On Friday, June 27, 1969, shortly before midnight, New York City Police led a raid on the Stonewall Inn, a gay bar on Christopher Street in the heart of Greenwich Village. The raid was only one occurring in a series of gay bars in New York. Similar raids were occurring in other cities throughout the country. But this time, as police led the patrons from the bar to paddywagons, the drag queens and other gay men and women fought back. A riot erupted as word spread. Beer cans, bottles, and rocks were heaved at the police in the street and the windows of the bar. The rioting continued for the next two nights. The event is widely regarded as the birth of the modern Gay and Lesbian rights movement.

"Silence to Celebration" describes our journey from invisibility to pride, whether personal, local, national, or global.

This year's logo shows us two symbols with which to compare the before and after. Looking at it, you wonder how anyone could stand to remain silent. But unfold it and there's a hundred more symbols in between, each representing a part of the process where the footing is slippery, the path unclear, and people wait with votes and jokes and misquotes to get us to stop: To turn around, go elsewhere, and hide.

But every year at the anniversary of the Stonewall Inn rebellion of 1969, we gather together and remind the forces that would have us remain silent that we won't. We are too many, too integral, too diverse, too fabulous to remain silent. So we celebrate.

If you are still in or just coming out of the closet, look through this book and see the events, businesses, organizations, and resources you have to help you on your way. No one has to be alone. It can be a rough trip.

Please note the advertisers, and give them your patronage. Recognize the need to help others through social, community, and political organizations. We still have a nation, a government, and a world to educate.

Maybe sometime in the future it will seem somewhat ridiculous even to have a gay and lesbian pride parade, because being gay or lesbian won't seem much different than being left-handed. It's a fact of nature. Why throw a parade? But, here in a western culture of the late 20th century, our week of pride is a necessity we cannot afford to do without. And during which we can have a lot of fun.

The Pride Committee of Houston, Inc. is the energetic group of people who meet year-round to develop and organize 10 days of Pride Week activities for our community. The group meets the first and third Tuesdays of every month. We organize fundraisers, sell merchandise, and do lots of planning and outreach all year-round. We are affiliated with other pride week organizers across the world through the International Association of Gay and Lesbian Pride Coordinators.

The Pride Committee is always in need of fresh ideas and talent to improve our Pride Week festivities.

Even with all of our wonderful volunteers it seems that each year as we grow, we need more support and an infusion of new energy. If you want to help make Houston's week of pride one of the best in the nation, come to one of our meetings held the third Tuesday of each month at 2700 Albany, Suite 304 or call the Pride Line at 713.529.6769. You are welcome to attend and see how you can lend your skills and talents.

Events

Active primarily February–April, this committee stimulates interest and gathers applications to schedule community activities during Pride Week for publication in the Pride Guide and other media releases. Lots of work, lots of fun, lots of opportunity to meet people and be “in the know.”

Fundraising

A year-round committee that thinks up and produces fun events which raise funds for the Pride Committee's operations budget. They also develop joint efforts with other non-profit organizations. Even if you want to be involved with only one project or event, come join us. Ideas are always welcomed.

Media/Outreach/Video

This committee outreaches locally, statewide, and nationally via print and broadcast media to let everyone know what the Pride Committee is doing. The committee also promotes interest in Gay and Lesbian Pride Week.

Mailouts

Every month we publish a newsletter and once a year we mail 5,000 Pride Guides. This committee learns the U.S. Postal Service routines, organizes mailout materials, provides motivational food and music for volunteers at the mailouts, and delivers bags of completed Pride mail to the Post Office.

Merchandising

This committee selects merchandise to sell, solicits bids, places orders, and coordinates sales parties. The group consists of people who like to meet new people. (Many of the bars have merchandise tables for our use.) With this group you can't help but have fun.

Newsletter

Once a month, throughout the year, the Pride Committee prints a newsletter. Members of this committee find out what is happening with the other committees and report on the progress and development of Pride Week and other community activities. The committee solicits advertising, designs, and produces the newsletter. This is a great opportunity for anyone interested in writing articles or gaining valuable experience with periodical print media.

Pride Guide

Once a year the Pride Committee publishes the Pride Guide. (You're reading one now.) The publication is distributed in June to promote Pride Week. It contains a Resource Guide that is a listing of local organizations and services. This committee solicits advertising to offset its costs, gathers and develops content, designs, produces, and distributes the 15,000 guides. If you've ever wanted to gain large-scale print media experience, then this committee is for you.

Parade

This committee is in charge of hundreds of people marching down Westheimer. This committee seeks sponsorships, obtains insurance, organizes with the police and the health department, arranges cleanup, obtains city permits, sends applications to participants, organizes parade volunteers, finds judges, assembles reviewing stands, handles street decorations, trophies, and pride committee transportation, orders banners, and... This committee needs many people with strong organization and communications skills to make it work.

PrideFest '95

This group isn't happy unless there's a huge party waiting to reward our marchers and attendees after the parade. They find entertainment, solicit vendors, decorate the grounds—coordinating its efforts with the Parade Committee.

Volunteers

Throughout the year, this group coordinates volunteers for mailouts, merchandising events, fundraising events and most particularly during Pride Week. Participating in this committee means greeting new volunteers, getting to know them, and helping them discover where their talents and skills can best be used.







The Houston Area Teen Coalition of Homosexuals (H.A.T.C.H.) was formed as a support group for youth who identified themselves as lesbian or gay.

H.A.T.C.H.'s vision is to achieve a climate of societal acceptance and understanding without regard to sexual identity. The mission of H.A.T.C.H. is to provide safe social environments for homosexual youth, offer role models and peer support, and sponsor educational and community outreach opportunities to empower homosexual youth to become positive contributors.

The organization offers several support groups every Friday evening. One is an Open Discussion Group for those youth who want share their immediate concerns; a second group, Gay/Lesbian Issues, is for those who wish to explore areas of concern to gay and lesbian youth. Parents are invited to H.A.T.C.H. to learn more about the organization and to talk about their concerns for being a parent of a gay or lesbian teen. On Sundays, there is an opportunity to discuss topics and/or see a film or video tape that provokes discussion on gay and lesbian topics.

Members from the community offer their experiences and knowledge to the youth in numerous areas, to include employment and career options, personal relations, health and AIDS education, art and entertainment, PFLAG, sports, family issues and many others. H.A.T.C.H. youth gain insight and peer support through sharing these experiences.

H.A.T.C.H. directors and facilitators continue to contact area school counselors, teachers and administrators to advocate gay and lesbian issues. Due to high suicide rates and self-esteem issues amongst gay/lesbian youth, it is H.A.T.C.H.'s objective to promote public education and public awareness of the personal rights and civil liberties of the homosexual community.

In 1994, H.A.T.C.H. had the opportunity to sponsor and/or participate in school programs, workshops and conferences. The youth have presented their experiences dealing with being a gay or lesbian teenager, and dealing with their heterosexual counterparts. Conferences have included: the Houston Psychological Association Continuing Education Workshop, PFLAG Healing the Hurt Conference, Houston Independent School District Inservice for Secondary Counselors and many others.

As a support group for gay/lesbian youth in Houston, H.A.T.C.H. is unique. No other organization in the city targets its services to this group. As such it deserves the support of the entire community. H.A.T.C.H. was established as a 501(c)(3) in the state of Texas. For more information contact the H.A.T.C.H. line at (713) 942-7002.

Mother was born July 13th, 1909. No one suspected back then that this little girl would grow up to be a person who was continually pushing the envelope of gay rights, long before the phrase became popular.

In World War II mother was a registered nurse, volunteering in the U.S. Army Nurse Corps at the rank of Lieutenant. She was sent to Wales and England to help set up hospitals and attend to the wonderful service members from 1943–1945.

At 38 she had my older brother. At 39 she went back to school. At 40 she had me. She balanced the demands of school and caring for children with the help of family friends. She eventually earned her Master's degree in Clinical Psychology.

Mother has since made a life assisting people and helping them achieve their potential. She has worked on every ward in a hospital, worked with the mentally challenged, provided home care for some who could not afford to attend a hospital. She has been a student counselor for the HISD school system and counselor with Texas Vocational Rehabilitation.

She has lived a life of complete non-discrimination. She started the first integrated Cub Scout Pack, which eventually became a full-fledged Boy Scout Troop. She has been involved with literacy programs, with Literacy Advance, with the Houston Interfaith Hunger Coalition Program, and with VISTA as a volunteer assigned to Houston Metropolitan Mission. She taught Red Cross classes in babysitting at a Public Housing Projects.

For the gay rights movement Annelle has been a devoted spokesperson and volunteer. In 1978 she began her involvement after learning she had a gay son. Since then she has been tireless in her efforts to forward the cause.

She has appeared twice before city council on behalf of gay and lesbian concerns, coordinated a Parents of Gays group, made guest appearances on Channels 2, 11, 13, & 26 as well as a number radio interviews. She has spoken to several groups, including a Sunday school class, and groups with the University of Houston and Texas A&M. She has taken part in several programs for Parenting of Gays and Lesbians and has maintained a Crisis Hot Line for parents of gays and lesbians.

I can't think of a better year for Annella to receive this honor, when the logo is "Silence to Celebration." Annella was years ahead of her peers in 1978. At a time when most parents willfully remained silent, Annella celebrated our lives and loved us as we were. I am very fortunate to have a wonderful mother like Annella. And Houston's community is also fortunate to have such a wonderful person as one of our most faithful and long-term supporters.

Don Gill was born August 25, 1951. He is originally from Shreveport, Louisiana, but grew up in Leesville. He was the youngest of nine children and considers this a contributing factor to his ability to love more than one person at the same time. His family were simple people who lived in the country on a farm. His father could not read, but Don considers his dad to be one of the smartest men he has known. He was a gentleman who believed in hard work and loved his family deeply. A little of this must have rubbed off on his youngest son, Don, because Don is a gentleman himself.

Don moved to Houston in May of 1970, where he began his career as a hair dresser. During his stay in Houston he broke away from hair dressing to work with Stewart & Stevenson Oil Tool Equipment. In 1982 he returned to hair dressing, opening up his own salon on Westheimer called Hair Plus by Don. That location no longer exists. Don sold the current Hair Plus on West Gray in June of 1991, after which he opened a salon in his home called studio 911.

During his life Don has acted as caregiver to two lovers who have died of AIDS, and has housed five friends living with AIDS in his own.

Don was one of the founding members of Houston's Annual Fantasy Ball, a local Halloween event, and he is also a member of Wolfpack. In 1993 he was selected as Mr. Pre-Parade '93, Montrose Mining Company's Bear of the Month for March '93, Daddy of Montrose '93 and Mr. Venture-N '93. In 1994 Don was selected as Mr. Prime Choice. In this title Don raised over \$23,000 for local charities and organizations.




