




Print on Demand Concept


Hilbert's Problems

- These problems became very influential in the course of mathematics




My Problems

1. Free the Encyclopedia!

- Wikipedia
- In English and German, if you have a broadband connection, our mission is done
- French, Japanese, etc. not far behind
- Much work left to do globally




2. Free the Dictionary!

- Wiktionary
- Not as far along as Wikipedia, but picking up steam
- Needs software development for support




3. Free the Curriculum!

- Complete curriculum in every language
- Kindergarten through University level
- A much bigger task than the encyclopedia
- Wikibooks.org




4. Free the Music!

- Volunteer orchestras, student orchestras



Shakespeare's literary achievement is not confined to his mastery of the poetic and dramatic form; his ability to capture and convey the most profound aspects of human.nature is considered by many scholars to be unequalled, due to his understanding of the range and depth of human emotions. A colossal figure in world literature, Shakespeare's legacy and influence continues to be felt in all parts of the globe. He has been translated into every major living language, and his plays are continually performed all around the world. Shakespeare is among the very few playwrights who have excelled in both tragedy and comedy.

Shakespeare wrote his works between <u>1588</u> and <u>1616</u>, although the exact dates and <u>chronology of the plays</u> attributed to him are often uncertain. His prolific output is especially impressive in light of the fact that he lived only 52 years.

Shakespeare's influence on the English-speaking world shows in the widespread use of <u>quotations from Shakespearean plays</u> of, the <u>titles of works based on Shakespearean phrases</u>, and the many <u>adaptations</u> of his works.




6. Free the File Formats!

- Proprietary file formats are worse than proprietary software because they leave you with no ability to switch at a later time
- Your data is controlled
- There is considerable progress here
- Continued European rejection of software patents is critical




7. Free the Maps!

- "What could be more public domain than basic information about location on the planet?" - Stefan Magdalinksi
- FreeGIS software, Free GeoData
- This will become increasingly important for open competition in mobile data services



8. Free the Product Identifiers!

- Increasingly, small producers can have a global market
- Such producers need a competition among aggregators
- Competition among aggregators is furthered by independent product identifiers



What should it look like?

- ISBN, not ASIN
- LTIN "Long Tail Idenification Numbers"
- cheap or inexpensive to obtain
- Extensive database freely licensed and easily downloadable to empower multiple rating systems, e-commerce, etc.
- The alternative is proprietary control by ebay, Amazon, etc.

9. Free the TV Listings

- Development of free software digital PVRs is going on
- Free-as-in-beer listings exist, but this is tenuous
- Free listings could be used to power many different innovations in this area



10. Free the Communities!

- Wikipedia demonstrates the power of a free community
- Consumers of web forum and wiki services should demand a free license
- Otherwise, the company controls the community
- Are you a serf living on your master's estate, or free to move?
- Wikicities for profit, free communities
