ISSUE NEW "LUSITANIA" SONG.

"As the 'Lusitania' Went Down' Title of New Ballad Published by McKinley Music Co.

One of the most interesting of the songs that have made their appearance in commemoration of the "Lusitania" disaster is the pathetic balled just issued by the McK'nley Music Co., Chicago, Ill., and entitled "As the 'Lusitania' Went Down." The lyric of the song is by Arthur J. Lamb, writer of "Asleep in the Deep" and many other successes, and the music is by J. Henri Klickmann, composer of "Sing Me the Rosary," "The Kiss That Made You Mine," etc. Although quickly gotten out, the new song displays careful preparation both in the lyric and the melody, the latter being particularly good.
