




This one stars Mary Beth Hurt and J.D. Cerna and was directed by Mark Christopher.

Alliance, the National Leather Association: Houston (NLA: H), Main Street Maniacs, the Houston Area Bears, and the Texas Cowgurlz. The list is huge, and I know that it doesn't include everybody.

Houston is very lucky in the fact that our bar owners and managers are so willing to help these organizations in the fight against HIV/AIDS.
