Lasher refutes *Bible* myths

The Rev. Ralph Lasher hopes his article, "In God's name—Gays, Lesbians and the *Bible*", in the highly respected *Texas Observer* will finally begin a national debate about the destructive myth that God and the *Bible* hate gay men and lesbians.

Lasher's article appears in the April 2 "Gays in Texas" issue of the *Texas Observer*, the influential statewide political magazine where syndicated columnist Molly Ivins began her career.

"The homophobic *Bible* myth is the main reason many straight Americans despise us—and why too many rejected gays and lesbians drown themselves in alcohol and drugs," Lasher said.

"Only if we dare to discuss this 'sacred' cow in the national media can we make people aware that respected new *Bible* translations and many *Bible* scholars agree: Infamous *Bible* passages, such as the story of Sodom and

Gomorrah, do not condemn homosexuality. In fact, the Scriptures celebrate the love of David and Jonathan."

"20/20, *Maria Striver* show and all the positive national media stories this year have been afraid to touch this subject. So we have to begin the national debate or we will never, ever win equal rights or acceptance," he said.

The April 2 *Texas Observer* will feature articles from around the state, including such Houston leaders as openly gay *Houston Post* columnist Juan Palomo; Annise Parker on our relationship with the Houston Police Department; and attorneys Connie Moore and Debbie Hunt on gay and lesbian families. Other articles will cover AIDS and activism; gays on the "frontier" (West Texas, A&M, small towns); and other topics.

The magazine will be available at Houston gay & lesbian bookstores—Inklings, Lobo and Crossroads—as well as Brazos Bookstore.

DESIGNER/SEAMSTRESS- Special T-Shirts, smocks in fluorescent colors or otherwise identifying symbol will be needed for our security personnel and staff (20+ persons). These must be designed and created. Also banners or decorations identifying our bus fleet will be needed (2 sides X 5 busses, dimensions must be researched).

BUS CAPTAIN- Person to coordinate a fleet of 5 busses at tee tail end of the parade. Insure that the drivers know the route, the pick-up points, the location of the Park, the drop-off points. Insure that the identifying banners are properly attached and removed from each bus, as well as those advertisements of the sponsoring organizations. Coordinate the logistics with these sponsors.

POOD SERVICE CAPTAIN- Rally Chairs will contract these services and secure permits. The captain will insure that the contracts are maintained, that permits are in order and that booths are set up properly, as well as assist in any capacity the vendors may require.

ELECTRICAL/LIGHTING SUPERVISOR- Preferably a professional. Depending on approval of the City Parks pep., we may need to set up a generator to supply power to

with equipment provided such as radio communication. Special identifying garments will be worn. Duties to patrol the Park grounds during the Rally and report any suspicious activity to the proper authority. Assist Rally attendees with any help they may require, and refer them to the appropriate people. You will be the most conspicuous personnel present so you will receive the most inquiries. Know what going on!! (Volunteers from Q-Patrol & Garden Party already on board, but more will be needed).

CONTACT SERVICE LIAISON- Rally Chairs will secure the contracts and make the payments. Position responsible for insuring that service contracts (except food service and shuttle busses) are maintained as promised, that proper set-up and take down occurs on time. This may necessitate a visit to the Park the following day. Responsible for invoices, activities of BPI, PdQ Portable, Allen Ambulance Service, electrical rentals, Etc..

FIREWORKS FUNDRAISER- Volunteer will devise and implement methods to secure funds for the purchase of our fireworks display. This may include approaching individuals, businesses, bars, organizations or whatever means necessary. **NEEDED \$5250!** Half by 5-1-93, the remainder by showtime.

FOOD SERVICE CAPTAIN- Rally Chairs will contract these services and secure permits. The captain will insure that the contracts are maintained, that permits are in order and that booths are set up properly, as well as assist in any capacity the vendors may require.

ELECTRICAL/LIGHTING SUPERVISOR- Preferably a professional. Depending on approval of the City Parks pep., we may need to set up a generator to supply power to light the booths, or we may be able to utilize an existing system. Supervisor will determine necessities with the City personnel, design and implement a system, and assure its proper functioning during the Rally. This may include power requirements for food services also.

BOOTHS COORDINATOR- Volunteer will coordinate all booth applicants (except food services), insure that they set up correctly, on time, in the designated areas. This covers merchandise and information booths. Insure they have proper lighting as needed- coordinate with electrical supervisor. Applicants provide their own booth space.

CLEAN-UP CREW- Hopefully everyone will contribute to this necessity. We must monitor the trash bins throughout the Rally, emptying them as needed, and replacing the plastic linings, picking up trash during and after the Rally. Insure that Park grounds are clean when we leave so that we may recoup our deposit.

SECURITY CREW & CAPTAIN- Volunteers will work under official Parks or HP supervision, and

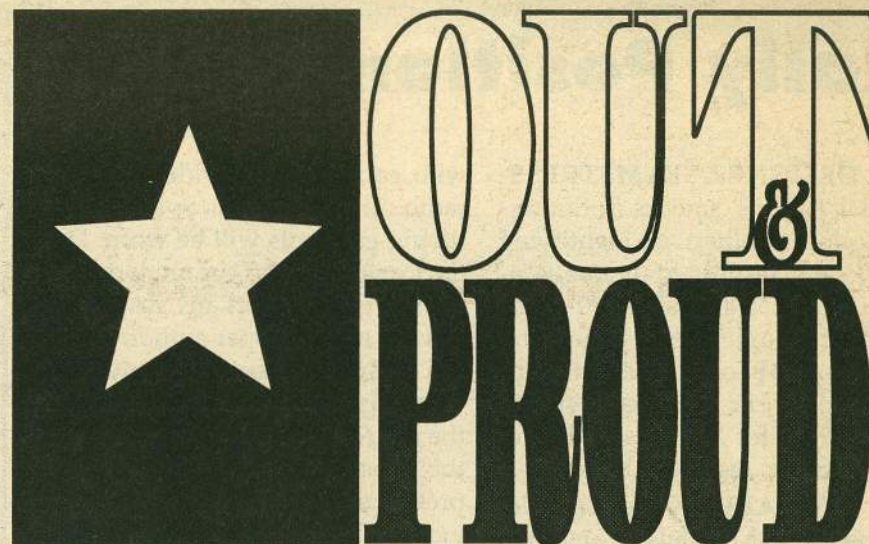

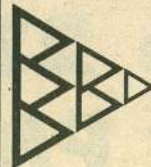

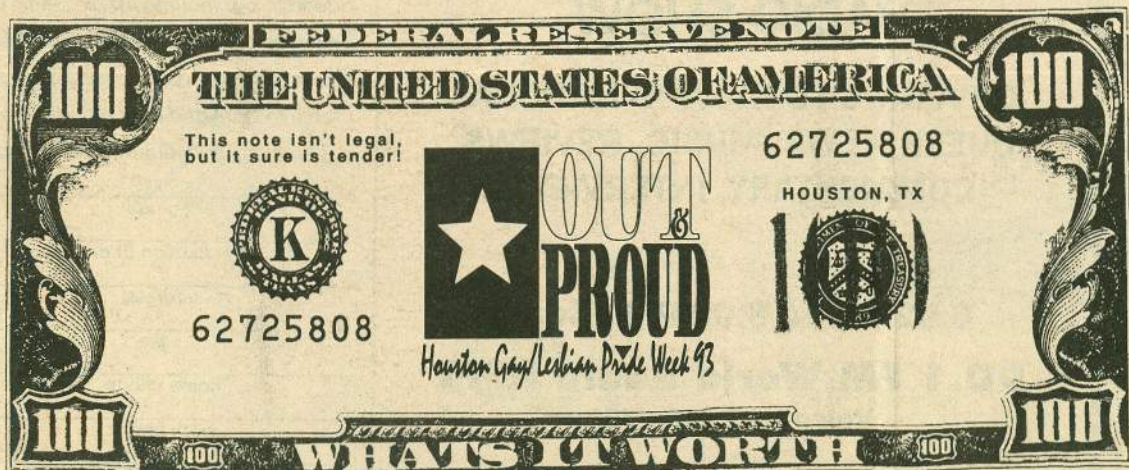
