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LOOKING AROUND



By contrast to recurrent reports of the diminishing influence of religion, the Assembly (House of Representatives) of America's most populous state spent the better part of one recent session engaged in a brisk debate on the Holy Bible.

This governmental Bible class was occasioned by San Francisco Democrat Willie Brown's bill to repeal all laws relating to any sexual conduct between consenting adults in private.

Similar legislation has been enacted by Britain's Parliament as well as by the state legislatures of both Illinois and Connecticut—from whence there have been no reports that the sky has fallen.

Nevertheless, when the Brown bill came up for debate, the Rev. E. Richard Barnes a San Diego Republican with Bible in hand, quoted Leviticus 18:22:

"Thou shalt not lie with a man as with a woman. It is an abomination."

But Mr. Barnes neglected to introduce legislation that such abominators be put to death—which is required by Leviticus (20:13).

"The capitol of this state is Sacramento—not Sodom!" thundered Los Angeles Republican Frank Lanterman—whose fellow L.A. Republican, Newton Russell (also brandishing his Bible), emphasized:

"Sodom and Gomorrah were destroyed because of their wickedness!"

But Russell somehow failed to mention during his legislative homily that the only survivor of this cataclysmic punishment was a man named Lot. And the Bible reports no such punishment visited upon

Lot, despite its disclosure that Lot founded the tribes of both Moab and Ammon—by means of his having incestuous relations with his two daughters, in a cave, while drunk. (Genesis 19:37, 38).

As for "unnatural" sex acts, the California Assembly's Democratic leader Walter Kerabian, a former prosecuting attorney, told the legislators how difficult this is to define and prosecute. One seeming Biblical denunciation, for instance, is Romans 1:26: "Their women exchanged natural relations for unnatural."

This, explained 16th century Jesuit scholar Thomas Sanchez in his *De Sacramento Matrimonii*, meant any woman who engaged in coitus with her husband beneath—instead of taking the bottom position indicative of woman's natural subordination to man.

San Jose Democrat John Vasconcellas contended: "These are questions for the individual and the church—maybe it's time the government got out of people's personal sex lives," (a remarkable statement by Vasconcellas, considering his strong opposition to liberalizing abortion laws).

But Southern California Robert Burke blasted the bill as "elevating ourselves above God." So 40 of his colleagues combined to kill the Brown bill.

The problem of venereal disease has been a menace on society since the beginning

of time. Because the mode of transmission is almost exclusively through sexual activity, any efforts to effectively control its spread has been hampered because of the moral connotation, and society's failure to accept it for what it is—a disease. Particularly in the homosexual community, has V.D. been most difficult to contain due to the above, and the added fear of exposure which could be the ruination of his family, position, and all that is considered sacred to any individual—straight or gay.

We in Venereal Disease Control have for years been aware of this situation, and have honestly endeavored to perform our duties with the utmost tact and diplomacy in every case of venereal disease. The job of selling confidentiality to someone who does not believe there is such a thing is a mammoth task. The lines of communication have never been completely open, but rather one way, we to you, instead of reverse.

This is the story of V.D.—Gay Rapp Session, communications from you to us. It came into being from an infected homosexual who doubted our sincerity and mode of operation. Through his efforts, we met with the owners of all the homosexual establishments in Broward County to generally rapp about V.D. and find out what could be done to reduce the incidence.

Thus far, a Gay V.D. Hotline, staffed by volunteers and directed by a well-known gay entertainer, will soon be a reality. This entertainer has also included humor-

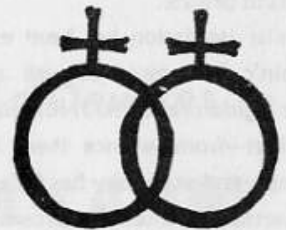

Posters will soon be displayed in every gay establishment in Broward and, hopefully, Dade County in the near future, publicizing the Gay Hotline and where treatment can be obtained free and confidentially. Already one establishment has such posters and free blood tests have been conducted at this establishment and will be continued on a monthly basis.

THE GAY HAUNT

When you're down and out, try picking up a copy of *THE GAY HAUNT*. I personally guarantee that it will bring nearly anyone out of anything short of death.. maybe even that too! It is one hundred eighty-five pages of pure camp.

If you're looking for something serious with all kinds of deep thoughts, don't read this book. The plot is totally unbelievable but provides many hilarious incidents.

The book opens on a straight, dull, establishment party where the main character, Paul, a "reformed" gay, is introducing his wealthy fiancée to a select group of social climbers.

Suddenly, a gay ghost (literally), from his past appears—nude, right in the midst of the gathering. The ghost is invisible to everyone but Paul, but Paul doesn't know this and he is naturally quite shaken. The ghost is Lorin, Paul's unbelievably beautiful, wild lover who had died more than five years before.

Lorin had heard about Paul's impending marriage and decided to go AWOL from his rather "warm climate" in order to rescue Paul from the drudgery of straight life. Naturally, many embarrassing events take place when Lorin starts to appear (before everyone!) in various states of undress in all the wrong places.

Needless to say, Lorin wins out by destroying Paul's 'nouveau riche' existence piece by piece by piece (Lorin likes sex).

Paul ends up dumping both his job and his fiancée and returns to a fulfilling artistic existence with an ex-lover. Lorin's forged pass expires just as Paul's life is resolved and he returns from whence he came. Of course, it's a typically "happily-ever-after" ending but what else could possibly happen in such a fantasy? It's a very funny, unreal book which could easily make one laugh himself to death!

AT THE MOVIES

Richard Harris is beginning to get stereotyped as a man alone in the world. This idea crops up again in his most recent extravaganza, *MAN IN THE WILDERNESS*. He handles the role well and the movie is relatively convincing but it doesn't seem to have any purpose or method. The story revolves around an isolated set of incidents supposedly true, that took place in the mid 19th century. A psychopathic leader of a trapping expedition is taking his pelts and a large boat across what seems to be half of inland America. The presence of the boat is never fully explained. Somewhere along the way, Harris is attacked by a grizzly bear and is nearly killed. He is left to die but of course, somehow miraculously recovers and the plot revolves around his attempt

to survive and catch up with the rest of the expedition.

There is very little significant dialogue because Harris is, of course, alone. There are some flashbacks to his married life, but they don't give any significant insight into his character other than to establish the fact that he is very existentialistic.

Naturally, he does catch up with the expedition but the movie simply ends there with no explanation offered. If you enjoy seeing solo performances and beautiful photography and beautiful landscapes, you'll enjoy this movie but if you're looking for morals or answers to questions.... forget it.

The movie, *SLAVES*, has been around for some time but I avoided seeing it because of the obvious connotations of the title. I finally went to see it out of respect for Dionne Warwick and was very pleasantly surprised. The movie is, of course, about pre-Civil War slavery in the South but with a few refreshing twists.

It takes place on a plantation where the master, played by Stephen Boyd, reaps equal profits from cotton and the breeding of Blacks. The similarity to all other movies of this nature ends there because of the unique character development and the relationships between them. To start with, Stephen Boyd has a black mistress, (Dionne Warwick) who hates herself for taking advantage of her master's immature and even perverted interest in her, but cannot quite force herself to return to the fields after tasting culture, education and all the other things which would be taboo for a Black any other way. She becomes introverted and of course, turns to drink until she meets the master's new and difficult slave (Ossie Davis). Davis does not fit into the pattern because his previous master was a kind man who believed in educating his slaves. He is easily as sophisticated as his new owner and a conflict results.

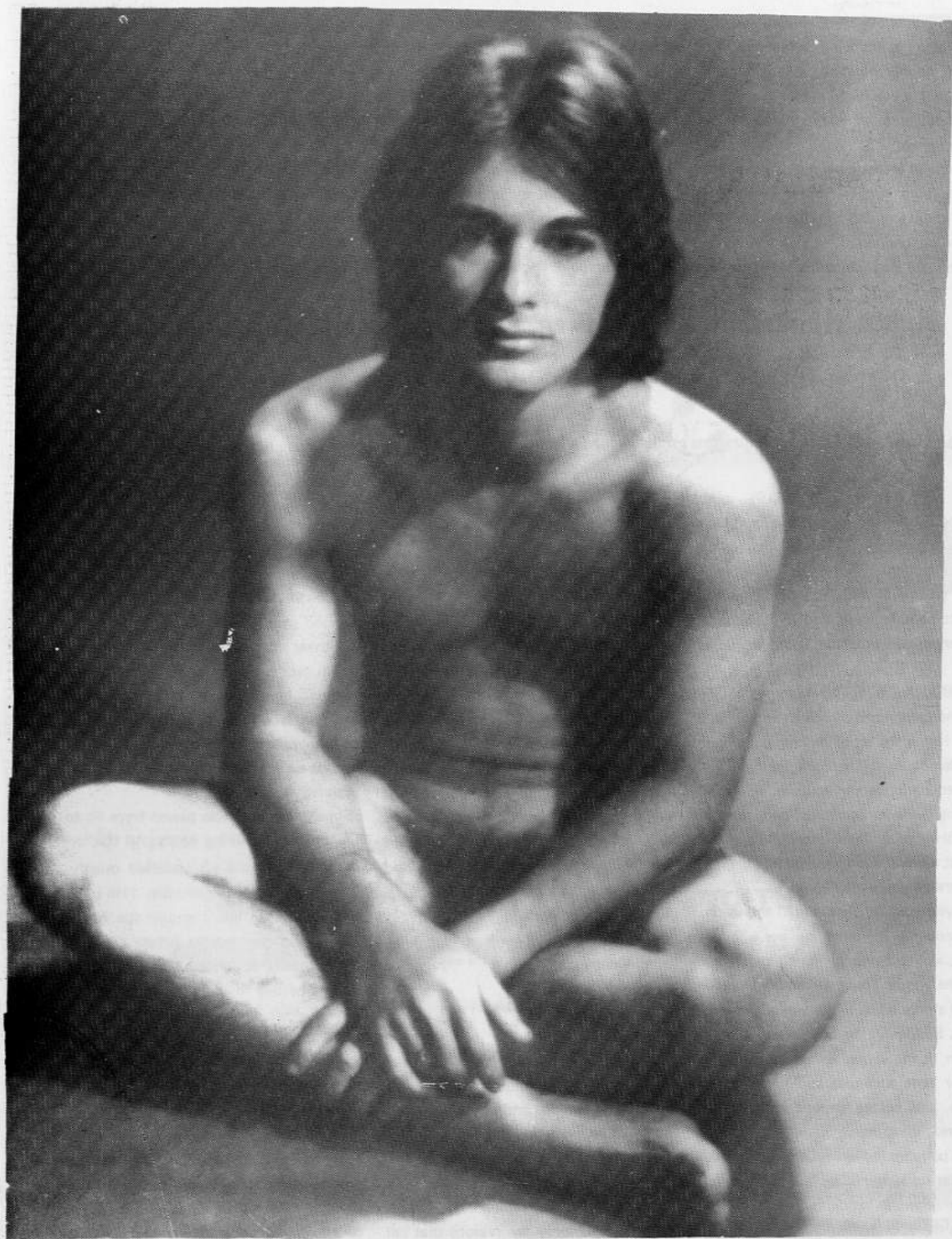

And in due time, the good sheriff heard about all of the plans for the monster party on the 11th. Scratching his great expanse of bald pate he wondered what in Hell the gay bars were having a party for, and why on the 11th? A vague uneasiness rattled around in his cops brain, but no amount of head scratching seemed to help, until a massive slap on the back of his head sent a cascade of inch long warmish cigar ash down the sheriff's fat neck. Leaping straight up, he bellowed for his lieutenant and roared out that Saturday night they were to use the whole works.

"Take every damn license number of every damn car in every damn gay bar parking lot. AND photograph inside every damn gay bar. No slip-ups. I'll embarrass them out of town...once and for all."

Saturday dawned clear and crisp, and though none of the bars opened until 2 in the afternoon, by nine o'clock, there was more activity than the finale of Aida. Step ladders moved in and out of doorways. Festive pom-poms were carried to and fro, and color matching went on endlessly on the sidewalks. Long strings of tiny blinking colored lights were laid out and tested and retested. Bulbs were being switched endlessly to ensure proper color patterns and to make certain no clash of color would occur against a dark background. Delivery boys cursed as they jockeyed their waddy little hand trucks

through narrow doors. And all the while, Sheriff Nottingham chewed cigars at a rate that would have sent the blood pressure of the department of surgeon sky-high, had he but known.

At first, even the other slaves resent Davis because he is causing a turmoil among his own kind by refusing to be subservient. Ultimately, Davis and Warwick team against Boyd in an escape attempt. The attempt fails which leads to a confrontation between Boyd and Davis in front of all the slaves.

Davis has the audacity to strike back and is naturally killed for this. His death makes him a martyr and the Blacks unite for the first time against their master.

The movie ends here with Boyd screaming that nothing has changed but the slaves and the audience both know different.

Because of some excellent support from Davis, Boyd and the other characters, Miss Warwick was able to carry her role relatively well. The movie is definitely worth seeing, if for no other reason than catching a new but believable angle on the Black-White conflict.

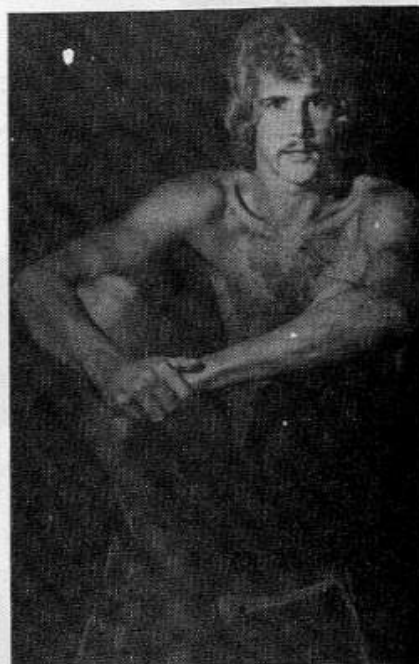

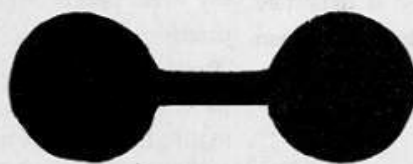

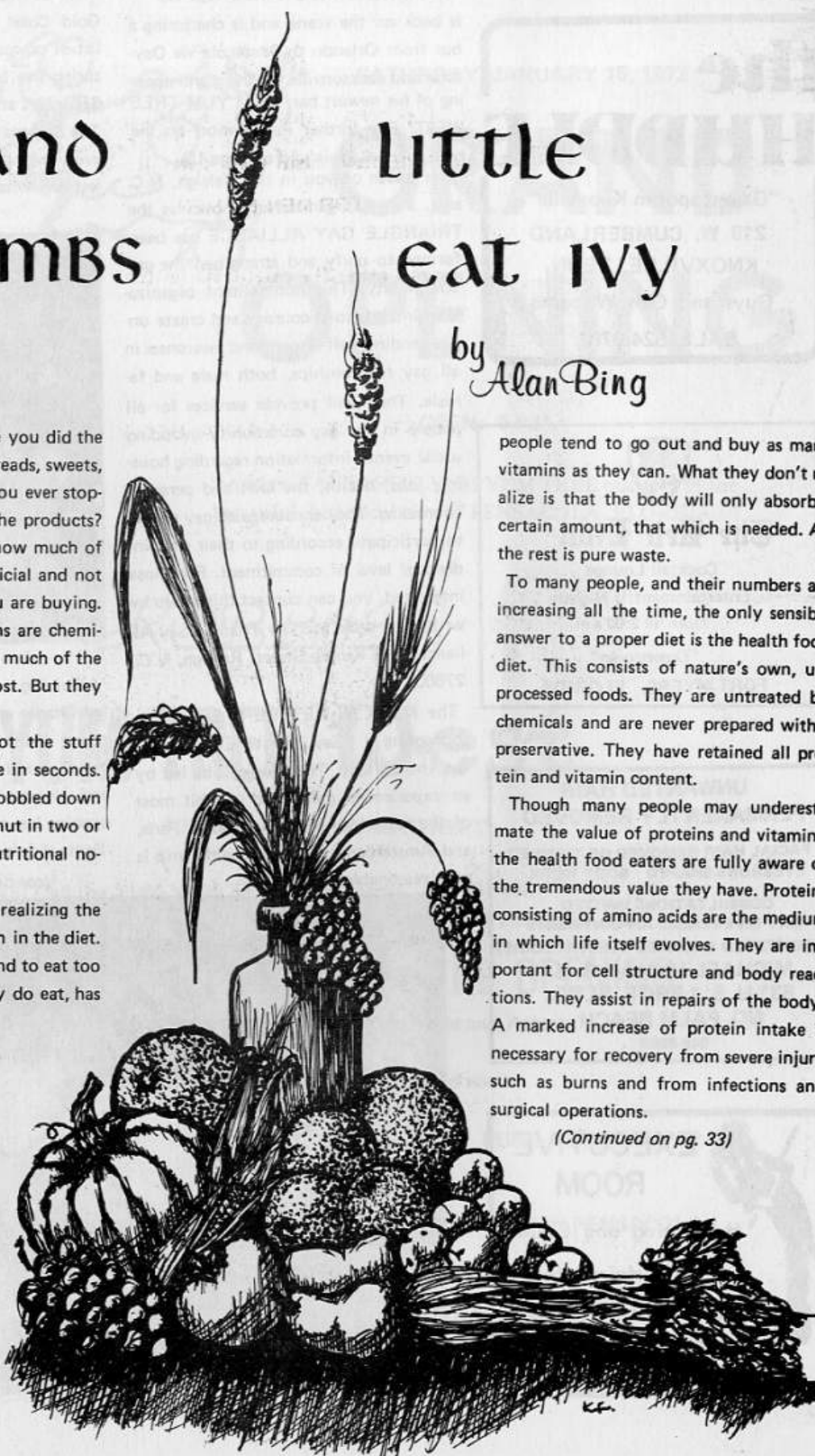
This is where most people fall victim to their ignorance. Not being exacture of what vitamin deficiency they might have.

HEALTH (Continued)

Vitamins are essential to the normal functions of any enzyme activity in the body. Vitamins help repair damaged tissue. They provide the spark which sets off the metabolic machinery. In cooking, vitamin loss can be kept to a minimum by cooking food in as little water as possible and for as short a period of time as possible.

For the novice going into a health food store, it is important to know exactly what foods you are buying and for what reason.

It's no wonder that in the case of health food diets, many people tend to become fanatic about the rewards that health foods can bring. Many firmly believe that these foods will do miraculous things for you and your body.

The better-known gurus of this field are Adelle Davis and Georges Ohsawa, both who have written books on these new methods of dietary discipline. Followers of these disciplines consider the written works of these two people as the gospel. And, as in any true follower of the gospel, strictness and rigidity are mandatory.

Macrobiotics is based on the premise that you and your food are all one; food becomes part of you, and is you. It is a practical philosophy of eating. The primary foods are cereals; brown rice especially, but also millet, buckwheat, kasha, corn meal and other grains. Cooked vege-

tables are next in importance. Fruits (unless they are grown within a radius of 50 miles from your home) and animal foods are not held in high regard. Ohsawa says not to eat anything that can run away, (sorry, hamburger lovers!). Liquids are frowned upon, except for Japanese bancha tea or herbal drinks. Everything sugary is out.

Preparation of the food is important. Each plate is a work of art on a high aesthetic level. The color arrangements must appeal to the eye and the fragrances must appeal to the nostrils. The meal is designed as an enchanting ritual, religious in its nature.

Most macrobiotic food is flavorful and delicious, once you become accustomed to it. Instead of salt, a product called gomasio is used, a mixture of crushed, roasted sesame seeds and sea salt. Seaweed, (kelp) is a favorite food; the usual spread on breads, instead of butter is tashimi, made from sesame seeds. Japanese azuki beans are popular, as are two protein foods, miso and tamari, used as soups or as a gravy for rice.

Macrobiotics also includes some interesting "cures" such as the following one for pneumonia:

"Take a 1-lb. carp, cut off the head and catch blood in a cup. Drink this liquid before it coagulates. Crush the remainder of the fish, place it in cloth and apply to chest. When temperature returns to nor-

mal (within 5-6 hours) remove plaster." (A great idea for those of you who will try anything once!)

A recent visit to one of the local health food stores gave this writer an amazing insight into the world of natural foods. While snacking on a bag of roasted soy beans, the clerk of the store expounded on the rituals and wonders that the store held.

In the health food diet, the three essential elements are health oils, cold pressed vegetable oils; whole grain cereals and stone-ground, unbleached flour.

Vitamin potency is also carefully considered and used. The Vitamin E, sometimes known as the "wonder vitamin", has many great benefits. It is known to be good for your skin and hair, it also strengthens muscles and the heart, cleanses the liver, and utilizes the oxygen in your body. Some foods high in Vitamin E are cashew nuts, apricot kernels, sunflower and pumpkin seeds.

Naturally, the foods containing this vitamin, supplemented with others, are the most highly valued. The supposition is, that is you eat the right foods, you don't need vitamin supplements like those you would buy in a drug store.

Since so many foods lose their value in processing, the health foods used in the health diets consist of items like raw

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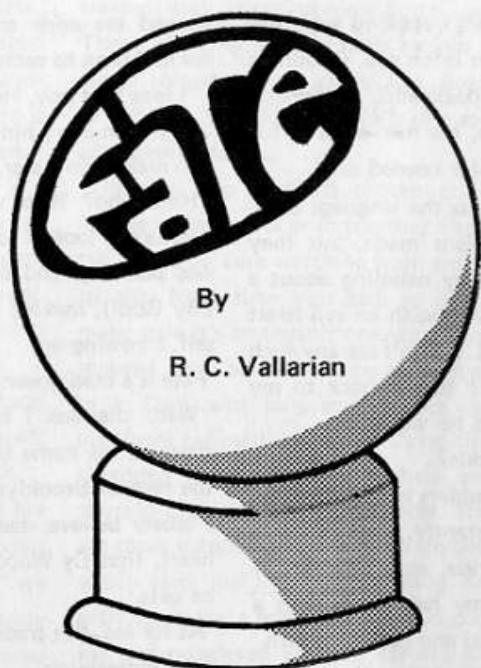

"I love that boy. He reminds me more of Jerry than Jerry himself. Why, together, I can make him a star."

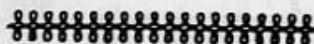

wheat germ, kelp (powdered), uncooked cereals, honey and yeast. Soybeans, oats, and yogurt are full of protein. Baked goods are made with whole wheat. Noodles are made from soybeans and there is also a milk product made from soybeans.

Tiger Milk, one of the mainstays, is a yeast formula you mix with milk or some pure fruit juice. It contains all the essential amino acids, all from natural sources. There is also a flavored Tiger Milk which makes a great high-protein milk shake.

The honey you find in a health food store is pure, raw, organic and unfiltered, with all the natural properties still in it.

On the more appealing side, there are many "healthy", high protein goodies you can eat (not including the "one" we all know and love) such as Carob candy which is a chocolate substitute derived from the carob-nut. Try chocolate covered soybeans, wheat germ lollipops, or vitamin A or D lollipops. There are also ma-

ny high protein candy bars such as molasses-coconut bars (all natural) and (untreated and pure) peanut butter bars. There are even high protein recipes for ginger bread, cream puffs and Boston Cream Pie. (See *Mother Molly* for some complete recipes).

One can also purchase protein creams for use in cosmetics or in cooking. Papaya tea is said to cure anything from anthrax to zits. Next time you pick an orange, make sure it's an organic one—that is, unsprayed, with all the mineral content still in it. Cook with kelp and protect yourself from radioactive fallout. Using hijiki, shredded seaweed, is said to help avoid thyroid problems and even cancer. There are meat substitutes made from soybeans which taste just like the real thing. Kelp granules make a great seasoning in cooking and powdered yeast in tomato juice is a lot better for you than a Bloody Mary.

Although the principles of health food

has been around for centuries, the American public is just now grabbing hold as evidenced by the thriving business of the many new health food stores. Although this diet is not for everyone (it's rigid disciplines are a bit too much for many people), its advocates claim that once you are used to it, other foods will seem unpalatable. And if what they say is true, you should be able to live a long, healthy natural life. So friends, for a unique experience, try it—you might like it.

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MACROBIOTIC MOTHER MOLLY

Well folks, Christmas is over and I'm a-fraid Mother Molly had a little too much to eat over the holidays. A friend recommended a health spa which boasted a "return-to-nature" way of living, consisting of lots of fresh air, exercise and all meals made with natural foods. Well, after two weeks, I found that I could fit into the Packard's bucket seat again and I felt as fit as a fiddle. By the way, sweeties, the meals were absolutely divine! And to think, it was all that health food stuff like wheat germ and soybeans which I never thought I'd eat. I used to be a lot more particular about what I'd put in my mouth, but this stuff was truly an oral delight!

The following two recipes were my favorites and I think you'll enjoy them more than the average meat and potatoes dish: Stewed Chicken and Flaming Kidneys in Brandy.

First, select a stewing chicken, dress it, disjoint it, and put it in bed, I mean in a pot, with:

2 cups vegetable-cooking water (the residue from cooked vegetables)

2 tablespoons of white vinegar

2 teaspoons of salt

¼ cup diced bell pepper

1 cup mushrooms (optional)

1 cup of water with 2 teaspoons instant chicken broth

While the sauce simmers, remove white tissue and dice ¾" cubes of:

3 or 4 veal kidneys or

6 lamb kidneys

Five minutes before serving, stir kidneys into hot sauce. Center in a bed of rice on a platter. Immediately before taking it to the table, pour ¼ cup of cooking brandy over the kidneys and light. Carry to the table while flaming (the kidneys, that is).

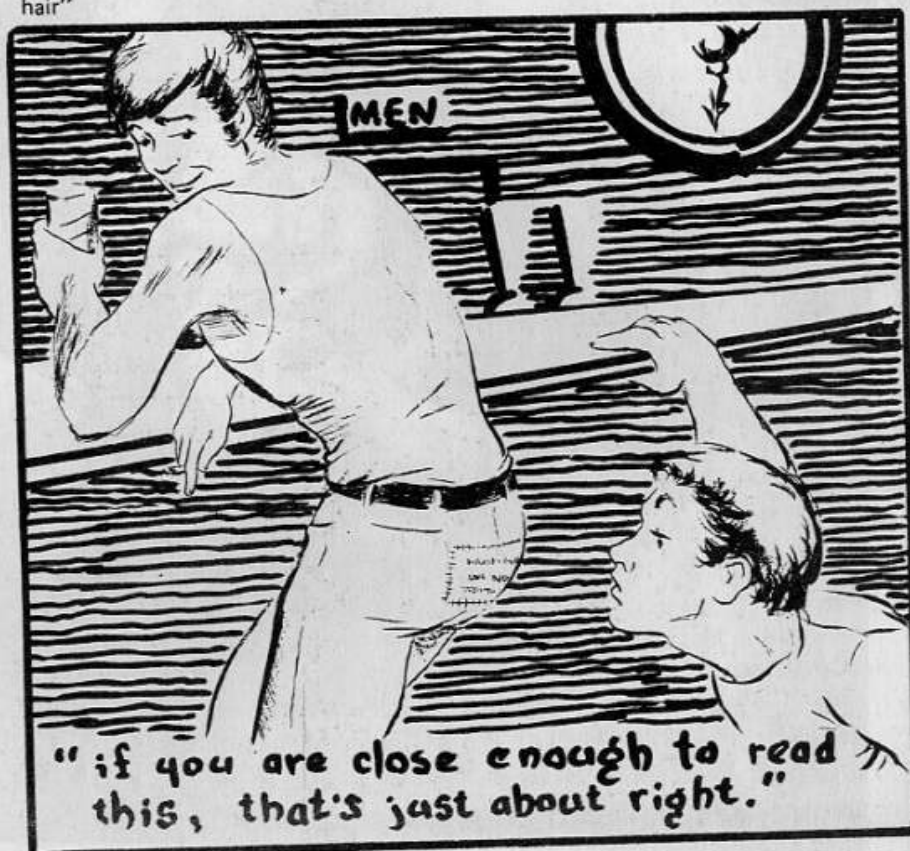

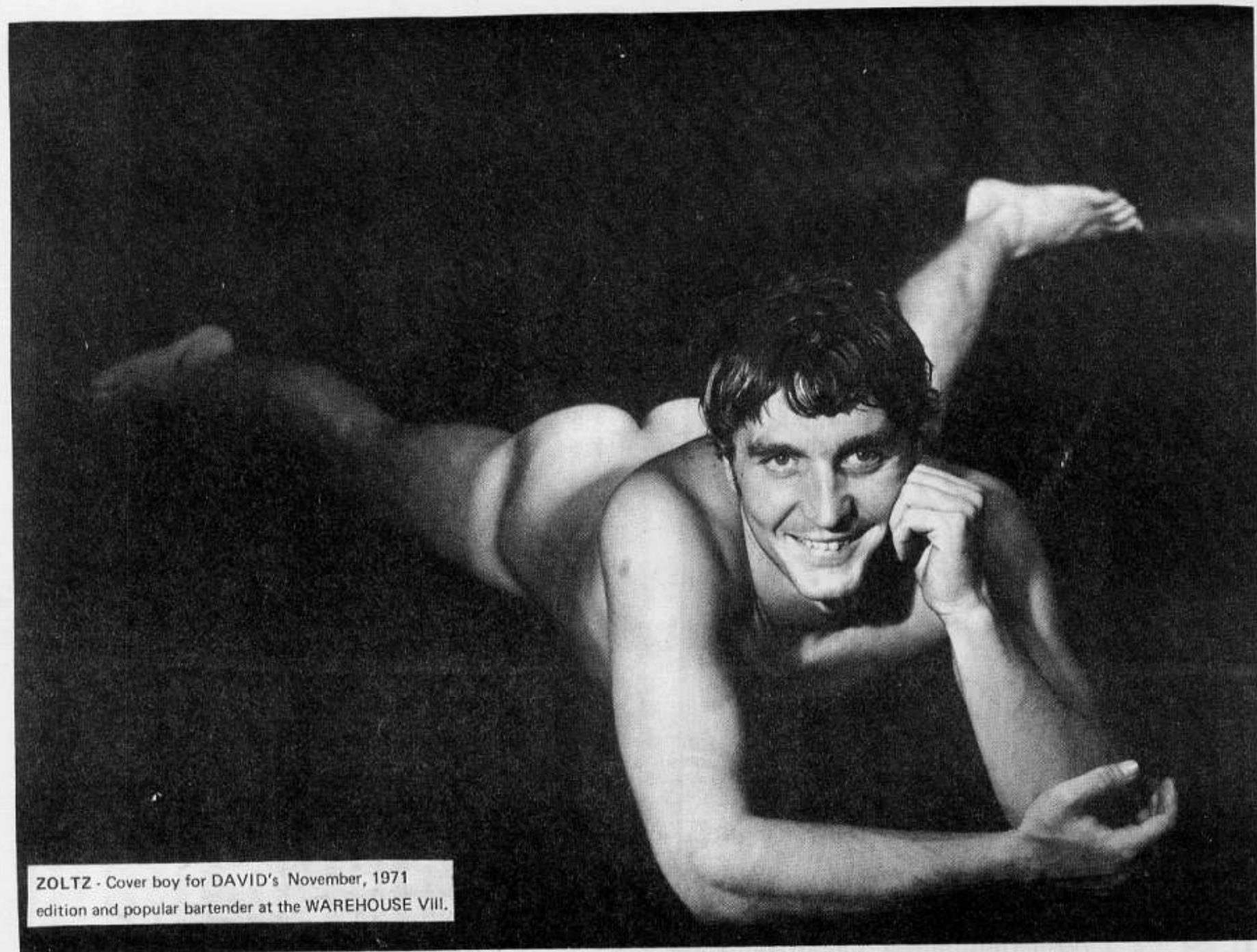

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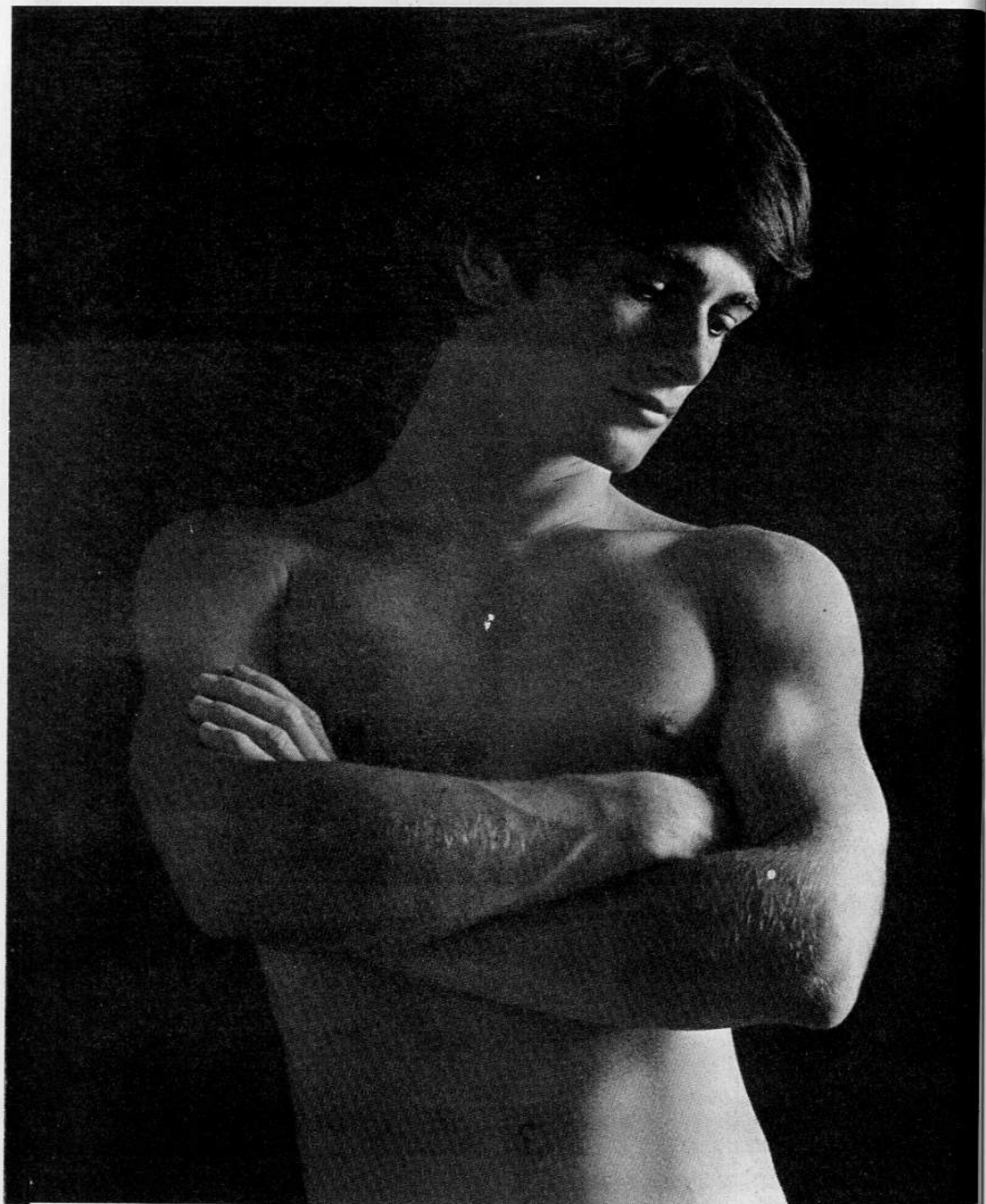

VENUS IN THE KITCHEN

CHOCOLATE SOUFFLE

O.K. fems, now that holiday time has once again crept up on us, we need to keep our butches in good spirits. And any girl knows, that the way to her butch's heart is through her stomach!

After you've served her a nice, hearty meal, VENUS suggests this mouth-watering delight which would top off any meal.

Here's what you'll need:

- 3 tablespoons butter
- 3 tablespoons flour
- 1 cup of milk
- ½ cup of sugar
- 3 squares (3 oz.) of bitter cooking chocolate, broken into bits
- Dash of salt
- 5 egg whites, beaten
- 7 egg whites, beaten

In top of a double boiler, melt the butter and mix with flour. Cook a moment and then add milk, stirring constantly until the mixture is rich and creamy. Then, add the sugar and stir until dissolved.

Add your chocolate. The mixture will appear grainy for a while, but keep stirring and the chocolate will combine and you will have a smooth, thick sauce. Remove from heat. Add the salt and beat the mixture for 1 minute and allow it to cool a bit. Then add the beaten egg yolks and beat until smooth. Beat the egg whites until stiff, but not dry.

When the chocolate sauce is very cool, take a large spoonful of whites and fold vigorously in the chocolate mixture until it appears slightly foamy.

Dribble this sauce over the remaining egg whites, and fold thoroughly and carefully. Slide this into a buttered and sugared souffle dish (approximately 5½" high, 11½" across), and place in a 350 degree oven. It should be ready in 20 minutes but test it to see if the top crust wiggles only slightly. Serves 6-8.

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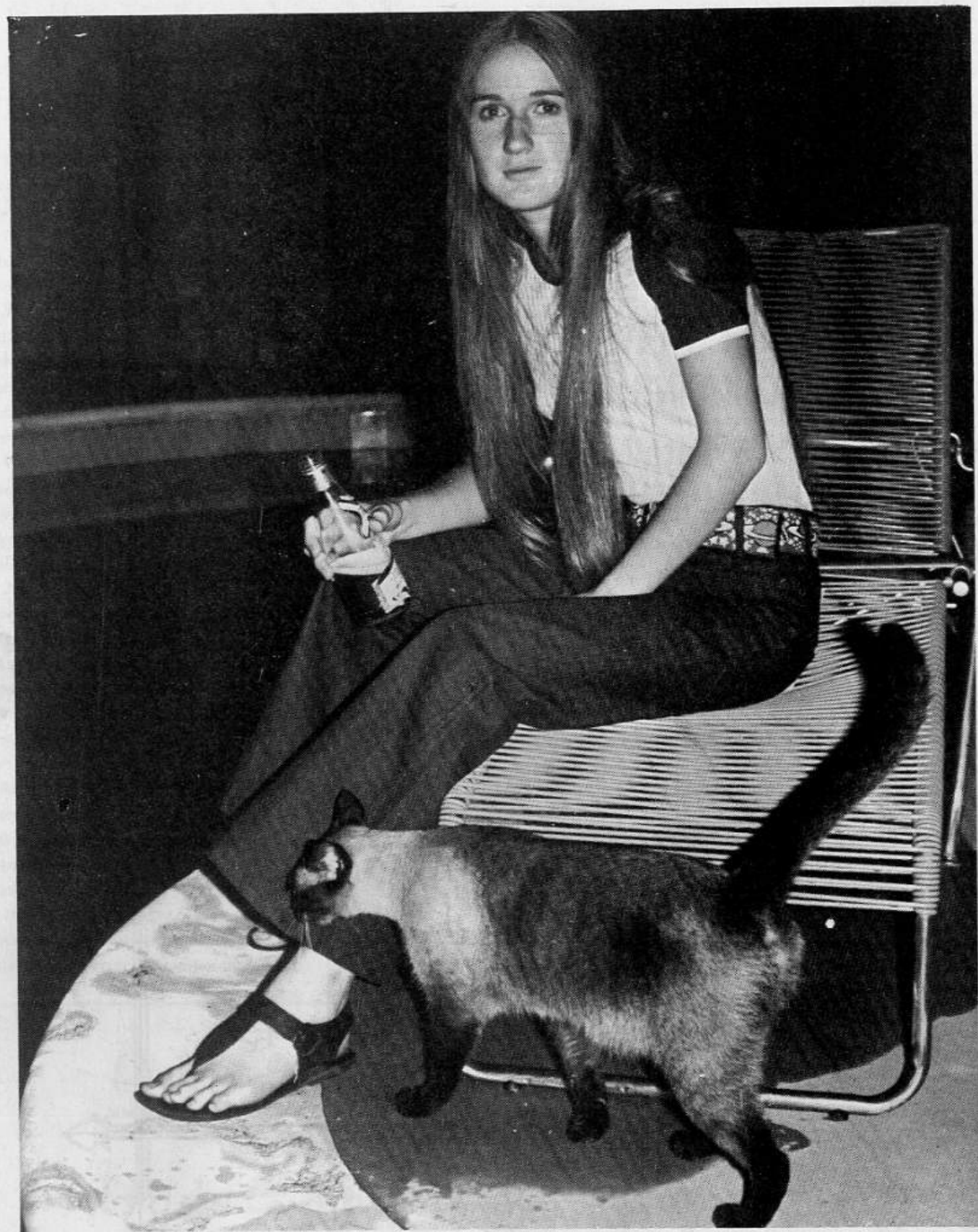
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Our VENUS girl this month is Dolly, the gal who has turned Jacksonville upside down. She's a petite 5'3", but she has enough vigor for a giant.
