

1. Annual General Meeting 2020

1.1 Agenda

Since attendance does not reach a quorum, Chairman Mr Toh announced that in accordance with Chapter VI of the Constitution Issue 28 of the Constitution, the meeting will convene delayed half an hour and should the number then be present, be insufficient to form a quorum, those present shall be considered a quorum. 2.3 Directors on board for 10 years and above

2.3.1 Mr. Toh Soon Huat JP, BBM, PVPA (2008 to present 12 years)

Chairman of the 84th Term of Board of Directors (2021 - 2023)

Sian Chay Medical Institution is a century old institution with strong Chinese heritage and traditions. Mr Toh Soon Huat was identified by the Pioneer Generation leadership to succeed and rejuvenate the Board in 2008. The Board then tapped on Mr Toh's 12 years of corporate experience in the public listed company to transform the conservative organisation into a modern and forward looking social enterprise.

Assuming the Chairmanship of Sian Chay in 2008, Mr Toh Soon Huat has inducted new blood and talents into the Board as well as set up a professional management to manage the operations of a growing network of branches from the initial one clinic prior to 2012 to the current 15 branches. With over 28 years of grassroots leadership and experience, he was able to embark on a series of fundraising campaigns to finance the branch network expansion and build up the reserves. From 2013 to 2020 has led the Board to raise an aggregate of \$70 million for Sian Chay.

But the above at Sian Chay is still works in progress. We are fortunate for the dedication and commitment of Mr Toh Soon Huat to oversee the final phase of branch network development as well as the streamlining the operations at the front-line and Back end support. Mr Toh has begun inducting more professionals, including lawyer, public accountant, to strengthen the corporate governance at the Board and management levels into the current term of office (2008 to present 12 years).

The support of the public and government agencies is critical to the continued success of Sian Chay. Mr Toh has established an effective rapport with the grassroots advisers to deliver community welfare projects in the respective constituencies where Sian Chay has set up branches as well as secure rental free spaces in the HDB heartlands and public places. Thus, achieving substantial costs savings in the operation budget. In recognition of Mr Toh's public service, he has been conferred the Justice of Peace (JP), Public Service Star (BBM), Public Service Medal (PBM), Ministry of Education Long Service Award (LSA) and Philanthropy and Volunteerism Award(PVPA) by the government.

2.3.2 Dato' Seri Jackson Teo Ngiang Heng PBM (2008 to present 12 years) Assistant Secretary of the 84th Term of Board of Directors (2021 - 2023)

Mr Teo Ngiang Heng was inducted into the Board in 2008 by Mr Toh Soon Huat as part of the leadership renewal process and rejuvenation of the Board. He has dedicated himself to Sian Chay, serving in various roles (Secretary, Treasurer) in the Board. He has been actively supporting Mr Toh Soon Huat in the various fundraising projects, including the Sian Chay Charity Gala and Concert in 2016, 'From Sian Chay with Love' Charity Gala and Concert 2017, the Sian Chay Bonding with Love TV Charity Show 2019 and the Asia Pacific Singing Competition Grand Final 2020.

Mr Teo is also a grassroots leader with broad experience in community service and non profit organisations including Singapore Performing Artistes Association and Fo Guang Shan Buddhist Association. He also chaired the Flag Day fundraising projects in past few years. He also brought cheers to the residents at the clinics and community events with his rendition of classic songs. In recognition of his public service, Mr Teo was conferred the Public Service Medal.

2.3.3 Mr.Raymond Chua Swee Wah PBM (2008 to present 12 years) Secretary of the 84th Term of Board of Directors (2021 - 2023)

Mr Chua Swee Wah was also brought into the Board by Mr Toh in 2008 to form a younger and dynamic leadership in Singapore. Mr Chua has been actively participating in the various fundraising project, including the Inaugural Sian Chay Charity Golf and Dinner 2014, 'Love from the STARS' Charity Gala 2015, Sian Chay TV Charity Show 2019.

Mr Chua is also an active grassroots leader and trade association leader, with strong links with the merchants to support our fundraising projects. As Chairman of Sim Lim Square Management Corporation , Mr Chua was able to mobilise the support of the Sim Lim Square merchants to support with sponsorships, donations in cash and kind and Face to Face campaign.

Mr Chua's dedication and commitment to Sian Chay is recognised with the NCSS Volunteer Long Service Award. Mr Chua also mobilised young volunteers including his family members and staff to participate in Sian Chay's fundraising projects.

The above appointments were approved at the 9th board meeting of the 83rd term (2018-2021) board of directors on November 13, 2020, and the 11th board meeting of the 83rd term (2018-2021) board of directors on April 17, 2021. After review, there was no objection from the members. Mr. Simon Keak Lai Heng proposed and Mr. Jackson Teo Ngiang Heng seconded. The members unanimously approved the 84th Term Board of Directors. The Secretariat will issue an appointment letter to the appointees to confirm their appointment officially and follow up on related matters at the same time; the installation ceremony will be held depending on the relaxation of covid prevention measures.

As of the end of 2020, there are 3 members who have served on the board of directors for more than 10 years (Toh Soon Huat, Chua Swee Wah and Teo Ngiang Heng). The main reason is that, as a traditional Chinese medicine charity organization, all of its directors are volunteers. To recruit new members with the same cultural values, beliefs and spirit as Sian Chay Medical Institution and are willing to devote themselves to charity and serve the public is a challenge. Coupled with competition from other charities for dedicated volunteers, the challenge is greater. At the same time, these three directors who have served Sian Chay for a long period have performed well in every aspect. They have selflessly contributed to Sian Chay's charity cause, dedicated themselves to develop Sian Chay, promoted Sian Chay's TCM charity platform, and advanced Sian Chay's core values and beliefs, spirit with kindness and positive energy.

All board members of Sian Chay Medical Institution serve the Sian Chay Medical Institution purely on a voluntary basis, and they do not receive any remuneration, salary, appointment or reimbursement at all. At the same time, the members of the board of directors are not related to any key management and staff of Sian Chay. Hence, there is no conflict of interest. Therefore, the board of directors still retains their service to continue serving Sian Chay. It is hoped that with their years of experience and in line with the national policies, they can support and assist Sian Chay Medical Institution to thrive, continue to benefit the poor, the sick, so that the well-being of society can continue throughout generations.

3. Update of personal information of members

The last count of number of members of Sian Chay Medical Institution is 48 members, some of whom are corporate members. The Secretariat mailed the "Personal Information Update Form" to members on February 23, 2021; As at March 19, 2021, a total of 16 replies were received. Among them, Mr. Wong Siew Kim, voluntarily applied for withdrawal of membership due to his busy schedule. Sian Chay Medical Institution has 47 members at that date.

4. Major Highlights

4.1 Subscription of New Shares of Singapore Paincare Holdings Ltd

13/11/2020 After analysis and discussion at the 9th Board Meeting of the 83rd Term (2018-2021) of Board of Directors of Sian Chay Medical Institution, there was no objection and all unanimously supported Sian Chay's subscription of 10% of the new shares of Singapore Paincare Holdings Ltd. ("SPCH"), The Board also authorized Chairman to represent, manage and execute the acquisition plan. This resolution was proposed by Chua Swee Wah, and seconded by Lim Oon Cheng. The resolution was passed by the Board.

Singapore Paincare Holdings currently operates 2 pain treatment specialist clinics, 6 general practitioner clinics and 1 physiotherapy centre. With a professional team comprising experienced paincare consultants, paincare doctors and physiotherapists, it is committed to providing patients with high-quality pain treatment services, so that patients can get pain relief to start afresh. Singapore Paincare Holdings was listed on the Singapore Exchange (SGX) on July 30, 2020.

On November 17, 2020, Sian Chay Medical Institution subscribed for 18,000,000 new shares of Singapore Paincare Holdings, holding a stake of 10% of the shares. Sian Chay Medical Institution subscribed for the shares of Singapore Paincare Holdings through a married deal. Together with the other share purchases in the market, it currently holds 28,335,900 (15.78%) of the shares and is its second largest shareholder. The total subscription price paid for this share is \$6,231,579.27.

By investing in Singapore Paincare Holdings, Sian Chay Medical Institution hopes that the dividend income generated in future will bring us stable returns, to help pay part of our operating expenses, allow Sian Chay Medical Institution to utilize its charity platform to reach and help more beneficiaries. In conjunction with this collaboration, Chairman will serve as SPCH's consultant at \$1 per year and donate this consultant fee to Sian Chay Medical Institution.

4.1.1 Corporate Social Responsibility

Singapore Paincare Holdings has always helped society through community work, educating the public and providing high-quality pain care services. By establishing this cooperative relationship, Sian Chay Medical Institution becomes the main partner of the Singapore Paincare Holding's corporate social responsibility programme.

4.1.1.1 Paincare service for the low-income

Singapore Paincare Holdings will provide free services for 30 low-income patients recommended by Sian Chay Medical Institution a year who are in need of its pain care services.

4.1.1.2 Vacinnation programme

Singapore Paincare Holdings is cooperating with Sian Chay Medical Institution to provide free flu and pneumonia vaccination for low-income seniors (5000 vaccination shots each Sian Chay Medical Institution is distributing the vaccinations to elderly residents through member of parliaments/grassroots advisers.

4.2. "Sian Chay Student Bursary Fund'

On January 22, 2021, Nanyang Technological University's Vice President (University Advancement), Ms. Lien Siaou-Sze, Director, Alumni Engagement Mr. Th'ng Beng Hooi, and Director, Annual Giving and Stewardship, Mr. Harlan McMurray and Head, Business & Community Partners Development Office, Mr Eugene Lee visited Sian Chay Medical Institution Headquarters for the signing ceremony of the endowment gift agreement between Sian Chay Medical Institution and Nanyang Technological University witnessed by guest of honour, Mr. Alvin Tan, Minister of State for Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth & Trade and Industry. Toh Soon Huat, JP, Executive Chairman of Sian Chay Medical Institution, and NTU Vice President (University Advancement) Ms. Lien Siaou-Sze signed the "Sian Chay Endowment Gift agreement of "Sian Chay Medical Institution Bursary Fund". The ceremony was also attended by Sian Chay Board of Directors: Jackson Teo PBM, Yap Seng Teck PBM, Annie Gan PBM, Kenny Lim, Clifton Yong and Ng Cher Yan BBM.

The setting up of the Sian Chay Medical Institution Bursary Fund is a new milestone between the traditional Chinese medicine charity sector and the education sector. The bursary aims to help needy students of NTU by easing the financial pressure on their families, let them focus on furthering their studies in this reputable university to become the pillars of society in future. Sian Chay will donate each year up to \$100,000 per year matching the quantum raised under the NTU's Graduation Giving Programme from this year to Year 2030, in support of the Fund. This aims to instill in graduating students a sense of giving to raise funds that help fellow needy students from their university. The cheque was presented to NTU on 31/01/2021.

4.3. Projects done during pandemic

During the pandemic, SCMI empathised how social service agencies suffered drop in donations. Although it suffered a drop in donations of 20% last year and faces difficulty in fundraising, it stood up to donate \$1 mil to the Invictus Fund and donated to many social service agencies, nursing homes, welfare homes etc. It also saw many low-income and vulnerable groups suffering financially during this pandemic and donated about 20,000 goodies bags, worth \$200,000 to various constituencies and groups. Furthermore, it saw many who could not afford something as basic as food. It donated and distributed meals to the needy in areas e.g. Chinatown. When the nation was in lockdown, SCMI organized ge-tai shows to encourage people to stay home and lift their spirits. SCMI also donated essential resources e.g. facemasks, food items, thermometers to those who need them. The intensity and speed in which SCMI executed this charity projects are amazing. It completed 87 projects since the pandemic and is not slowing down. Please refer to the attached report for details.
