Gay male HIV/AIDS prevention focus group forming at Montrose Counseling Center

The Montrose Counseling Center is looking for a few gay males willing to answer questions about HIV/AIDS transmission and prevention. Persons selected will be HIV negative or persons who have not been tested recently.

The purpose of the group is to help the MCC make a recommendation to the City of Houston so they may determine where large portions of the government grants and funding for HIV/AIDS will be spent.

Samples of some of the questions to be asked are:

- —What will it take to keep you negative?
- —Where do you get your HIV/AIDS information?
- -What publications do you read?
- —Who do you trust to give you information?

The Montrose Counseling Center was founded in 1978 as a non-profit (501(c)(3)), community based organization dedicated to serving primarily the Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual communities. The Center offers innovative and effective programs in the areas of psychotherapy, HIV/AIDS, alcohol/drug abuse treatment, and community education.
