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
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



This month's cover may seem a bit inflammatory, but when you consider that these are three words used to describe Queer Music, it becomes less a political statement and more an acknowledgement of a genre that rarely gets the respect it deserves. Especially by the gay community. Why? That's a good question. Why does Cher sell out every time she does yet another leg of her interminable farewell tour? Because the one thing most gay people have in common is, when it comes to music, if they can dance to it, it's sure to be a hit. Savvy record producers (and never-say-die dance divas) know this better than anyone.

The purpose of this issue, then, is to show all you nelly fags out there that there's more to Queer Music than **Madonna**, **Christina** or plug-in-your-favorite-dance-diva-here. Also, just because a song has sixteen different DJ club mixes, doesn't necessarily make it Queer (though it does definitely make it Gay). Many may never become MTV darlings or have their songs remixed for mass consumption. Most will be lucky to find any kind of acceptance at all in the mainstream. All, however, will influence the future of Queer Music.



HOUSTONBERNARD NAMOLIBRENNET

"ElectroRock performer and DJ/activist" has been making waves by creating rap music that's so queer it redefines the bad boy genre. His debut cd Whores Have More Fun was voted one of the Top 10 Indie Albums of 2005 by The Advocate.

The New York-based, self-titled A 3-time Outmusic Award nominee, the transgendered songwriter has independently produced and released five cds since 2002 on her own label Girl's Gotta Eat Records, including her latest, Chrysanthemum, a heartbreaking collage of poetry and intense emotion.

KEVINCAHOON KJDENHERT

Performing in such queer musicals as Hedwig & The Angry Inch and The Rocky Horror Show were just the beginning for "professional outsider" Cahoon, whose glam-influenced debut release with his band Ghetto Cowboy, entitled simply Doll, received the Outmusic Award for Best Male Debut Recording.

Calling her music "Urban Folk and Jazz, rooted in Funk and R&B." Denhert's lush vocals and expert musicianship define cool without a hint of pretension. Her seventh release. Another Year Gone By won the Independent Music Award 2006 Album Of The Year.

ANIDIFRANCO

The "It" girl for a new generation of queer rock, Ani has been cranking out a new album every vear since 1990 and just keeps getting better with her staccato style, love of wordplay and plenty of take-no-prisoners attitude. Her latest. Reprieve. shows she hasn't lost any of that.

the **EXBOYFRIENDS**

Catchy, power-pop ditties about expired love, addiction and other angsty torments are the trademark of this San Francisco trio, whose debut release. Dear John, features tight quitar licks, punctuated drums and razor sharp lyrics that will make you smile through the pain.

SCOTTFREE BRIANGRILLO

Outmusic Award-winner, social activist and host of the annual Queer IS Folk Festival in Chicago, Free's latest release They Call Me Mr. Free is essential listening for anyone who values social diversity with a dash of go-to-hell sensibility.

Known as the godfather of Queercore, a label he detests in true punk fashion, Grillo has been belting out the grungy garage aesthetic since the early 90s with no end in sight. His latest release, Stomping Back On Fire, was voted number one on Out.com's Best Music of 2005.

IMOGENEHEAP ERICHIMAN

A rich, full voice reminiscent of 80s crooner Rick Astley, but backed by driving guitar rhythms and the kind of songwriting that makes grown men cry. Rice's debut cd. Wandering Eves, was voted one of the Top 10 Indie CDs of 2005 by Advocate Magazine.

IYNXTITANIC

The Los Angeles-based party punk band, fronted by the cigar-chomping skin head Jinx is known for its tongue in cheek lyrics and raucous style. Their debut disc. Booted & Cuffed. smacked up top ten lists everywhere queer music is appreciated.

JOANJETT



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

Many have tried and failed to properly categorize the music of the Dresden Dolls. Is it punk cabaret? Is it neoglam? Is it rock opera? Are they following in the footsteps of David Bowie? Queen? Liza Minnelli? Or is it all of the above, with a whole lot of theatrical sensibility thrown in for good measure? Singer/pianist/lyricist Amanda Palmer has heard the comparisons and takes them all in stride.

"Those labels are a necessary evil, honestly," she says. "As soon as journalists start to write about us, I feel like their first job is to find a label for the music. And if there isn't a name for it, they make one up. On the other hand, a lot of ink has been spent on us that says, 'I don't really know how to classify this.' That's fine with melactually find that rather flattering. If it's easy to explain, then it easily disposable."

One thing you can say about the Dresden Dolls with any certainty is, their music is anything but disposable. Their first self-titled release, in 2004, slowly built from selling 275 copies the first week, to a total of over 100,000 copies sold in the U.S. alone. Their highly anticipated sophomore release, *Yes, Virginia*, by comparison, debuted in April of this year at #42 on the Billboard Top 200 Album chart with 19,000 albums sold the first week. Part of that success, Amanda attributes to her large LGBT following.

"We definitely have our fair share of gay fans," she says. "I've gotten a lot of direct letters from people who are gay, bi-, transsexual. To me, it seems it's clear as day that this band would appeal to someone who was gay or sexually out of the main-stream. I figured out that I was bisexual when I was a teenager. I think Brian found out he was an actual textbook cross-dresser when he was like twelve. And I've never met a more completely straight guy who is so passionate about cross-dressing than Brian. He does it occasionally on stage. He has a whole collection of clothes that he calls his **Brian Boitano** Collection."

al choices aside, it's that really sells the Dolls to their diverse audience. Songs about sexual obsession, ambiguity and isolation, heavily peppered with at times brutal imagery are all given a theatrical twist that borders on the surreal. The secret, according to Palmer, is that she never goes into a song with an agenda. "There's a real power in not staking your political flag and declaring your views. I try to keep my songs deliberately interpretable. It keeps it interesting for repeated listening. Why would I write a song about how I feel about transexuality? For me it's more interesting to bring up ideas and images with no direction or agenda, and then everyone can process the song based on their own

But

In a sense, this interpretive ambiguity is what makes the music so universal, particularly to those who consider themselves "outsiders." What LGBT person can't relate to that?

"This band is about total freedom of personality," Palmer insists.

"As corny as it sounds, we are about freedom of expression, whether its sexual, musical, aesthetic, etc. So, we encourage each other-Brian and I-to follow our impulses, whether it's in the bedroom or onstage. If you had to boil down our philosophy as artists, it would be, "Listen to your inner voice. What do you really want to do, and why aren't you doing it?" If that means you're gay, that's an easy one. We feel eally passionate about people being emotionally honest with themselves, It's not a fetish of mine."

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JOSH ZUCKERMAN Out From Under

With so many gay singer/songwriters continuously rising on Sirius' OutQ chart, who can keep 'em straight? Rimshot, please, Josh Zuckerman - the man behind the music on Out From Under the artist's sophomore release - hails from St. Louis, Mo., where he honed his harmonic chops. His upbringing is evident on this latest effort, which is comprised of more than a dozen songs that journey through self-acceptance and that suffocating fear of loneliness that we all endure at times. In fact, on a few tracks you can nearly hear the average albeit engaging Zuckerman crying out between the choruses. "Save me," he seems to say. (The

Midwest can do that to a boi.) But while the record is an easy listen, Zuckerman never truly lets it live up to its title. With lyrics like "On the streets of guilt and shame/You won't find, you won't find my name/I took my life and the ball and chain." he seems more down and out than out from under.



THE NEW YORK DOLLS One Day It Will Please Us To Remember Even This


In 2004, former New York Dolls fan club president Morrissey made a request that reunited his boyhood idols. The result? An eagerly anticipated album from the seminal R&B-infused rock group. One Day It Will Please Us To Remember Even This. The Dolls' latest release includes contributions from founding members David Johansen and Sylvain Sylvain, as well quitarist Steve Conte, bass player Sami Yaffa, keyboardist Brian Koonin and drummer Brian Delaney. Several songs boast quest artists, such as Michael Stipe on Dancing on the Lip of a Volcano, Iggy Pop on Gimme Love and Turn on the Light and Bo Diddley on Seventeen. Legendary producer Jack Douglas, who had a hand in the Dolls' debut way back when,

adds his touch to Runnin Around. "This is the band that gave the world Personality Crisis. Jet Boy. Looking for a Kiss. Puss 'n' Boots and Trash." Douglas explains. "Maybe we can't forgive them for that. but they swing harder than anyone around, and this album is a fuckin' masterpiece." Enough said.



CHRISTINA AGUILERA Back To Basics

Tell your mother, your brother, your sister and your friends - Baby Jane's back and better than ever! On her third studio release, Back To Basics, pop icon Christina Aquillera pays tribute to the sounds of the 1920s. 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








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
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
