





Dear Mike:



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


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
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DOCTORS BAG

As we have discussed earlier, the early medical history of syphilis is shrouded in shock, superstition and social stigma. Many of the early writers, who were also astrologers, blamed the disease on a malignant alignment of the stars and planets. In later years, syphilis was believed to be caused by an imbalance in the functioning abilities of the body organs. The erroneous studies concerning syphilis somewhat justified because the disease that had never been recognized before had suddenly become an epidemic in just a few years. They were just becoming aware of the disease around 1500, and by 1550, it was everywhere. Science was desperate for a solution to the sudden problem.

Luckily enough, they did hit upon a treatment. It was crude by our standards today, but it remained the primary source of treatment for hundreds of years. That treatment was with mercury. Unfortunately, the doses of mercury that were often given to a patient led to mercury poisoning and they were killed by the treatment. In fact, symptoms of mercurial poisoning became so common that the doctors thought they were the actual symptoms of syphilis itself.

Much of the problem lied in the fact that the physicians thought syphilis was just an advanced stage of gonorrhea. It wasn't until 1838 that research proved that gonorrhea and syphilis were two separate and distinct diseases.

Credit for that discovery is given to an American-born Frenchman named

Philippe Ricord. Ricord inoculated more than 2,500 patients to prove his point. He showed that a person with gonorrhea would not, necessarily, get syphilis, no matter how much time passed. But even with that discovery, it would be yet a long time before a safe, effective treatment for syphilis would be revealed.

It was not until 1943, more than four centuries after the problem was first studied, that the treatment of syphilis moved into its modern stages.

It was in that year that John Mahoney began to learn of a new drug introduced by Sir Alexander Fleming called penicillin. Mahoney, who had long been a student of infectious disease, elected to try the new treatment on some of his syphilis patients.

He was startled to find that penicillin seemed to work miracles in the treatment of those who had early-stage syphilis. The healing of sores and lesions was little short of miraculous and as soon as penicillin became available in large quantities, doctors around the world confirmed Mahoney's studies.

Within a few short years penicillin had completely replaced all other forms of treatment for the disease in all its stages. Now, more than 30 years later, it remains the foundation for curing the disease.

But even with a drug to combat the disease, medicine faced an immense enemy; the attitudes of the people. Syphilis was still a "no-no" that would not even be talked about in whispers. The American experience, through World War II, shows just how harmful the attitudes of the people were in completely eradicating the disease. We'll talk about that next time.
