

Montrose Circuit

Efforts on the part of a local citizens group and participants from area gay organizations to move the Montrose Circuit were implemented on September 20.

Volunteers from several gay groups within Houston were on hand Friday and Saturday nights on the corners of the Montrose Circuit to pass out circulars describing the moving of the historic cruising area.

The circulars, which explain the reasons for the move and include a map of the new Circuit area, were given to everyone making the rounds of the Circuit. Most were eager to hear of the new area, although actual response by moving is still slight.

The move is being pushed in an effort to cooperate with neighborhood residents, who are finding the activity on the Circuit increasingly more difficult to live with be-

cause of the noise and traffic in the early morning hours. It is also rumored that there may be a police crackdown in the old Circuit area, and it is hoped that the move can be made amiably before this happens.

The circulars will be handed out each weekend for several weeks, and the move will be strongly encouraged. The volunteers are receiving full cooperation and support from the neighborhood organization, known as the Montrose Citizens Association.

The new area will be a non-residential, semi - isolated area nearer downtown, and it is hoped that it will be more conducive to cruising conditions, since the roads are better and there is good lighting.

First, there is a \$3.00 cover





GPC POLITICAL RALLY Virginia Galloway

The first annual Open Political Rally sponsored by Gay Political Caucus was a well-attended, well supported success for the gay community and GPC.

Approximately 500 people were present for the rally, which featured seven political candidates,



am not here so much to campaign for your votes as to support gay solidarity in Houston. This rally shows that the gay community is beginning to understand itself." Vasquez also said "This rally represents your anger for being in closets. The key to your political independence is your ability to mobilize others." He pointed that the gay community has allies with other minority groups, and urged support of the Socialist Workers Party because "the Socialist campaign is on your side."

State Representative Ron Waters, who is not a candidate for office this year, told the group that he is a community activitist. He said that each person attending the rally represented from 1,000 to 5,000 persons who could not be at the rally because they had to remain closeted, and that he was aligned with the Democratic Party because he chose to put himself in the middle of the establishment, in an effort to open the door and end oppression. He concluded by saying "Closets are for hangers. The sooner we take the hinges off the door, the better we'll be."

The only candidate running for City Council in attendance was Helen Hopkins, who said that she never thought she would be in politics, but her septic tank backed up and she could not get adequate response from the city, so she became involved in the political scene. She pointed out that the intention of supporting blacks if elected because he did not believe they have a right to date his daughter. He also said that if elected he would encourage "police brutality" and would have a shotgun squad within the police department to run all the communists out of town, legally or illegally. Nelson's speach was interrupted by boos and catcalls continually.


current "at large" system of electing the City Council effectively gives no representation from each district, and said that she would work to eliminate this method of election. Hopkins said that she supports full fights for human beings, and is a civic activist.

Three candidates for Community Development Neighborhood Commissioner from District 20, who are up for election on September 27, addressed the group. Each is an independent candidate. The Neighborhood Commissioner candidates attending the rally were Tom Holt, Dr. Milton Lower, and Robert Rodriquez.

A plea for straight supporters of GPC was issued by Virginia Galloway, member of the Board of Trustees of GPC, who is currently the only heterosexual within the organization. Heterosexual attendance at the rally was small, and GPC hopes to encourage the integration of straights in the group, to promote cooperation in both communities.

Local bars had provided beer for 1,200 people, which was quickly consumed by the thirsty group. All seemed to be impressed by the rally, and encouraged GPC in its efforts.

Dear Tillie:

If you are cross-dressing to please a lover whom you are committed to, and if you feel O.K., about it, then we say it's O.K., though you need to be mindful that society (even the majority of gay society) may think it's not.

For your own protection (and for your continued enjoyment of dressing in drag), check yourself out on the following questions: 1. Am I being as discreet as possible?

2. Is my "favorite club" the most liberal one available in town, or am I setting myself up for criticism?

3. Is cross-dressing illegal in my city, and if so, what consequences might I face if arrested?

4. Are the consequences of arrest worth the enjoyment my lover and I get out of it?

5. If not, will it be satisfying enough for us if I just dress in drag in the privacy of our home? 6. Is adequate police protection for persons in drag afforded at the club I like?


7. Am I waiting for society (including my fellow gays) to feel that cross-dressing is 0.K. before decide to feel completely comfortable about doing it?

(if so, you are probably setting yourself up to never feel comfortable.)

If the answer to the majority of these questions results in a negative picture, then you might want to reconsider whether or not it is in your best interest to continue cross-dressing. Your original request was for us to tell you what's wrong with it. There is nothing inherently wrong with it, inspite of society's "parent tapes" to the contrary. Just be sure the risks involved are worth it to you.

If you continue to feel the enjoyment outweighs the risks, and if you are really convinced that it's O.K., then there is no real reason for you to have trouble with remarks and pinches from others. Be secure in your O.K.-ness and let them wallow in their prejudice.

As far as the pinching goes, both drag and non-drag dressers get pinched in both gay and nongay places all the time, and consider it a compliment. Consider it a positive stroke to offset all the negative strokes you get from people who think you're not O.K. Enjoy!!




