
Mitama Matsuri (Festival) → P.68



The East Gardens of the Imperial Palace

The Imperial Palace's gardens in which Honmaru, Ninomaru and Sannomaru have been preserved. This area has Teshu-dai and Yagura, reminders of the Edo period, and it's the most historical area in the Imperial Palace. This urban area with rich nature is well-known as a place for strolling and resting. A Lunchtime Concert at the East Gardens of the Imperial Palace will be held 10 times a year, and it's popular because people can enjoy a concert over lunch for free of charge.

Ninomaru Garden

There used to be a garden in Ninomaru designed by Kobori Enshu, a master of tea ceremony, architect and garden designer and repaired by order of Tokugawa Iemitsu in the Edo period. However, it was destroyed by repeated fires. The current circuit style garden is the one restored based on the garden plan drawn in the time of Tokugawa Ieshige. There is an iris garden with the atmosphere of Edo in a part of the Garden. The irises will be at their best in late May - June.



Ote-mon Gate



The Ote-mon Gate was the main gate of the Edo Castle. Daimyos used the gate to attend ceremonies held inside the castle. The square-shaped gate was designed to slow the intruders' advance after their going through the Korai-mon Gate. There was an arsenal called Watariyagura-mon Gate on the right.

Tenshu-dai



The castle tower was built by Tokugawa Ieyasu in 1606, by Tokugawa Hidetada in 1622 and by Tokugawa Iemitsu in 1638. It was a symbol of shogunate power. However, it was destroyed by the Great Fire in 1657, and only the base of the main tower is left now.

Fujimi-yagura



Yagura was used as a substitute after the castle tower was destroyed by the Great Fire in 1657.

It's a three-story fortified tower located at the southern tip of the former Honmaru. Since it looks the same from all the directions, it's called a "fortified tower with only the front". It is reported the Fujimi

Hyaku-nin-bansho Guardhouse



The guardhouse positioned in the most critical point to guard the entrance to the Honmaru (the main compound) and Ninomaru of the Edo Castle. Four teams (Negoro-gumi, Iga-gumi, Koga-gumi and Nijugoki-gumi), each consisting of 20 Yoriki and 100 Doshin stationed the house in shifts day and night.

Sannomaru Shozokan

Art pieces such as paintings, calligraphies and craft works owned by the Imperial family are displayed in this museum. Currently, about 9,800 art pieces like famous Chinese paintings as well as paintings by Jakuchū Itō and Hokusai Katsushika, lacquer crafts after the Muromachi period, sculptures by Koun Takamura and Choun Yamazaki in the Meiji period, modern paintings and modern Japanese paintings are stored here. There is no permanent exhibition. The content of exhibitions will change by period.

Kokyo Gaien National Garden Highlights

Kokyo Gaien National Garden is a national garden, developed centering on the Square in front of the Imperial Palace where black pines are planted. The Garden is the special historical site and one of the reservoirs of many historical remains.

Nijubashi Bridge

The elegant stone bridge seen in front of the Imperial Palace. Sometimes the two bridges, the "Stone Bridge" in the foreground and "Steel Bridge" in the background are collectively called Nijubashi Bridge. To be more specific, Nijubashi Bridge is the bridge in the background. The bridge is used only for a congratulatory visit to the Imperial Palace in the new year and official events of the Imperial Court such as foreign guests' visit to the Imperial Palace.



Statue of KUSUNOKI Masashige



The equestrian statue of KUSUNOKI Masashige, a loyal retainer, known as "Nanko". This statue represents Nanko awaiting the return of the Emperor, Go-Daigo in Hyogo from exile in the Oki island in 1333. The Nanko Rest House near the statue is a restaurant and an information office.

Wadakura Fountain Park

A fountain park near Wadakra-bori Moat was built in 1961. There are waterfalls and streams that provide a variety of views. The fountain lit up at night creates a fantastic atmosphere. There is also a free rest house on the terrace in the park.

Sakurada-mon Gate



National Important Cultural Property. It's one of the castle gates that still have a square-shaped gate, and it was also called Odawara Exit because it was the starting point of Odawara Kaido. In 1860, there was the "Incident Outside the Sakurada-mon Gate" in which Ii Naosuke, Tairō was assassinated.

The gate is officially called "Soto Sakurada-mon Gate of the former Edo Castle" and a designated

Wadakura Fountain Park Restaurant

The restaurant directly operated by Palace Hotel. The building looks like the Opera House facing the fountain. It's an open space with a 8-meter high ceiling. Buffet-style lunch and afternoon tea are available at the restaurant.

Kitanomaru Garden

There used to be Kitanomaru of the former Edo Castle here, and currently it's a forest garden. There are well-kept lawns and a large pond, which are surrounded by many deciduous trees such as Japanese Maple, Zelkova serrata, Quercus serrata, and Sawtooth oak. There is also a "Green Adventure Course" in which people can enjoy names of various trees through quizzes in the garden. Also, there are many cultural and art facilities such as Science Museum, The National Museum of Modern Art, Tokyo, and Nippon Budokan around the garden. The garden is one of Chiyoda City's most famous spots for cherry blossom viewing.

Science Museum



A comprehensive museum of science technology and industrial technology. Modern and near-term science technology and industrial technology are introduced here. The exhibitions are based on experiences, so you can deepen your knowledge

on science technology by enjoying seeing and touching them. A variety of experiment shows are being held here. In the Waku Eco Motor Land exhibition, you can experience driving various types of vehicles in simulators.

Tayasu-mon Gate



Tayasu-mon Gate facing Yasukuni-dori Ave. on the north side of the Kitanomaru district is the entrance of Kitanomaru

Garden and Nippon Budokan. The current gate was built in 1636. It's the oldest among the existing remains of the former Edo Castle and designated as a National Important Cultural Property.

Shimizu-mon Gate



It was one of the gates to enter Kitanomaru of the Edo Castle, and a National Important Cultural Property. At a corner of Shimizu-mon Gate, there is Gangizaka which is the same as that in the Edo period. Gangizaka has steep stone steps with high-level differences. The current one was rebuilt in 1658.

Nippon Budokan

It was constructed as the venue for martial arts of the Tokyo Olympics held in 1964. It's also known as a venue for various types of events and concerts. The building was designed based on Yumedono, Horyuji Temple, and it features the elegant octagonal shape and copperplate-thatched roof. The curves of the roof represent the ridges of Mt. Fuji.

Museum collection guide

The National Museum of Modern Art, Tokyo

Japan's first national art museum. The collection of more than 13,000 works includes many National Important Cultural Properties such as Taikan Yokoyama's and Shunsho Hishida's, and it's one of the largest in Japan. By seeing MOMAT's collection that displays about selected 200 works from the collection, you can trace the history of Japanese arts over 100 years from the beginning of the 20th Century. The viewing program in which the museum guides and visitors talk about some works and the view from "A Room With a View" are popular.

Former Imperial Guards Headquarters

It was built as the Former Imperial Guards Headquarters in 1910. It's characterized by the contrast of red bricks and white stone material, and rhythmically designed wall with lined thin buttress (auxiliary walls). This building was used as Crafts Gallery of the National Museum of Modern Art, Tokyo. However, since the museum was relocated to Kanazawa City, Ishikawa Prefecture in 2020, it was closed and only the building remains here.

Chidori-ga-fuchi

Chidori-ga-fuchi is nationally famous for its beautiful cherry blossoms. About 260 cherry trees such as Someiyoshino and Oshima will bloom along the 700-meter long Chidori-ga-fuchi Green Way in spring. They look like a tunnel of cherry blossoms.



Hibiya Park

The first modern Western-style park in Japan built in 1903. This park is a green oasis in a business district. The Grand Fountain and Flower Gardens as well as the Pond in the Japanese Garden have been maintained here. Fresh green leaves, flowers and trees such as maple trees can give pleasure to those who visit the park from season to season. There are the Public Hall, Concert Halls, Library in the park and various events will be held throughout a year.

Grand Fountain

The Grand Fountain is a symbol of Hibiya Park. It consists of three layers of spout rings. The bottom spout ring is 30 meters in diameter, and throws water up to a height of about 12 meters. Visitors can enjoy various shapes of water that change in 28-min cycle from 8:00 to 21:00. The fountain is lit up at night.



First Flower Garden Second Flower Garden

There are the First Flower Garden with geometrical patterns and the Second Flower Garden near spacious lawns. Especially, the First Flower Garden was very popular for foreign flowers such as tulips, pansies, and roses which were rare at the time of the opening in the Meiji period.

Hibiya Public Hall



A Japanese representative outdoor music hall loved by many people. It has been used for the concerts of various artists as a venue of an open-air concert surrounded by trees in the center of Tokyo.

Hibiya Mitsuke Remains / Shinji Pond



Hibiya Mitsuke was one of the gates (mitsuke) of the Edo Castle. Currently, only part of the stone wall is left. The vestige of the moat is left in the Shinji Pond. Seen from above, the pond looks like the shape of the kanji character meaning "heart". Pine trees protected from snow with Yukizuri technique are one of the park's features in winter.

Kubi-kake (head-staking) Ginkgo



A large ginkgo with 7-meter trunk girth (estimated tree age: 400-500 years old). It was located at the intersection of Hibiya before. But when it was to be cut down due to road expansion, Dr. Seiroku Honda, the designer of Hibiya Park saved it, saying, "I will have it transplanted here, even if my head is put on a stake."

Kumogata Pond



A cloud-shaped pond. The "Crane Fountain", the third oldest decorative fountain in Japan is put in the center of the pond. The old copper crane spreading its wings is impressive. Autumn leaves, fresh green and wisteria trellis are eye-catching.



Tokyo Midtown Hibiya

A large complex facility with about 60 stores including TOHO CINEMAS Hibiya, one of the largest cinema complexes in the center of Tokyo. It features the graceful architectural design with the concept of a theater space-based city. Various kinds of events will be held in the three-story atrium and outdoor square.

This underground shopping arcade was built based on the Sanshin Building Arcade that was located here. The modern design mixed with the memories of the town is one of the highlights.

This Market is designed to look like a miniature town, with separate retail stores ranging from a clothes shop, bookstore, izakaya, barber to a coffee shop. You will be excited, feeling like exploring a market in a strange land as you walk through this trendy space.

The Diet shall be the highest organ of national power and the sole law-making organ of the nation. The current building was completed in 1936. It is an architecturally beautiful building that attracts many visitors every year.

The National Diet Building is made up of the House of Representatives and the House of Councillors. It's a magnificent building made of granites, and the interior decoration is also worth seeing. taking you to the House Chamber, Emperor's Room and Central Hall. You will be guided by a Diet guard in the tour, so you will never get lost in the large National Diet Building.

The Front Park of the Diet Building Parliamentary Museum

It isn't well known that there is a park with rich greenery in front of the National Diet Building. There are North Garden and South Garden, and the total area is about 50,000 m². Grass and trees that bloom from season to season are planted, and you would be so surprised with the rich nature that you can't believe that you are in the center of Tokyo.

The Front Park of the Diet Building

It was established on the hill where daimyos' residences were located in the Edo period. There are beautiful trees such as about 120 cherry trees that delight the eye.

There are South Garden and North Garden, and Parliamentary Museum that explains the system of the Diet and politics, and the history.

South Garden / Japanese Garden

There is a waterscape such as a stream and waterfall, and a gazebo near a pond in the garden. You can calmly stroll around the garden in a quiet atmosphere, hearing birds singing.



North Garden / Western-style Garden

A Western-style garden where many trees such as about 100 dogwoods donated by the US government in return for the cherry trees donated to Washington D. C. by Ozaki Yukio have grown. There are the Clock Tower, Sakura Well that was in front of Ii family's residence, and the Instrument Shelter for Origin of the Japanese Vertical Control Network which stores Japan vertical data that determine the heights above the sea level throughout Japan. Also, you can enjoy the views of the Imperial Palace and Marunouchi here.

Clock Tower

There are the clocks that represent the separation of the three powers, legislature, executive, and judiciary on the three sides of the tower. The chimes can be heard three times a day. Out of the chimes, 10:00 is the start time for the regular session of the House of Councillors, and 13:00 is the start time for the regular session of the House of Representatives.

Parliamentary Museum

An exhibition facility standing on the site of residences where Kato Kiyomasa and Ii Naosuke, the Tairō (chief minister) lived before. It was opened in 1972. The organization and management of the Diet are explained through materials and video here. There is a statue of Ozaki Yukio, the "father of parliamentary politics" at the entrance.

The State Guest House, Akasaka Palace

The State Guest House, Akasaka Place was the only palace in Japan that was built based on the neo-Baroque style as Togu Goshō in 1909. After the World War II, it became the State Guest House and an important diplomatic place to welcome honored guests such as Kings and Presidents from abroad. After the massive repair work in 2009, it was designated as a National Treasure, and the building interior with graceful decorations is open to the public. You can see the main building, Japanese style annex and the garden. The admission fees are different depending on the area. The Main Building of the former Ministry of Justice

The neo-Baroque style building of the former Ministry of Justice designed by the two German architects, Mr. Ende and Böckmann was completed in 1895. The building was destroyed by fire during the war, but it was restored to its original appearance in 1994. It's called the red-brick building, and the official residence dining hall for the former Ministers of Justice and others are open to the public as the exhibition rooms for judicial affairs related materials. The external appearance was designated as a National Important Cultural Property.

The Story of Bancho

Many writers and artists lived in the area around Bancho in the Meiji, Taisho, and Showa periods. The avenue that connects Kojimachi-Odori St. and Otsuma-dori Ave. is so called Bancho Bunjin-dori Ave., where Toson Shimazaki, Kyoka Izumi, Takeo Arishima, Tekkan Yosano, Tsuguharu Foujita, etc. lived. This place was a source for culture. Currently, sign plates are installed in the sites of the former residences.

Iidabashi / Kudan Area



This area surrounded by the Uchibori (Inner) and Sotobori (Outer) Moats of the Edo Castle still has a tranquil atmosphere, though it is in the center of Tokyo. The Sotobori Moat built in the Edo period still exists, and the stone walls and banks remind us of that time. In the Meiji period, the universities that still exist were founded one after another in this area, where many notable figures studied.


Existing banks of Sotobori (Outer) Moat


A place famous for cherry blossoms



What is Kagurazaka like?

When you cross Ushigome Bridge from the west exit of JR Iidabashi Station, you will find a shopping street on the slope. Kagurazaka has flourished as a stylish town which reflects the times. After the Meiji period, the shopping street has rapidly developed because of the opening of Ushigome Station of Kobo Railway.

It flourished as an amusement center at the beginning of the Showa period. Persons of letters and students gathered here, and it became a culturally developed town. The shopping street is still lively and there are international gourmet shops that attract even foreign tourists at the back street.



Chidorigafuchi National Cemetery



Kanda-Jimbocho has the largest antiquarian book district in Japan or the world. The number of bookstores is about 180. It's a large book district with many large and small bookstores which sell new books as well as the ones which sell old books. There are many coffee shops where you can read books and famous unique curry shops in the district.


When you walk to the west from the intersection of Surugadai-shita on Yasukuni-dori Avenue, you will find antiquarian and new-book bookstores standing side by side. The bookstores stand facing the north to prevent books from yellowing on the south side of the street. There are large general bookstores and small bookstores in the district. Especially, most antiquarian bookstores tend to sell specialized books such as old maps in the Edo period, woodblock prints like ukiyo-e, precious books in the Meiji, Taisho, and Showa periods, and comic books. This town is filled with the history of Japanese books.

Speaking of a China town, many people think of Yokohama and Kobe. Though this isn't well known today, there was a China town in Jimbocho from the end of the Meiji period to the Showa period. As the number of foreign students from Asian countries increased, educational institutions, boarding-house and restaurant districts were built. Those restaurants such as "Yosukosaikan" founded in the Meiji period, "Kanyoro" Shu Onrai used to visit when he studied in Japan, and "Shinsekai-saikan" founded in 1946 still remain. You can enjoy the taste of long-established Chinese restaurants. That's one of the attractions of Jimbocho.



Coffee Shops in Jimbocho



When you stroll around a back alley of Jimbocho, a book town, you will find nostalgic Showa retro shops such as long-established coffee shops, authentic coffee shops, and jazz cafes. The number of coffee shops increased because the spaces to read books were needed.

"Ladrio" that is said to be the oldest in this area was opened in 1949. Milonga Nueva was opened as a tango coffee shop. "Sabouru" which has a unique atmosphere is still a popular coffee shop. The inside of "Koseto Coffee Shop" is an art space. PIANO FORTE is a classical music cafe. How about finding your favorite coffee shop and enjoying reading there?



Soseki Natsume

Among restaurants in Kanda-Awajicho and Sudacho, there are many long-established restaurants intellectuals visited frequently.

It is said Soseki Natsume liked Western-style mixed vegetables and seafood tempura of Shoeitei. The omelet-shaped fried dish with a lot of meat and onions is said to have been developed at the request of Soseki. It has been the specialty of this restaurant.



Shotaro Ikenami

Shotaro Ikenami, a historical novel writer is also known as a gourmet. He visited this area frequently. It is said he liked the omelet-shaped fried dish and potato salad as well as Ankou-nabe from Isegen, Chicken sukiyaki from Botan, handmade soba from Kanda Matsuya. Also, he liked fried Manju and Awa Zenzai from Takemura.



Kanda Yabusoba

A soba restaurant established in 1880. It's the main store of Yabusoba that has kept the tradition of Edomae soba, and one of three branch Yabu families. "Sotoichi Soba" with 90.9% buckwheat flour and 9.1% binding agent is thin and shiny. If you dip the soba into thick soup and suck in noodles, you will feel the soba going down your throat smoothly.



Akihabara Electric Town

Akihabara has developed as time goes by—from the home appliance sales boom in the high economic growth period to the PC/multi-media period and prosperous period for the contents industry. The most advanced products and technology information have gathered here, so Akihabara has been garnering attention around the world.

From the black market after the war to the leading electric town in the world History of Akihabara

1 The origin of the name, Akihabara

The origin of the name, Akihabara dates back to the Meiji period. The area around Akihabara has been the key point for transportation since the Edo period. There were many fires at that time. When there was a big fire and Akihabara was burnt down by the fire in 1869, the burnt-out field was left as a firebreak and Akiba Shrine (currently located in Taito City) was founded there. Since then, it has been called "Akibanohara" or "Akibappara" which means Akiba's field.

2 The black market after the war changed into an electric town

In 1890, Akihabara Station, a freight station was established in the field. Since Akihabara has railways and arterial roads, it became a logistics base, and assembly and sales of telecommunication equipment and radio parts became prosperous. It was burnt down because of the World War II, but electric businessmen gathered here shortly after the war, and an electric town of street stalls was established. This town became a radio department and was developed into the Akihabara Electric Town.

3 Developed into one of the largest electric town in the world through the home appliance sales boom



Akihabara in 1968

Japanese home appliance sales boom started with the Three Sacred Treasures of black-and-white TVs, washing machines, and refrigerators in 1950s or 1960s. Various kinds of home appliances, audios and games appeared one after another, and Akihabara Electric Town had its best days. Japanese home appliances came to have a world-class quality and became popular among foreigners. In the second half of 1970s, microcomputer shops appeared, and junk shops that sell used parts also appeared.

4 Developed into Akiba, a holy ground for pop culture



Became a holy place for pop culture

In 1990s, Akihabara changed into a computer town and became the town that has the most advanced multi-media. As the computer lovers called geeks who had visited Akihabara seeking for computer parts expanded their interests into games, anime and model figures, Akihabara developed into the town of contents industry. The geek culture got popularized, and Akihabara came to be known as a source of pop culture.





Shrines

There are historical shrines that thrived under the patronage of the Tokugawa Shogunate around the Edo Castle. Traditional festivals are also popular.

This shrine was founded in the early Kamakura period. The shrine is famous for Sanno Festival, one of the largest festivals of Edo. In the Shinko Festival that is to be held every other year, about 300-meter parade walking through streets is magnificent.


Hirakawa Tenmangu Shrine [→ P30]

What's Izakaya?

Izakaya means the Japanese-style bar the general public in Japan visit for drinking. Office workers often visit izakayas at the end of a day to heal fatigue of the day and deepen communication with their colleagues. Japanese people don't eat expensive Japanese cuisine or Kaiseki every day. How about enjoying Izakaya where you can drink sake and eat Japanese dishes at a reasonable price? You can learn about Japanese drinking culture there.



Bar Districts in Chiyoda City

Chiyoda City situated in the center of Tokyo is one of the largest office towns in Japan. When the night falls, office worker finish their work and go drinking. So there are bar districts where many Izakayas gather here and there. Some famous bar districts will be introduced below. You might find a deep side of Tokyo in the bar districts.

Kanda

Kanda is called a "town for salaried workers" because there are many company offices in Kanda. Many Izakayas gather around the north and west exits of JR Kanda Sta. There are a wide variety of Izakayas ranging from cheap ones to high-quality ones suitable for entertaining clients in multi-tenant buildings or under the tracks of the Sta. Some Izakayas carefully select ingredients and others serve Japanese local cuisines, which are nostalgic to those who came to Tokyo for work and popular among them.



Yurakucho

There are many Izakayas under the track between Yurakucho Sta. and Shimbashi Sta. on JR Yamanote Line. Many people visit the bars on Friday night, so every store is full. Those bars tend to serve side dishes at a reasonable price.




Step 1 Select an Izakaya.

General Izakayas have various types of alcoholic drinks and a variety of side dishes. Sometimes Izakaya featuring Yakitori (grilled chicken) is called Yakitoriya and Izakaya featuring Oden is called Odenya. There are various types of Izakayas ranging from common-type to high-class. First, you need to decide what you want to eat, then select a store that suits your budget.

Step 2 Order a drink.

When you enter an Izakaya and have a seat, you will be asked what you want to drink. Most Japanese people answer, "Beer as a starter!" It sounds like a magic password. However, general Izakayas have a wide variety of alcoholic drinks like distilled spirit, sake, whiskey, wine, etc. as well as beer. They also have non-alcoholic drinks and soft drinks.



Step 3 A compulsory appetizer will be served.

Some stores serve a small compulsory appetizer you don't order. The appetizer is just like a greeting by the store or a small dish to satisfy customers until the ordered dishes are served. However, it's not a free service and you will be charged when you pay the check. This is unique to Japan. Please take this as a venue cost or table charge.



Step 4 Order side dishes that will be served quickly.

It's boring to have only alcoholic drinks while you are waiting for side dishes to come. So you should order side dishes that will be served quickly such as green soybeans, cold Tofu, pickles and prepared cooked dishes. It would be good to ask staff about side dishes that will be served quickly.

Step 5 Order side dishes

Next, order various types of side dishes. You should ask staff about signature dishes or recommended dishes. It would be also good to ask about seasonal food. Various types of dishes such as broiled fish, cooked food, fried food, food cooked in a pot and Sashimi (sliced raw fish) are lined up in the menu. Japanese people like fried chicken, fried potatoes, seasonal fish Sashimi, broiled arabesque greenling, etc. In winter season, food cooked in a pot is popular.

Step 6 Order a finishing dish

Ordering a finishing dish such as a rice dish at the end even if you are full is a Japanese-style. Some Izakayas have Ramen and Udon noodles as well as boiled rice with tea and rice balls. Since each dish has a small portion, people can have a rice dish after having a few dishes. That indicates Japanese people like rice.



Now you understand part of Japanese food culture, don't you? Try various types of Izakayas and learn about Japanese taste. You might meet new people with whom you can hit it off through drinking.






