



SH 87 - FROM ROLLOVER PASS TO NORTH OF SH 124 ON BOLIVAR

Status Update July 2018

Raising SH 87

- **Proposed Plan**
 - Raise elevation of the roadway by 2.5 feet from Rollover Pass (begin project) to north of SH 124 (end of project)
 - Hardens roadway with asphalt overlay
 - Realign southern curve at SH 124
 - Reconfigure northern curve at SH 124 for two-way traffic
- **Current Status**
 - Let for construction May 2018
 - Construction to begin mid-July

Environmental documentation and permitting

- **Current Status**
 - NEPA Cleared
 - USACE Individual Permit (IP) obtained - June 2018
- **Estimated construction cost** - \$20.8 Million

Rollover Pass to North of SH 124 on High Island

Contractor

Old Castle Materials Texas, Inc.

Scope

Raising a non-freeway facility; Raising Roadway using black base, rehabilitating, ACP overlay, Beach Nourishment, Dune Restoration, Pavement Marking and Signing.

Key Dates

- **Work Begin:** mid-July
- **Project Completion:** Late 2019

Construction Process

- Project construction will be done in phases
- Project will remain open to through traffic during construction
- The Contractor's sequence of work is to begin raising the existing roadway elevation with 4 inch lifts alternating lanes in segments in order to minimize traffic delay times and local residences inconvenience.
- The curve on High Island at SH 87 and SH 124 will be reconfigured to provide a smooth transition between the 2 highways.
