

Like I have written in many issues, Houston has so many groups that help our community in so many different ways. This was one group with which I was not that familiar.

The show itself was very entertaining. If you have never seen Tiffany perform one of her very interesting comedy numbers, you have to come out and experience it for yourself. She knows how to make people laugh which is exactly what we need in this serious job that we do. Throughout the evening, there were many numbers that made us laugh. Another one that stands out was the number "You're the Reason Our Kids Are Ugly," performed by Ms. Alotta Miles and Rhode Kill. These two are members of the Main Street Maniacs, a new camp group forming here in Houston. > Under their current grant, case managers Kris Albert and Patrick Martin help their HIV+ clients find interpreters for services such as doctor's visits. The program provides case management for HIV+ individuals who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing. The program provides hearing screening for men and women regardless of their HIV status. It is a collection of over 16 types of equipment including TTY's, phone signalers, FM Loops and amplifying phones. All equipment is available on loan for Deaf and Hard of Hearing to assist clients in maintaining autonomy. They have an Assistive Device Program which helps those who may not be able to afford flashers or TTY's. In July, Kris and Patrick will travel to Austin to represent Houston's Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program at a Texas Department of Health Conference.

Tiffany organized a wonderful show, again for a wonderful cause. This evening made me realize once again that our community is very diverse yet at the same time very different. Our brothers and sisters in this family are separated in different ways, but evenings like Friday night bring us all together in the spirit that should always unite us.

Thanks Tiffany. You are one of a kind, a huge heart in a small (but cute) package. I hope that just a little bit of your constant energy rubs off on everyone you come in contact with. Till next week...have fun Houston.

His ex-wife Trina (Karen Ross) and Mendel (Robert Kislin) argue over the nearing coming of age party. Marvin's new neighbors (the lesbians next door) are introduced as Dr. Charlotte (Julia Kay), an internist, and her lover, Cordelia (Robin Smith), a kosher cater. Dr. Charlotte sings out loudly about the disease spreading through the gay community. Wizzer eventually contracts the disease and goes through the stages of his demise.

The Pillow Book

Sex, flesh - text, literature - two simulations in life that can be, sooner or later, guaranteed to excite and please. This movie does all it can to bring both of these simulations to the viewer's vision - for a time, perhaps the length of your stay at the theater.

This picture is about a pillow book, the Japanese equivalent of a diary, written at the end of the Tenth Century. Writer/Director Peter Greenaway's "The Pillow Book" is set one thousand years later in Kyoto, Japan and Hong Kong.

Every year on her birthday, a young Japanese girl's face is painted with a traditional birthday greeting by her father (a calligrapher and writer) and her aunt reads to her from the ancient Japanese classic, "The Pillow Book." These two customs deeply impress the girl and follow her throughout the film. The aunt encourages her to keep her own pillow book.

As she enters adulthood, the girl discov-

quired to marry the publisher's nephew which ends the face painting ritual. The marriage bears no love and her new husband does not share her interest in writing. She begins obsessive diary writing and identifies with Sei Shonagon, the writer of the original "Pillow Book" almost one Ewan McGregor and Vivian Wu in The Pillow Book thousand years ago.

Anxiety and fighting build between the two and her husband finally burns her books and writings which sets fire to their house. This fire is the first of two that set a new direction in the girl's life.

Vivian Wu plays the adult girl (Nagiko) Ken Ogata is the father. The publisher is Yoshi Oida. Writer/Director Peter Greenaway has made more than 30 films since 1966. He trained as a painter and began working as a film cutter before he began his own films. A feature, "The Draughtsman's Contract" established him internationally as one of the most original and important film makers of our times.


