## Great Moments in Houston's Gay Pride History

- 1975 Houston's GLBT Political Caucus is founded
- 1979 Houston's first official Gay Pride Parade is held in Montrose
- 1982 AIDS Foundation Houston opens its doors
- 1984 Mayor Kathy Whitmire announces the first city proclamation for Gay Pride Week
- 1991 Pride Committee founded and eventually incorporates as a 501(c)3 organization
- 1993 PFLAG Houston is named the first organizational grand marshal for the Pride Parade
  - Gay Yellow Pages® becomes the first registered trademark using "gay" and/or "lesbian"
- 1999 Gulf Coast Archives and Museum of GLBT History is founded
- 2003 Lawrence v. Texas 539 U.S. 558
- 2005 Montrose Clinic and The Assistance Fund merge to form Legacy Community Health Services
- 2009 Houston becomes the largest U.S. city to elect an openly gay mayor, Annise Parker
- 2010 Gay Pride Parade becomes second-largest in the city with over 150,000 attendees

Dear Friends,

The Mature Market Institute has since continued its partnership with SAGE. In March 2010 they followed up the "Out and Aging" study with a new study, "Still Out, Still Aging" and a second project, "Planning Tips for LGBT Individuals and Couples." SAGE recently honored MetLife with its first Corporate Leadership Award.

As a corporate sponsor of the National Gay & Lesbian Chamber of Commerce (NGLCC), MetLife promotes partnership with local LGBT companies. MetLife encourages employees and affiliates to take advantage of the benefits and opportunities available through NGLCC local affiliates.

The corporate-sponsored employee affinity group Gay, Lesbians and Allies at MetLife (GLAM) was formally recognized in 2004. The group's primary goals are to raise awareness of gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender issues at MetLife, to provide a forum for discussing issues important to the MetLife LGBT community and to organize and attend events that advance LGBT causes.


For these reasons and so many more, I'm proud to represent a company that understands and cares about the needs of the LGBT community.

We had just launched our Gay Yellow Pages smart phone app two weeks before and it was thrilling to see people holding up their iPhones and shouting, "I just downloaded the app!"

The proudest moment of my career in publishing was in 1997 when I got a phone call from a Spanish speaking mother in San Antonio. She called to thank me for publishing the Gay Yellow Pages. She was able to find help in our Resources Guide for her young gay son who wanted to commit suicide. She told me we had "saved her son's life." In that moment, I learned the value and importance of the work that we've done here at GLYP for over 20 years.


