

Saturday night, June 28, at 9:00 p.m., the 1997 Houston Gay Pride Parade begins. It will be the first ever nighttime Gay Pride parade in American history. The parade begins at Ridgewood Street and continues eastward along Westheimer to Stanford Street. When the parade ends at approximately 11:00 p.m., the party continues at almost every bar in the area and at the official Pride Blowout "Glowing With Pride" at Garden in the Heights (3926 Feagan near Heights), sponsored by Outrage and the Pride Committee of Houston. Please use caution walking away from the festivities.

This week we start our tour of Australia. Before we start though I want to wish every one a happy and safe PRIDE! As we enter the weekend for the parade and The gay community in Melbourne is more some of the major parties of the season, I just want to remind everyone that PRIDE is the time when we should be pulling together and becoming one as a community So many times we forget what it has taken for the Gay and Lesbian community to get freedoms that we have today, but we still have a long road ahead. Be careful this weekend, be safe and most of all HAVE FUN! Look for me and my partner on the wagon with the Overland Trail Riders in populated suburbs on the north side are the parade on Saturday night or stop by and say hi to us when we are partying with Marlene and her crew at The New Barn, Chances and Charlies.

Our first stop is Sydney and New South Wales. Sydney is the largest gay and lesbian city in Australia with Darlinghurst the heartland and Oxford Street the main artery. Along Oxford Street, restaurants, bars, night clubs and specialty shops stay open far into the night.

In the maze of streets bordering Oxford Street there is a host of gay and gay friendly hotels and bed and breakfast establishments: Governors on Fitzroy in Surry Hills; Sullivans Hotel in Paddington; Barracks, Pelican Private Hotel and Chelsea Guest House in Darlinghurst; and Hyde Park Plaza closer to the city. Gay entertainment is concentrated mainly on Oxford Street and some of the night clubs worth visiting are the Albury Hotel, Midnight Shift and the Oxford Hotel.

Another popular street, especially for lesbians, is King Street in Newtown. Sydney's gay communities are also found in Paddington and Surrey Hills which border Darlinghurst, Bondi, Elizabeth Bay, Double Bay, Redfern and Erskineville. Emerging areas are the inner west suburbs of Balmain, Leichhardt (especially for lesbians) and Glebe.

The spectacular Blue Mountains and the South Coast are popular country regions within an easy drive of Sydney Both South Coast has some of the most stunning bush scenery and beaches near Sydney as well as a good choice of antique sc.ultimate@uniglobe.com

shops. Byron Bay nestled behind Cape Byron on the North Coast provides an interesting blend of cultures.

Next we visit Melbourne and Victoria. spread out than in Sydney, although the numbers are nearly the same. The main lesbian suburbs where women run businesses are Fitzroy, Clifton Hill and Northcote. Commercial Road in Prahran is the main gay thoroughfare with two long running gay venues, the city's only adult gay bookshop and a variety of gay cafes and specialty stores.

The most densely gay and lesbian Abbotsford, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Northcote, Brunswick, Carlton and North Melbourne, and on the south side South Yarra, Prahran, Windsor, Armdale, South Melbourne, Albert Park and Middle Park. The beach resort suburb of St. Kilda is gaining in popularity with gays and lesbians. Gay and gay friendly accommodation houses include: Lygon Lodge, Carlton; The Laird, Collingwood; Hotel Saville, South Yarra; and the Cosmopolitan Motor Inn, Novotel Bayside and Home When Away in St. Kilda.

A favorite weekend retreat from Melbourne is the famous mineral springs region of Daylesford. The region has a thriving gay and lesbian community and a choice of gay owned and gay friendly accommodations, cafes and specialty shops. Gay dances are held in local town halls throughout the year. The region offers good bushwalking, horse riding, boating and gold panning as well as spa and massage facilities.

Our tour continues next time to Bisbane, Adelaide, Perth and beyond, so keep







Talking about 'Late Bloomers'

MAP Interview by Chris Broadhurst

Late Bloomers is the story of a school secretary (Dee Hennigan) and a high school basketball coach (Connie Nelson) who fall in love and lose their jobs because of prejudice, but marry. They are responsible adults hit hard by society's mores.

I had the opportunity to sit and talk with Gretchen Dyer (Producer, Screenwritter and Editor) and Martha Little (Executive Producer).

Dyer got the idea for the story in the middle of the night, set to writing, called her sister, and *Late Bloomers* became their immediate project.

CB: Why is it set in a high school?

DYER & LITTLE: It is set in a high school because a high school is filled with potential for humor. The teacher and school secretary were in authority positions and suddenly they aren't because of absurd ideas that buffeted them.

Dyer wanted everyone to see the absurdity of good people who do a good job and suffer for what others believe in about the lesbian lifestyle.

What they produced is a movie they see as before its time—but soon to become mainstream. Thus they expect a crossover from the niche market (G&L) to mass audience. The crossover is possible even though the film is political (not militant) and accessible to a general public.

These attributes of the film led to raising money from other sources aside from supporting gay, lesbian and women's communities, but from the business community. The business community perceived the film as a stock in which their investment would increase at rates they felt were excellent. The money is a model of a diverse community, as the movie is accessible to one.

I believe I have expressed the heart of what was said by Dyer and White. I took notes, not quotes. Furthermore, their enthusiasm was so overwhelming, I had to force myself to take notes. I was afraid that I'd miss out on the conversation.


