




Throughout this issue you will see many things relating to Jungle 19 and the "new" event that will be held at a new location and time. We hope you will make it out- and get your dance on!







Where else in Houston can you see everything from 2,000-4,000 year old sculptures and pottery from Italy, China and the Middle East to paintings by such recognizable names as Picasso, Cezanne, Remington and O'Keefe? Not too many places here in Houston that I can think of The Museum of Fine Arts has amazing collections from all over the world spread across a multitude of locations. It is a complex of sites including two gallery buildings, visitors center, sculpture garden, two art schools, two house museums, library, café, movie theater and gift shops. On top of world – from the recent exhibit of Impressionistic masterpieces on loan from the National Gallery of Art in D.C. to an upcoming exhibition of King Tut from Egypt (there's going to be so much gold that Fort Knox is going to be jealous!) In conjunction with all

these exhibits,

there are always great talks, lectures, films, workshops and tours to stimulate your mind and your brain. General admission is \$7 (cheaper than a cocktail at the bars). The special exhibits are less than \$20 (which is usually cheaper than catching a movie at the local multiplex) and with a membership, you can get discounts on all the special events that go on throughout the year. It's not called the Museum District for nothing! It is definitely worth checking out for a little culture in your life! 
What is it like playing for other countries say like China?


















A LITTLE HEALTH FOR THE MIND

A friend once asked me; what do we need to have a healthy relationship? Since I am not an expert in the subject. I decided to ask one of my psychiatry colleagues for advice. This is what I came up after talking to her. Regardless of gender, our partner is a human being with whom we have the opportunity for personal growth and we should grow in our relationships. There are characteristics that we need to work that can lead us to healthy relationships.

I. Keep the personal appeal: This is not to seek the appearance of supermodels or culturally created stereotypes. It is the fact of caring for the body to improve the image, feel good about ourselves, considering what your partner likes and loves about us.

2. Identify what do I bring to the relationship: Almost always we look to our partners and we know what he brings to the relationship for what he doesn'(), but we are rarely aware of what we contribute to the relationship, perhaps the quality and quantity time, willingness, patience, understanding, listening, etc.

3. Issertive Communication: This point is crucial; guessing how much love my partner feels toward me or vice versa, is a common mistake. How to express? Preferably assertively, speaking from my emotions and my being, for example, saving "I am angre," or "that

4. Respect: How difficult is it knowing that the person with whom we share our lives (either long or short) can have an opinion with which I disagree and respect him. We deserve respect in our ideas, thoughts and actions. He deserves that too

5. Activities in common: How important is to keep a space for the couple, built only for members of the relationship only. Sometimes with work, school, and for some, the presence of children, time seems to be absorbed in space; gone! Trying to bring it back is a challenge. For this reason, prospectively take some time of the day and decorate it (metaphorically speaking) with love and caring, for you and your partner, including here the erotic aspect!

6. I pdate agreements: tailored to the needs of each member of the couple. It is important to review the arrangements for the couple; work on issues that are considered to be relevant (economics, sexuality, living together, friends, family, loyalty, etc.) Make a deal and keep to it. As we change with time, the agreements should be updated to our needs, as persons and as a couple. We are the ones that decide what is acceptable for our relationship and what it is not. But this should be a mutual pact.

7. Expectations: We forget that each person is different, and that the possibility of providing "something" in the relationship is different in every human being. Each of us has our own personality, our history, values and the ability to "meet" healthy expectations. We might just not know if we meet his. This is why it is so important to communicate.

8. Strengthen personal health: You can't love if you're not happy with yourself. If we do other activities, for example, professionally, we will feel happier with ourselves and bring happiness into the relationship. 9. We are different individuals. The idea of the other half is different, because that would be reduced to half in search of an identity. Knowing that we are full human beings, with rights to private spaces, moments to give us personal satisfaction is important in every relationship. Can you be with yourself alone?

10. Do not judge. Analyze the context, expand the horizon of what we interpret, understanding is an ingredient for a better relationship.
