NOTHING HUMAN IS ALIEN TO US

BEATINGS AND STABBINGS
CONTINUE AT LEE PARK

I have just returned from the Emergency Room at Parkland Hospital, where 40 stiches were sewn into my chest to close a two inch deep knife wound. There are four stiches in my chin, and eight in the back of my head, the result of being kicked and stomped while on the ground. My jaw is fractured, and it is extremely painful for me to talk, swallow, move or even breathe. Fortunately my jaw will not have to be wired, but the left side of my face is swollen, and there are multiple bruises all over my body. Painful as it is to write this, I feel I must, as a warning to others of the dangers of



LONGHAIRS ARRESTED, CONVICTED,
AND FINED. APPEAL PLANNED

The Reverend Bob Jones and Bill May, both of the Universal Free Church, were arrested for trespassing Aug. 30th after they had picketed Goff's Hamburgers, 5207 W. Lovers Lane in an attempt to test whether or not the owner can refuse service because of the length of one's hair. The men were placed in county jail and later released on \$300 bond each.

CUR COMMUNITY was told that on Saturday, August 28, before the Monday of the men's arrest, Judge Robert Cole appeared on the scene of the picketing and informed Jones and May that in his opinion the men were guilty of disorderly conduct, and that if arrested they would face a high bond.

At the trial before the same Justice of the Peace Robert Cole, Harvy Gough, owner of Goff's Hamburgers, testified that he maintains a policy not to serve anyone who is an avowed communist, or who is dirty, shabbily clothed, or longhaired, in his eating establishment. However, when asked by Asst. Dist. Atty. Robert Whaley if he would have served Jones and May had they been properly attired, Gough replied, "I wouldn't serve those two if they were baldheaded and wearing tuxedos."

During the trial, May testified that he and Jones went to Goff's specially because they had heard about the I must, as a warning to others of the dangers of Lee Park.

Early Sunday morning, around 2 am, September 12, I left friends and was walking home. I did not enter Lee Park, but was walking on the sidewalk, on the righthand side of Hall street, going south of Turtle Creek. A man stepped from the shadows of a tree and asked me for a light. When I replied that I had none, three other men jumped me. One man placed a gun at my throat and I was forced into the park. They beat me to the ground, kicked, and stomped me. They ripped off my shirt and demanded my wallet and boots. Finding only one dollar, one of my attackers cooly said, "You're not going to like what I'm going to do to you." I was then stabbed in the chest. Desperately trying to shield myself from the slashing knife, I was cut on the chin, hand, and neck. Fighting for my life, I somehow was able to break away and run to my apartment nearby.

Fortunately two policemen live in the apartment next to mine. One applied a compress to my chest in an effort to stop the massive bleeding while the other called an ambulance. In shock and almost unconsious, I was rushed to Parkland Hospital where I was in the Emergency Room for almost four hours. The doctor attending my injuries, commented that another man had been stabbed in Lee Park earlier the same night. I efore I left, still another man who had been brutally beaten in Lee Park was brought in.

The police who questioned me at length were not hostile, but seemed genuinely interested in finding my sadistic, cowardly attackers. They asked me if these men were "hippies"? They were not. These were clean-cut white men in their late teens or 20's. The police never asked me if I was gay.

This was not an attack on gays. The men never called me faggot, queer, cocksucker, --anything. This could have happened to anyone, straight or gay walking alone on the sidewalk by Lee Park at night.

A similar incident happened near Lee Park on Labor Day. About 8:30 that night, I was driving home and passed the same area. Two men, one of whom I knew,

two if they were balaneaded and wearing tuxedos."

During the trial, May testified that he and Jones went to Goff's specially because they had heard about the owner's anti-longhair policy, but May refused under cross-examination to say that he wanted to be arrested.

The courtroom was packed and most spectators (Ed Polk and Doug Larson among them) seemed to be sympathetic to the defense, who were represented by James Maddox. Mr. Maddox raised 47 objections during the trial, only three of which were sustained. Some of the objections were raised in defense of the attack on the character of Mr. Maddox by Mr. Whaley. During closing arguments, Mr. Whaley told the jurors, "I won't say what I would like to about Mr. Maddox because he would just object again." Mr. Maddox, under his breath was heard to say, "It wouldn't do me any good to object anyway." Judge Cole quickly said, "That remark will cost you \$50."

To no one's real surprise, the jurors took less than 30 minutes to find both men guilty and assessed the maximum fine of \$200 apiece. Also to no one's surprise, Jones and May intend to appeal the convictions and fines.

The new trial will be held in the County Court of Criminal Appeals presided over by Judge Fitzhugh. Date has not been set. OUR COMMUNITY has been informed that Oscar Mauzy, co-author of the trespassing law for which the men were convicted, will appear as a defense witness, as will Jerry Taff of Channel 8 news who was an on-the-scene witness. The defense will attempt to call Judge Robert Cole (of all people) as an unfriendly defense witness.

When interviewed by OUR COMMUNITY, one courtroom spectator said that the arrests, trial, and convictions pose more questions than answers:

- 1. If Goff's has the right to refuse service to longhairs does another establishment have the right to refuse baldheads?
- 2. If one's hair is long, is it necessarily dirty?
- 3. Does Goff's refuse service to women with long hair?
  Is their hair cleaner?
- 4. How can Harvey Gough tell whether one is an avowed communist or not? Are there no baldheaded communist?

# VICTIMLESS OFFENSES

# SHOULD BE LEGALIZED

"Two persons were murdered and 60 others beaten up. Citizens reported about 210 robberies, 550 burglaries and 460 other major thefts. All in all, March 11 was an average day for crime in New York City.

While the routine mayhem and pilaging took place, squads of New York's finest swooped down on 10 Manhattan movie houses and decided that dirty pictures were being shown in three of them. They arrested the managers and projectionists and herded embarassed audiences out into the viewfinders of waiting news photographers."

Sounds a bit like Dallas? These paragraphs were taken from the August 25th issue of The Wall Street Journal.

"Few would contend that the raiders could have made New York substantially safer by prowling beats that day. But, multiplied a thousand times every day across the country, does such enforcement of public morality impair the efficiency of police, courts and prisons in safeguarding life and property? A large and growing number of lawyers, judges and police officials think so. They argue that many unlawful activities that don't harm innocent victims should be removed from the criminal justice arena.

"There in lies a possible new approach to crime prevention: If police, courts and prisons can't keep up with the growth in crime, some authorities are saying then they should focus their attention on fewer laws—and fewer crimes. Some police and prosecutors already are quietly doing this.

New York police commissioner Patrick Murphy says, "It's impossible for us to do it all. If these laws weren't on the books, obviously we'd have more time to deal with serious laws. More than half the persons police arrest in the United States haven't laid a hand on a fellow citizen or stelen anything. These accused criminals wind up

ran out of the park into the street. I quickly stopped and asked the matter, and was told that a companion was being beaten by two men in the bushes nearby. Hurriedly I grabbed a lead pipe from the back of my car, ran into the darkness, and found two men beating a blond youth—one man held the youth's arms behind him, while the other beat him. I clubbed one of the men on the head with the pipe, knocking him to the ground unconscious; the toher man ran away. I grabbed the dazed youth and told him to get the hell out of there. I did not know the youth, and have not seen him since.

I am not asking you, the readers of my story, to stay out of the parks; everyone has a right to unmolested use of the parks. But I do want to warn everyone in our community of the possible danger, and to suggest that none go to the parks alone or unwarily.

# DALLAS GAY COMMUNITY SHOWN ON CH 13 FAVORABLE VIEWER RESPONSE OVERWHELMING

THE OTHER WORLD, an unbiased tour of the Dallas Gay Community was shown to TV viewers, September 6. Opening scenes were of Rev. Richard Vincent conducting religious service for the Dallas MCC. When interviewed later, he said "One can be gay and still be loved by God." Dennis Sisk of the Julius Caesar, spoke briefly of police harassment, then described his patrons as coming from all occupations and economic levels of life.

Interviews with the "man on the street" got the expected "they are sick" answer, but more thoughtful people commented, "Just because a person is different doesn't mean he's sick" "If they are sick, then we are all sick. The famous Hug-A-Homosexual booth of last June's ALA convention was shown with the charming Barbara Gittings,

writer, lecturer, and lesbian cursader leading a few uncloseted gays in "2-4-6-8; gay is just as good as straight!" The camera then switched to the Maars Bar where female impersonators in lavish costumes were performing. Dennis Sisk commented that if one wishes to dress in

These accused criminals wind up flooding the courts and prisons for so-called victimless crimes such as drunkenness, drug use, gambling, consensual illicit sex (mainly prostitution) and, in the case of many teen-agers, running away from home. Pornography cases while less troublesome numerically, fall into the victimless category, too.

"Civil liberties groups have argued for years that citizens have a constitutional right to engage in the standard victimless crime activities without arrest, that it should not be the role of the police to save persons from themselves."

The Wall Street Journal continues by saying that many laws, especially gambling tends to corrupt police and other officials.

"I suspect the reason a lot of police argue against taking these laws off the books is that there's a lot of money involved—they're corrupted by it." says Washington DC police chief Jerry Wilson. Mr. Carl M. Loeb Jr., former chairman of the New York City Board of Corrections says, "The kids today know the cops are paid of. To me, the most important reason to get rid of victimless crime is to restore the respect of young people for police."

Richard J. Bartlett, a Glens Falls, N.Y. attorney, was chairman of a commission that helped revise the penal land and criminal code in New York State. Mr. Bartlett observes that "the commission recommended that consensual sodomy and adultery be eliminated from the criminal statutes, and in each case we were defeated by the legislature."

The Wall Street Journal concludes by saying, "Times change, however. Three New York assemblymen have called a press conference to announce legislative hearings on gambling, prostitution, homosexuality and the conception of victimless crime."

The camerathen switched to the Maars Bar where female impersonators in lavish costumes were performing. Dennis Sisk commented that if one wishes to dress in drag, they have the right, but most gay men are not interested in dressing as women.

Hustlers at the Grayhound Bus Station, late at night were seen standing around waiting to make a score. Doug and Gary were photographed taking Holy Communion, hand in hand. Interviewed in their well-decorated home as they were preparing their evening meal, the world saw two men, very much in love with each other, and happily married. Both men have good jobs, and are making a contribution to mankind. Gene Leggett, ousted from his ministry for being gay, spoke of his honesty in dealing with his fellowman. He can afford, (as people in some occupations cannot), to live a liberated life, look the world in the eye, and with dignity say, "I am gay."

Bill Frazier, head of the Dallas Vice Squad, explained how officers spend time in public johns, waiting to be propositioned, then arresting gays for doing so. Dallas County Dist. Atty. Henry Wade seemed almost a contridiction. First he discussed the law against sodomy, but later added, "There is a place in society for everybody, because they are here, you know."

Dr. Jerry Lewis, from the Research & Development Dept. of Timberlawn Hospital told us that homosexuality has existed in all cultures from the beginning of time, even in the most primitive of tribes. Homosexuality is universal, and exists in greater numbers than most people suspect—3 to 4% of the adult population is predominately gay. For years those of Dr. Lewis' profession considered homosexuals sick, but he noted that psychiatrists see "only a small slice of the pie." Those who are happy and well-adjusted have little need for therapy. Tina, one of Dallas' better female impersonators brought the show to a dramatic close with a highly emotional staging of "I've Got to be Me."

Of the more than 300 calls on feedback, 80% were favorable, 10% did not express an opinion, and 10% were critical: "It's a sin, the bible clearly states it." "It's one thing for concenting adults in private, but what about when they molest your 7 year old son?" Mr. Roberson pointed out that homosexuality and child molestation were not the same thing.

# POLICE HARASSMENT IN HOUSTON

For years, Gay Citizens of Houston have enjoyed their civil rights of life, liberty, and the persuit of happiness. They went their own ways harming no one, and enjoying friendly relations with the police. Now all that is gone. Suddenly last summer, all hell broke loose.

It started with a raid on the Adult Library Club, 1312 Alabama, July 29th, when 23 men were arrested. Ten men were charged with committing oral sodomy, 11 with remaining on the premises for the purpose of lewdness, and two with performing an indecent and obscene act. According to the Adult Library Club operator, Vice Squad officers A. A. Tello and J. G. Perez gained entrance by signing membership applications. About 30 minutes later, several uniformed policemen entered the club and made the arrests. Witness heard one officer say, "We will continue to raid places like this until every goddam queer has been run out of the city."

Later the same evening, officers forced the door of the Adult Library Club at 1840 Westheimer, looked around the premises, then left without making any arrests.

The following night, officers again returned to the Adult Library on Alabama, forced entry through the bathroom window, and arrested two customers on charges of sodomy. With their billy clubs, they wrecked the store, scattering magazines and books from the shelves. According to witnesses, the two menarrested attempted to escape and were subdued by the officers. One man was beaten into submission outside the club and taken to a hospital.

Since then, the Adult Library Clubs have shut down until such time as: a Federal Court injunction can be secured, restraining the local police from harassing tactics against the clubs and their members.

On July 30th, officers entered the popular La Caja club, 1104 Tuam. One officer, with a shotgun, covered the front door, while another covered the rear door leading to the patio. More officers were stationed outside the
