We decided early on that the word, Montrose, would be in the title but we could not agree on the rest. We asked friends for help, but nothing was satisfactory. During one of our weekly trips to Texas City to deliver the paste up sheets for printing, we again started thinking about our name.

We discussed the word, map, and realized that the word, Montrose, also began with an 'm'. Quickly we added the word, area, to our new name since our distribution will not be limited to only to Montrose.

The remaining 'p' was going to prove to be our downfall. We looked at all the billboards trying to come up with something newspaperish. Nothing that was agreeable to both of us was in sight.

All of a sudden, pencil in hand the word went on paper. We nodded an instant approval and to the County Clerk's office we went.

The name was unused and we registered it on the spot.

The new name is being displayed in this issue and will become our name in the near future. Oh yes, the newspaper will be called the 'MON-TROSE AREA PRIDE' and THE MAP will be inside.

All of Marvin Davis's crystal, paintings, collectible glass priceless


antiques have been taken to Southern Expressions, 5400 West Belfort, Houston, Texas, to be cleaned and sold.


