For the past 24 years, the Houston Council of Clubs has sponsored the event the weekend after Fat Tuesday. The Council has nine leather-levi clubs, seven auxiliary clubs and two organizations as its current membership.

Billed as one of the biggest annual party weekends in Houston, LUEY Weekend is set to open at 8:00 p.m. on Friday, February 14th, at Venture-N, 2923 Main Street. Registration will last until midnight.

Venture-N, Mary's Naturally, Gentry, Brazos River Bottom and Pacific Street will be the bars holding the official functions of the event.

A complete list of events and parties will be printed in next week's "Let Us Entertain You Weekend" special edition.

Fun and food will be the bill of fare all weekend with special cocktail parties sponsored by the various Houston clubs and organizations. An Atlanta entertainer, Miss Edee King (singercomedienne) has been booked for Friday night at Venture-N and again Sunday as a warm-up to the LUEY Show at Brazos River Bottom.

There is NO CHARGE to out-oftown guests and Houston area folks pay only \$10.00 to attend the entire three-day party.

Antique dealer update; LVL estate recovers some more assets

As the Montrose Area Pride went to press last week, the LVL PWA Holiday Fund was awaiting a Saturday morning court ordered occurrence that would allow them to enter Southern Expressions to recover its remaining assets. A portion of Marvin Davis' estate had been placed on consignment at the store to be sold "without commission fees." The owner has apparently left town with proceeds in hand.

We were notified Wednesday that the owner, Steven G. Buie had been arrested and jailed in Austin, Texas. We asked The Texas keep you informed.

Triangle (a gay newspaper based in Austin) to check on this story.

Dan Quinn, the managing editor of the Triangle reported back that Buie had been released after posting bond, charged with driving with expired license plates and driving without a valid driver's license.

Saturday morning the members of the LVL PWA Holiday Fund met with the new lessee of Buie's store to recover what was left. Other consignees were also there to make their own recoveries.

After waiting three hours the board was able to recover more of the estate's assets. A large amount of the cut glass was missing. Some pieces of furniture had been sold. Receipts were produced and the new owners were allowed to claim their purchases.

Attorneys for the estate explained that it is now a civil matter between the estate and Buie to recover any funds due. The filing of any criminal charges is in the hands of the Harris County District Attorney's office.

Each year the IPR's choose their own theme of PR Ball and their own beneficiary. This year's theme is High



This November, a number of cow- western wear, horsemanship, and talboys and cowgirls from all over the country will descend upon Houston for yet another rodeo. No, this is not going to be a repeat of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. I'm talking about the Texas Gay Rodeo Association. This statewide organization, which is a member of the International Gay Rodeo Association, hosts this event annually.

Robert Harris, Houston Chapter Treasurer and State Secretary, explained, "People from all over the world compete, including riders from Australia and Canada. The competition consists of riding events such as calf roping, pole bending, barrel racing, steer wrestling, and bull riding, just to name a few. And because we are a gay rodeo, we have our camp events such as goat dressing and drag events."

Robert gave some details about the plans for this year's rodeo. "The rodeo will begin November 6th and continue through the 9th. The royalty and dance competitions will be held Thursday night, with competition events on Friday and Saturday. The award's ceremony will close the festivities on Sunday.

"There will be vendors at the arena ranging from metal work, to jewelry and T-shirts. We also plan on having entertainment throughout the day, with different groups performing." The location for this year's rodeo has yet to be decided.

TGRA's royalty, Mr. and Miss TGRA, is selected through rigorous competition. Contestants from around the state compete in interview, Houston!

ent. They also have a fundraising category, in which contestants receive a certain number of points for the amount of money they raise for the community.

The total amount raised from last year's competition exceeded \$60,000. Houston chapter member Xavier Luna set TGRA's record in the royalty competition for fundraising this past year, by raising over \$18,000 for Houston charities. This year's current reigning Miss TGRA is Houston's own Jaime Roberts.

TGRA is made up of five chapters located in Austin, Dallas, Fort Worth, San Antonio, and Houston. The rodeo is hosted by a different city each year. The net proceeds from each rodeo are distributed to local charities with each individual chapter designating where these funds go. This past year, the Houston chapter raised over \$40,000.

Robert thanked the many groups that helped this past year. "We received support from many organizations such as Soiree Aubergine, the Colt 45's, and the PWA Coalition just to name a few. We hope they continue their support this year, as we continue to support them in their endeavors.

TGRA will be meeting at 2:00 p.m. this Sunday at Brick's II, 617 Fairview at Stanford. This is a very important meeting because members will be voting on the groups for which the money raised this past year will be distributed. Membership is open to anyone interested.
