After a long but exciting weekend, The Royal, Sovereign and Imperial Court of the Single Star of Houston, Inc. (RSICSS) held Coronation XIII at the Renaissance Hotel. The four day festivities were highlighted by a Gala Celebration Saturday night. Many members of the Houston community were joined by numerous people from around the country and Canada to applaud Emperor XII Jim Halbert and Empress XII Ruby Stone, for their contribution to our community during Reign XII.

Beginning Thursday night, the In-Town-Show at Chances featured members of the Houston Court. Hosted by the Fifth Anniversary Monarchs, Emperor VIII Frank Pierce and Empress VIII Pittypat Magnolia Sugarbaker, the Houston members did a wonderful job of entertaining the out of town guests. Ruby and Jim continued a tradition that began at Coronation XII, by handing out awards that went from somewhat serious to somewhat funny. It was a great beginning to a spectacular weekend.

Friday began early at the hotel in the hospitality suite, hosted by Emperor and Empress XI. Members reunited friendships and fostered new ones as the Colt 45's, NLA Houston and Soiree Aubergine assisted with bartending duties.

The evening approached and Monarchs from visiting courts entertained at the Out-of-Town Show, held at the hotel. Ending promptly at 10:00 p.m., over 100 people loaded two buses for the annual bar run. Beginning at the Ripcord, coronation guests were treated to this Houston bar for the

first time in the history of the Houston Court. From there, the buses headed to the Emperor's home bar, Venture-N. Keeping on schedule, they traveled to Gentry, EJ's, Mary's and finally the home bar of the Court and Empress XII's home bar, Chances. Marlene Beago and the staff of Chances hosted the Court with a huge breakfast spread. After a lot of laughs and a few tears, they loaded up and headed back to the hotel where most of the members stayed up in hospitality until the early hours of the morning.

Saturday saw many members running around preparing for the highlight of the weekend, Coronation XIII, "A Winter Fantasy Ball." In their best evening wear, court members and guests filled the ballroom. As the lights dimmed, Ruby and Jim entered in a colorful sleigh drawn by six beefy men in leather. Decked in white, the Monarchs began their final evening as the reigning Emperor and Empress of Houston.



Dixon and Bell in runoff for City Council

Proposition A and minimum wage rejected

From a field of 16 candidates Houston voters chose Rev. James W.E. Dixon II and Chris Bell as candidates in a runoff election to be held at a date selected by City Council when votes in this election are canvassed.

Dixon received 25% of the vote while Bell polled 23%. Third place finisher Dave Wilson received 11% and Ray Hill got 9% for the fourth spot.

Only 17% of the registered voters in the City bothered to go to the polls. Montrose area voters totaled only slightly better at 17 1/2%.

The \$6.50 minimum wage proposal failed 77% to 23% citywide, while in Montrose it lost by a 74% to 26% margin.

The tax reform was voted down 61% to 39% and in Montrose it was 59% to 41%.

Tax reform supporter Bruce Holtz went on television late Saturday night claiming he would be back. Houston needs tax-limiting laws he said.

Mayor Bob Lanier stated he would like to see city charter amendments voted on during November elections citing that he thought it inappropriate to consider major changes during low turnout elections.






