к. в этом случае необходимо наличие установленного MSExcel на машине, где будет работать приложения. Ну и наконец третий способ — использовать специализированные библиотеки. Об этом и пойдет речь ниже.

Из известных библиотек для работы с Excel в java можно назвать [Apache POI](#) и [JExcelApi](#). Первый предоставляет возможность чтения и записи практически любых документов из пакета MS Office, мощная библиотека, но для простых задач немного громоздкая, поэтому я остановил свой выбор на [ExcelApi](#).

ExcelApi — один из ряда open-source java Excel API, предназначен для чтения, записи и динамического редактирования файлов excel. Среди его функциональности можно выделить:

- Чтение из книг Excel 95, 97, 2000, XP, and 2003
- Чтение и запись формул
- Создание листов в формате Excel 2000
- Поддержка форматирования шрифтов, чисел и дат
- Поддержка оттенков, границ и цветов ячеек
- Изменение существующих книг excel
- Поддержка локализации
- Копирование графиков
- Вставка и копирование рисунков
- Логирование событий

Как видно, библиотека предоставляет все необходимые возможности для работы с xls-файлами, и при этом она очень удобна в применении и проста в изучении. На [официальной страничке](#) можно найти подробную документацию.

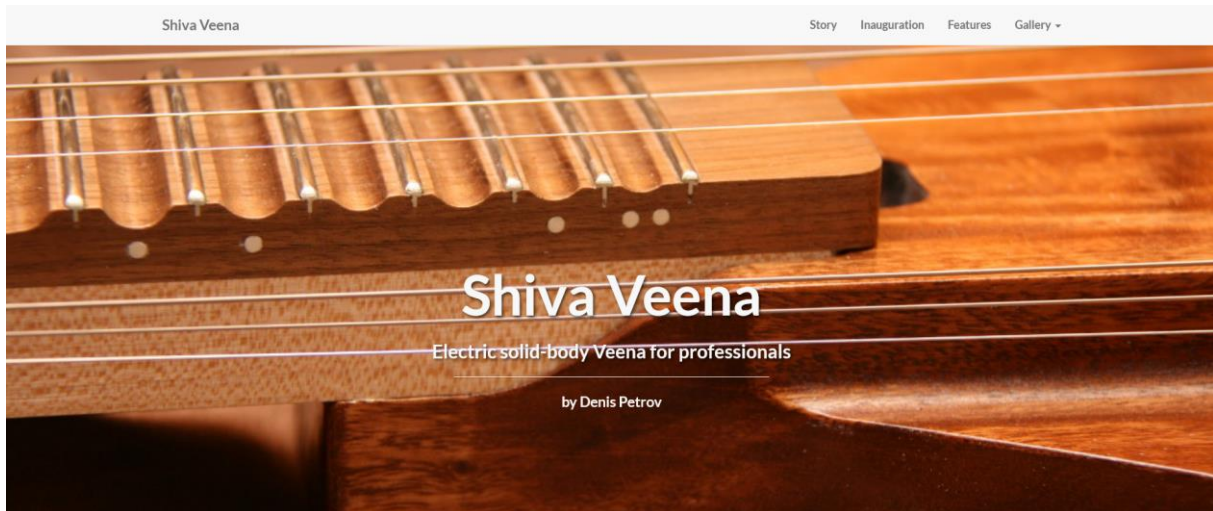

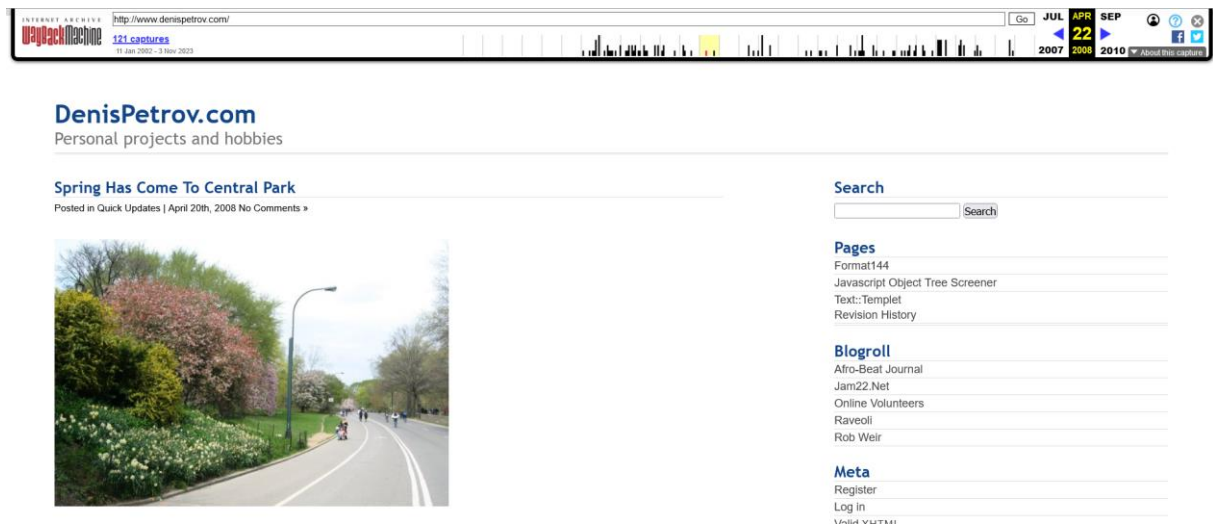

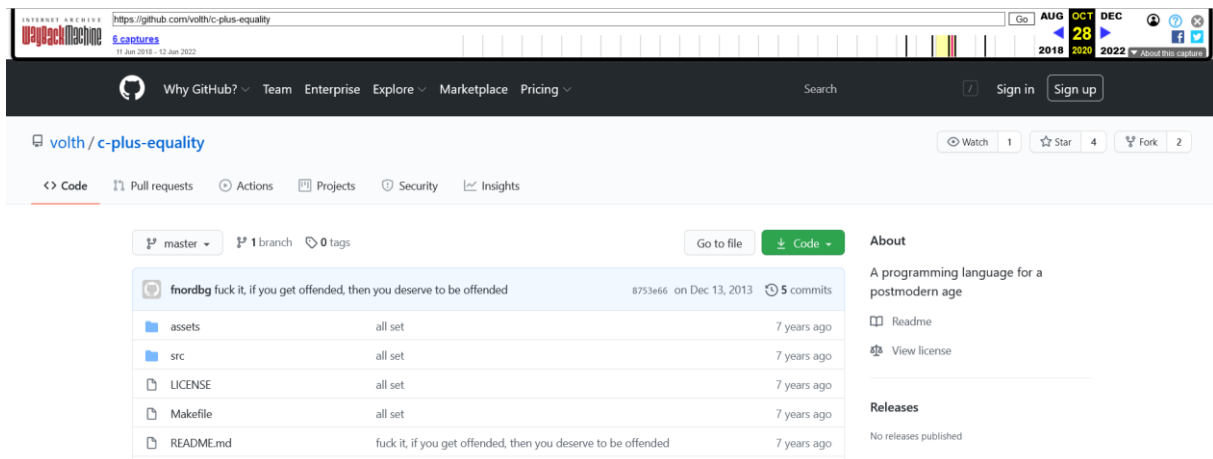

Yet another new similarity between Volth and Denis PETROV from New York.

Note that it is still surprising to drape oneself in feminist virtue when for 10 years he has left hundreds of online photos of women harassed and violated on his archive.is site. For someone who claims to defend women's rights, we have seen better. All this is definitely just a facade.

5. Confrontation with Denis PETROV from New York

At this stage of the investigation we are 100% sure that Denis PETROV from New York is the owner of the Archive.is and Archive.today sites.

With the help of our victims group we sent several complaints to Denis PETROV from New York to his email address. And also to Denis PETROV of archive.is.

We sent in both English and Russian.

We receive a response within 24 hours from both sides every time.

We note that the syntax and style are identical. Note also that he responds in both Russian and English and that the response time zones correspond to New York on both sides.

On the side of “Denis Archive” a compassionate introduction in the first paragraph, to finish, on a paragraph with a mush of arguments to say: that it will not erase anything. On the side of “Denis New York” a little compassionate introduction in the first paragraph, to finish also, with a few sentences explaining that he does not understand what we are talking about...

The answers from Denis PETROV from New York are not clear and vary depending on the interlocutors. Sometimes he says he doesn't understand why he's being contacted, sometimes he says he receives complaints from time to time, and sometimes he says someone has stolen his identity.

Why does Denis PETROV, who has been receiving complaints for 10 years, do nothing to stop so-called identity theft? Why does Denis PETROV from New York respond on the one hand that he knows why he receives complaints, and then, in another email, he says that he does not know why he receives complaints...?

Now let's seriously confront the words of Denis PETROV from New York:

The victim then responded with a large explanatory email to tell him why he is connected to Archive.is and Archive.today:

But how can you not be connected when everything fit...

When you put that site into the whois data or icann it says a Denis Petrov owns it with a Czech Republic address.

But when I talked to a private investigator in Prague she said her investigation showed the owner was in the US.

I looked and the site has a donation option for a PayPal. You can only donate if you registered as a business or charity for the PayPal donation button. I did some digging and found that archive.is was registered as a business in New York.

From there I looked at old screenshots of archive.is and saw they when first launched linked to an animal rescue in New York to donate to. Another new York link.

The Twitter account associated with the website speaks Russian and English.

You are Denis Petrov, you are in new York, and your resume says you speak Russian. That's three connections.

On top of that, you have a history in programming and data centers which is necessary to run such a site.

That's FOUR connections. It all points to you as the owner. Unless the site is trying to frame you as the owner. But why pick a random person for that? And the registering as a real business in New York... That's legal stuff. It wouldn't be possible to fake that.

If you don't own the site who does?

So since August 2023 we have been sure that Denis PETROV from New York knows why the victims think he is the owner of Archive.is and Archive.today.

We are questioning our victim group again in order to cross-reference information.

In September 2023, a young Russian woman who was a victim of harassment (also) sent an email directly to Denis PETROV from New York to his address found on LinkedIn.

Complaint sent in Russian.

And surprise! Denis PETROV from New York responded to her in Russian to tell her: he doesn't understand why she is contacting him! While Denis PETROV from New York has known since August 2023 precisely why the plaintiffs contact!
