Dear Sirs.

Gay Pride is a term that's been bandied about for some time now. If you're proud that you're gay, and you should be, then you're on the right track. But don't stop there. We're all living in the perfect age to be able to really help the Gay movement in this State and the country. The 80's will be THE decade for Gays. To paraphrase an ERA Slogan: A Gay's place is in the House, and in the Senate.

The fight for Gay rights won't be easy. Part of the problem is antiquated laws. For instance, current English law forbids male homosexuality, but not female. It seems the law was instituted by Queen Victoria I, who could see how it might happen between men but couldn't conceive how the act was possible between women, and none had the guts to enlighten

Of course, this is only part of the problem. Much more damage has been done by the news media's stereotypical portrayal of Gays. Last year's San Francisco Gay Pride Parade comes to mind as a classic case. The cameras never showed the average straight acting and appearing Gay. Instead what we saw were transvestites, morphodites and drag queens galore. People whose mode of dress and behavior, by anyone's standards, could only be considered bizarre. This small, but unfortunately

highly visible minority within the Gay population, is how the media has chosen to define Gay in the USA. As long as the drag queens stay in the bars there's no harm done, but please, let's not flaunt it in front of a gullable public.

After coverage such as this it's

After coverage such as this it's no wonder that the average Straight American has a fear of Gays. His view of Gays has been grossly distorted.

It's that sort of Victorian thinking that results in abominations such as Louisiana Senate Bill No. 1084 (proposed by Senator Severio) which would essentially ban all homosexuals from teaching in La. schools. The time to act is now. Call City Hall to get the mailing address for your Congressman, or write Le Beau Monde for further information.

The Gay Political Movement in Louisiana is gaining momentum all the time. Get involved. It's not just politics, there are volley-ball games, camping (as in the woods), trips and many other activities being organized all over the State. You'll probably even make a few interesting friends in the process. If there isn't a group in your area, start one. But please, do something to give more meaning to the term GAY PRIDE in Louisiana.

The above mentioned, however were only selfserving achievements. More importantly, and on an infinitely broader scale; contributions to St. Jude's Children's Hospital and National Cancer Research Institute allowed us to return some thing to the society in which we live. Other functions included the Gay Easter Egg Hunt and our most successful fete of all, the Ms. Fem and Mr. Butch Lafayette Pageant, And our Court was well represented in nearly every out of

town show during my reign as Emperor. I say hats off to the active members who endured and are still with us, for they will be the backbone of the new Court elected June 27. These people will band together immediatly after elections, with a common dream of a membership drive that will assure Lafayette of a top position in the Imperial Court System of Louisiana.

As for me, I have retreated to Baton Rouge, not leaving Lafayette totally behind for there will always be a place for them in my heart. I will work directly with Lafayette's Imperial Court as I still have many months to enjoy one of the two most prestigious of Imperial Court titles, that being the Emperor of Louisiana. All of my time will be turned now toward a goal of personal statewide correspondence with several throughout the State. I feel that in my position I need to gain the confidence of my fellow gays as a State leader and lend any assistance possible at any time.

Being crowned the first Emperor of Lafayette was a dream come true now that my reign has come to an end, may my succesor, the Emperor II of Lafayette absorb and take advantage of what you the gay community of Lafayette and Louisiana have to share.

The BODY SHOP BAR has been added to create extra service for Monroyans and their guest from Alex. Shreveport and Jackson, Miss. Keep watching us grow.


